FR. T'S TIDBITS: ORDINARY TIME

We are in the midst of Ordinary time. What is Ordinary Time? The definition of Ordinary Time is taken from the *Documents on the Liturgy*. "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character (eg. Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter), thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time."

In our day to day life we should celebrate what God is blessing us with and the people we share our gifts and talents with. It is in our everyday life that we see and experience God. However, we must see with the eyes of faith the experiences of our life as God given. We are created in the image and likeness of God and we are called to project those experiences to others so that they too can see God's hand in their life.

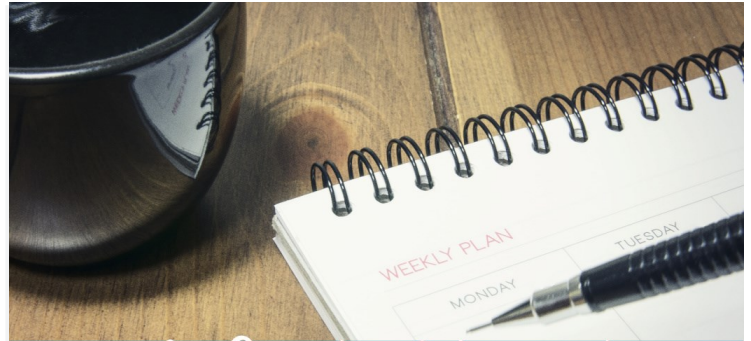
One example I use often is the food baskets that we prepare for the needy during the holidays. It is very easy for us to give at those times of year. The need is always in the forefront of our mind at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. However that need is year round, during the ordinary times of the year.

Ordinary Time is not all that ordinary. It can be a challenging season unlike Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter - seasons that already draw us and point us in the direction to celebrate a specific aspect of the life of Christ. In the season of Ordinary Time the onus or responsibility is placed on us. We are challenged to see God in our daily life, to celebrate the Word made flesh—to be disciples of the Lord is to see the Lord's presence in all aspects of our life and in those we come in contact with.

As I mentioned in my homily on the Feast of the Epiphany, we like the Magi must look up, so we can see the stars. In this New Year may we see what the Magi saw, namely the Word made flesh and it has come to dwell among us. In this day of social media with all that that means, it is easy for us to communicate with anyone without ever making eye contact or speaking a single word. We need to look up and see our brothers and sisters and to become an active player in society, our church, our community.

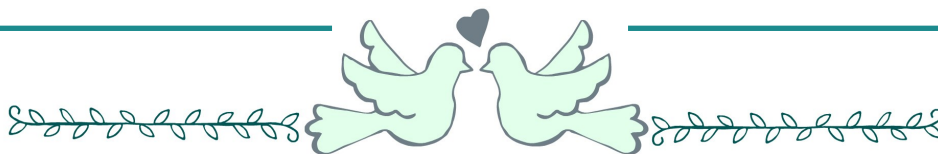

FEBRUARY 3**

From the Book of Blessings: Saint Blase was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His acclaim spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

A General Blessing of Throats will take place at all Masses next weekend. Fr. Tony will extend individual blessings following Mass, if preferred.

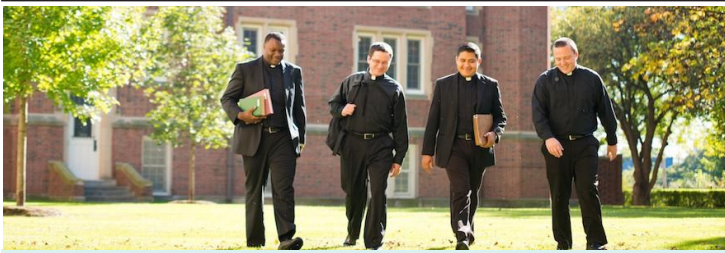

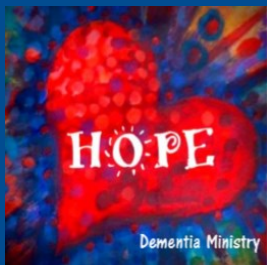

- ◆ Do you ever doubt what Jesus said or did? How do you handle this doubt?
- ◆ Who is the first person you remember, that shared with you the Gospel message?
- ◆ What is the "Good News" that Jesus brings to our world?
- ◆ If you wrote your life story, what stories would you tell? Who have you told about the Good News of Jesus?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Dear Lord, we do believe. Help us in our unbelief (see Mark 9:24).

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK:

- ◆ What problems do you see in the world around you? How do you help change these problems?

This past week, we were called to celebrate the life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Also this past week, many people were in Washington, DC for the March for Life. As I spent the morning reading some of the news from the weekend, I found stories about some Catholic high school students (not from Michigan) who were apparently taunting a Native American group that had gathered for the Indigenous Peoples March. There were also members from a group called the Black Hebrew Israelites taunting everyone at the National Mall.

This comes from 3 groups, many videos, many interpretations of the DC encounter, a news story by Jeffrey Collins on www.apnews.com. There was also a follow-up story a few hours later (on the same site, different authors) entitled: Boys School Shuts Down Amid Fallout Over Washington Videos. Through these 2 news stories we hear a couple different tales of what happened. The stories also say there is much more to the events than can be perceived through a single set of eyes, a single camera lens, a single Twitter feed.

Today's Gospel has Jesus coming back to his hometown and, following custom, going to the Synagogue. He reads from the book of Isaiah (61:1-2 & 58:6) and proclaims to those gathered,

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Luke 4:21(b)

Jesus not just shares with us His own mission, freeing each of us from sin (which separates us from God), but calls US to mission as well. Each one of us is called to release the bonds that we as individuals (and sometimes as groups) hold onto. WE are called to the "authentic fast" in Isaiah 58:6, of letting go of those things to which we hold fast. Learned hate, learned stubbornness, learned attitudes that limit not just the rights of others, but truly limit ourselves as well.

Our second reading, from I Corinthians 12:12-30, talks about the body being made up of many parts, each with a different function and ability. We, as Christians, are often referred to as the Body of Christ. Each and everyone of us has a function, most of which are very different from each other! Everyone is called to different levels of participation, but everyone is called to communal worship. You might be a part of the Choir, or another singing or instrumental group; you could be a member of the Hospitality team—Ushers and Welcome Desk greeters; you might be an EMHC, a Lector, Sacristan or Altar Server who assist the celebrant in a very personal manner, helping and handling many of the "little things" so that our priests can more effectively minister to the larger community. This happens at each and every Liturgy and we can ALWAYS use more hands to help.

But Mass is not the only place we minister! We are called to "properly and to the best of our ability" minister through *Word AND Action* to the world at large. I do not judge, that is not my place and I would never want that responsibility! It is God's place to judge the world, it is our place to open the doors to God's chambers and invite our sisters and brothers in. Which part of the body are you?

Lastly, from our first reading this week (Nehemiah 8:2-20) we hear that the people **listened** when Ezra spoke. When hearing stories, like those I mentioned at the beginning, it seems as if not enough people are *listening* any more. Everyone seems to want a "voice" and when they get that voice, too often they misrepresent what they think they are standing for. Too often, they incite and encourage an odd anger within themselves and others. We have a LOT to learn each and every day! Not a day should go by where we fail to grow in some way. My growth (and optimistic hope for the world) in reading these articles came towards the end of the second article when the Omaha Nation elder, Nathan Phillips, the man who was allegedly taunted in the first article, says,

"Let's create space for the teaching of tolerance to happen... I have faith that human beings can use a moment like this to find a way to gain understanding from one another."

So once again, which part of the body (of Christ) are you? Join us in community as we work toward the betterment of ALL!
