Epiphany Blessing

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance, 20 + C + M + B + 17. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2017 is the year.

Blessing the Chalk

- V. Our help is the name of the Lord:
- R. The maker of heaven and earth.
- V. The Lord shall watch over your going out and your coming in:
- R. From this time forth for evermore.

Let us pray.

Loving God, bless this chalk which you have created, that it may be helpful to your people; and grant that through the in-vocation of your most Holy Name that we who use it in faith to write upon the door of our home the names of your holy ones Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, may receive health (of body and protection of soul for all who) dwell in or visit our home; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Instructions for Blessing the Home

Using the blessed chalk mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows:

$$20 + C + M + B + 17$$
 while saying:

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and seventeen years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer: Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions the Latin words, *Christus mansionem benedictat*, "May Christ bless the house."

A New Year for Prayer

Often I am asked to comment on ways to pray and to offer some guidance in helping a person to "go deeper" in their prayer life. The beginning of a new year can be a time to set your aspirations to commit more firmly to a regular prayer life, to grow stronger in faith and spirituality, and to open your hearts to the nudging of the Spirit and the small, quiet voice of Jesus as your relationship deepens.

One particular way to pray is through the purposeful reading of scripture. Lectio divina is a slow, purposeful, and contemplative way to pray the scriptures. Lectio divina offers an avenue for God's word to speak to you and touch you in a very personal way. Lectio divina means "sacred reading" which is different from Bible Study. Lectio divina is not about knowing the story being read or the context of the story within scripture or history, but rather what is being given to you personally from the story — a word or phrase that strikes you and speaks to you in your own life.

How to pray using lectio divina:

Choose a passage of scripture that you would like to pray. Don't know where to begin? Try using the daily readings for liturgy. You can find these on the U.S. Bishops website: usccb.org/readings. Each day provides a different set of passages from scripture — a reading from the Old Testament, one from the New Testament and one from the Gospels. This gives you plenty of material to pray with. Or start out by looking to the readings of the Sunday liturgies, preparing to hear the readings proclaimed at Mass in addition to praying with them. Let the Spirit guide you as to how much scripture you will cover.

Find a quiet prayer place. Place yourself in God's presence and allow your mind and heart to become silent. Light a candle to give you focus.

Lectio: Read the text slowly, gently. Read it over three times. Each time listen. Savor the words. Pay attention. Be aware of any words or phrases that may stir you, any way that the passage may be speaking to you. Allow for silence between each reading during which the words or phrases can evoke something within you.

Meditatio: Meditate on those words or phrases. How are they significant for you? What are you experiencing? What does it mean for you?

Oratio: Pray in response to what is being "spoken" to you, what you may be experiencing. This can be a prayer asking for help, in praise, in thanksgiving, etc.

Contemplatio: Contemplate as you enjoy being in the presence of God. Spend some time just "being with" God, not speaking, not thinking, just being with.

Close with a final prayer of your choice – spontaneous, the Our Father, or other.

Group Lectio Divina to begin in Lent

Beginning March 8th, on Wednesday evenings from 7:00pm – 8:00pm, I will be facilitating a group prayer using the *Lectio Divina* method of prayer. We will be using the readings from the Sunday liturgies during our prayers. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Dromedaries from Midian and Ephah shall come bearing gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. 
Epiphany – an illuminating realization. (taken from Merriam-Webster's dictionary 3a3)

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The account of the Epiphany is one that most of us know by heart. The Magi travel to Jerusalem to inquire about the location of the newborn king of the Jews. The Magi had observed a star at its rising and they had come to pay the king homage.

The appearance of the Magi is unique and only found in the Gospel of Matthew. You may be aware that Matthew does not call the Magi astrologers or kings, nor does he


report from exactly what country or countries they came from. In fact, Matthew never even specifies the names of the Magi. We have traditionally presumed there were three Magi since three gifts - gold, frankincense and myrrh – were presented to the Christ child.

The Magi, in many respects, provide a preview of what will later take place in Matthew's Gospel. The reactions of various people to the birth of Jesus parallel the effects that Jesus' teaching will have on those who hear it. Herod reacts with anger and hostility. The chief priests and scribes are apathetic and highly suspicious towards the One who comes to give new life and meaning to the rituals and laws of Judaism.

Matthew also reminds us that the Magi, non-believers in the eyes of the religious leaders of the day, possess something unique, something seldom appreciated by the leaders of Israel. The Magi possess the humility and the openness of mind and heart to seek and welcome the Son of God who has come into the world. Their following of the star is a journey of faith, a search for meaning, for purpose and for the presence of God in their lives. They were not deterred on their journey, even as they had people who had the potential for keeping them from achieving their goal. The Magi's search mirrors our own life-long search for compassion, justice, love, peace and forgiveness. That is the heart of the message of this celebration of the Epiphany.

In addition to the Magi's search for God, there is something else which speaks to us. The Magi are "outsiders", foreigners to the people of Israel. In the eyes of many, they would have been unworthy to encounter God. That was reserved only for God's chosen people. Yet, in being welcomed to experience the presence of Christ by Mary and Joseph, the Magi serve to remind us that the gift of the Savior is given to the whole world – Jew and Gentile alike. All of us are, to a certain extent, foreigners, not because of the country of our origin, but because of our behaviors, our sins, our addictions, our struggles and our brokenness. The message of Matthew's Gospel, proclaimed on this Feast of the Epiphany, is that all are welcome to encounter Christ. No one is excluded from God's love, mercy and forgiveness.

There is one more lesson that can be gleaned from the Magi. We are told they "prostrated themselves and did Him homage" and their lives were undoubtedly exchanged forever. When the Magi returned to their homes, they unquestionably would not have been able to contain themselves. They would have shared with others what they had seen and experienced. This serves to remind us that as those who encounter Jesus through our reception of the Body and Blood of Christ, are living an incomplete manner if we live a life that is closed in on ourselves. We are incomplete if we live only for ourselves. We are *complete* when we receive the good news of the Gospel and witness and share that good news with all whom God has placed in our lives. What we have been freely given by the Lord – the love of God – we must share with those whom we live, work and interact with.




