#### FR. T'S TIDBITS: ANOINTING OF THE SICK

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of February, the Church throughout the world remembers and celebrates the World Day of the Sick. It is a day set aside each year to remember all those who are ill and suffering some form of illness. It is also a day in which we remember all those people who are caregivers to the sick and the infirmed. As we celebrate the World Day of the Sick let us not forget those who are caregivers and thank God that they responded to this ministry for a family member, a friend or a loved one.

The Church believes and confesses that among the seven sacraments there is one especially intended to strengthen those who are tried by illness, the Anointing of the Sick. --- Catechism of the Catholic Church.

One of the greatest joys of my priesthood is celebrating the Anointing of the Sick with those who are ill or infirmed. I would like to clarify a particular point about hospital calls. I am always more than happy to make a visit to the hospital to anoint someone.

What you may not know is that many hospitals hire a priest to be a member of their Pastoral Care team. The hospitals in our area have a priest on staff. For the staff in the hospitals' Pastoral Care Department, the hospital becomes their "parish," if I can use that analogy. That being said, if you are in the hospital and are in need of a priest you should call the hospital Pastoral Care Department first. At Troy Beaumont, Fr. Joy is the Priest chaplain.

If you know you are going to be in the hospital or you are going to have surgery you can always see me prior to going to the hospital, and I would be happy to celebrate the sacrament with you. In regards to the monthly Anointing Mass on the last Tuesday of the month, the Mass and the Anointing are celebrated in the chapel. The Anointing will be celebrated following the Mass. Aside from Holy Days, the weekday Masses are celebrated in the chapel.

Because the Anointing of the Sick contains within it the forgiveness of sins, only a priest can validly administer anointing of the sick. All priests to whom the care of souls has been committed have the duty and the right to administer the anointing of the sick to all the faithful committed to their pastoral office; for a reasonable cause any other priest can administer the sacrament with at least the presumed consent of the aforementioned priest. --- Canon 1003,2, Code of Canon Law.

**Bon Mot**: The anointing is therefore a source of strength for both the soul and the body, but always in order that bodily healing may bring greater union with God through the increase of grace.--- St. John Paul II. *The Seven Sacraments*, October 1982.

So faith, hope, love remain these three; but the greatest of these is love. 1 Corinthians 13:13

Today's second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians is a familiar one. Seems like almost any wedding you attend includes this piece of scripture. I know it was read at my wedding 26 years ago, so it has been a popular choice for a long time! When we hear this scripture at a wedding, we tend to think of the message as being a recipe for a successful marriage. However, the love St. Paul is speaking of is the love God is and shares with us. God is love. We share in the life of Christ by sharing love with one another, when it is easy and, especially, when it is difficult. This works for marriage but is truly broader than that.

This passage is part of the letter to the people of Corinth that we have been hearing the last few weeks. The city of Corinth was something of a melting pot in the first century with people of varied social, economic, and religious backgrounds. The early

Christian community was actually several disparate communities, divided by religious heritage, wealth, and class, as well as by which disciple led them. This disunity greatly troubled Paul, whose message was one of union in Christ. Two weeks ago we heard him argue that all spiritual gifts are unified by the same Spirit. Last week we heard him use the analogy of the body to teach them that though they had different roles they all had vital roles. Evidently he feels that these two arguments are not enough, for today we hear him start by saying, "I shall show you a still more excellent way" (1 Corinthians 12:31). He is determined to bring the people of Corinth into union with each other. Now he has realized the best way. Love. Love is the ultimate answer.

So this reading is much more than just a lovely passage for a wedding. It is as applicable today as it was when it was written. This love is the love that allows us to accept those who are "different" from ourselves, even if we are uncomfortable. It is the love that causes us to reach out to those who are marginalized, poor, suffering, mentally ill, chronically depressed, anxiety-ridden or just plain miserable. It is a love that allows us to go outside of ourselves and our own selfish needs and desires, willing the good of the other more than our own. Love is the greatest and longest-lasting gift we have from God. It is the Father's love for us that brought us Jesus, Christ's love for us that won us salvation, their love for us that gave us the Spirit. So it is that love that can conquer all.

## **CHILDREN'S LITURGY** OF THE WORD

All Young Disciples preschool age through those preparing for their First Eucharist are invited to join us each Sunday at the 11:30am Mass for the readings of the week in an inclusive, easy to understand format. Just come forward when Father invites you up front. We'll see you soon!

Who listens to you? When a child gets to be about 2-3 years old, they begin the natural phase of beginning to question things, sometimes for no reason other than asking the question. As an adult I know that I begin to get impatient when so many questions are asked "for no 'apparent' reason," but it is really a natural stage of growth. Everyone goes through these stages, even as an adult. We begin a new endeavor and we are just like children, seeking information, in search of answers, trying to find the "best way" to accomplish a task.

Life IS learning. Each and every day we learn something new, a new way to do something, a new way how not to do something; I burn new recipes even though I follow the directions. I follow the Haynes or Chilton Manual, and somehow have fasteners left or my engine just doesn't sound quite right. There is always more to learn! Now who do we learn from? I have wonderful friends who are very smart. A few have multiple Masters Degrees, a couple have Doctorates in various fields, but they are still the "kids" I knew in High School; a few are the guys I went to Kindergarten with. When we hang out, it is sometimes a gathering of (pardon the "little boy humor") wedgies and fart jokes as we revert back to our childhood and memories of years long past. Then there are the times where we have deep philosophical discussions on life, where we are in life and what the meaning of our life is. I have learned that my friends are much more than just the little kids that I grew up with; there is a wealth of knowledge and growing of wisdom in them.

In the second reading today, Paul is speaking to the people in the city of Corinth about the spiritual gifts. He tells us that each of us can practice the gifts that we have been given, but we must do so with the immeasurable, underlying principle of Love. How much? It's immeasurable, but the more we use our gifts in and with Love, the greater the effect, reach and efficacy our gift has. We can fix many problems easily, but if we approach the problem with love and caring concern for the people that we are helping, we aren't just "putting a bandage" over a problem. We can get to an underlying cause of a problem and help heal not just a wound, but a person who can then spread love and joy to others, helping to advance Christ's mission in the world.

Do not be afraid to share the Word of God (Love) with those around you. Even if we get ridiculed, teased, or persecuted because we practice the commands of God in this world, He has promised so much more to and for us. When we live for God, He truly lives within us, and we shine His Love all the more to the world around us.

Each of us has been called. The question is—do we answer that call? Do we go with or against the culture that surrounds us? Do we stay as the little children that we knew years ago, or do we recognize the greatness of the things that we and our friends do, and aspire to be and do even more? Do we answer the call to Love like God? Will we put our lives and reputations on the line, even for a stranger? This is the call of God, to be more than the world wants us to be. Can we live up to this call in Faith, Hope, and Love?


