Jørry-atries Fr. Jørry Slowinski øxt. 102 Pastor We have now entered into the season of Lent. The principles and practices of Lent are deeply rooted in the Scriptures, the centuries old traditions of the Church and the life of Jesus Christ.

Here are two biblical passages which elaborate the meaning of Lent.

Even now declares the Lord, return to Me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning. Rend your heart, not your garments. Return to the Lord, Your God. (Joel 2:12-13).

When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners in order to be seen by all. Amen, Amen, I say to you they have already received their reward. Rather, when you pray, go into your room, close your door and pray to Your Father, who is unseen. Then the Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. (Matthew 6:5-6).

Lent is/should be a very personal journey. It is a period of sincerity, self-recognition and reflection. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving frees us and helps us to realize the darkness of our world without God. Through the disciplines of Lent we enter into a deeper relationship with God, seek forgiveness of our sins and focus on those whose needs are far greater than our own.

The true understanding of Lent rests on the three pillars of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. Lent serves to remind us that we are always confronted with choices that lead us down one of either two paths. The first path is darkness and sin. The second path is light, God and righteousness. We are called to choose wisely.



A Word to the Wise **Words Matter**

As you look around the church, the gathering space and chapel you notice that things are a bit un-decorated. You see the liturgical environment is accented with sand and sticks and stones. Representative of the desert we should find ourselves in during the Lenten season just as Jesus went out into the desert for forty days and nights. It is



a time to un-clutter our lives and find a place of calm, a haven in which to reflect.

It occurred to me as I was setting out the decorations just before Ash Wednesday, that I was using a lot of sticks and many stones and I couldn't help but think of that old adage we used as kids when we wanted to pretend we weren't hurt by something someone had said to us. "Sticks and stones will hurt my bones, but words can never hurt me." Well, we all know that is not necessarily true — words can hurt and often do.

Lent, however, is a time to use words in such a way that they can heal you. We are called to be open to God's Word, to accept Christ as our Redeemer, full of compassion and mercy. Make His words, your words as they are words of love and life. In our prayer both personal and as a member of this community, we awaken ourselves to God in the words of these prayers, or in meditating on those words, we can let him enter into our thoughts, emotions, heartbeat, breathing. Let your words bring you to the Sacrament of Reconciliation where you name your sins, your sorrows and pledge to start anew — your own words will bring healing closer and the words of absolution will place Christ's healing hand upon you. Take this Lenten opportunity to let healing words tumble through your thoughts and prayers to find a place in your heart.

Canticum Novum – Andy Langlands

A new song, or is it a new chant? The Roman Missal is the document we use to guide our steps during Mass. It contains all the prayers used for a specific day in the church year, the First Sunday of Lent for our purpose today. The Missal also contains specifics for how and why we do certain things, Weddings, Funerals, Daily Mass, etc. The Church uses language that is and of its own tradition in documents like the Most of the language is reserved for Roman Missal. discussion, reading, and planning for people like myself, the Priest, and Worship/Liturgy Director. Most professions have a set of language specific to the people who interact in that profession. Church work, or Ministerial profession is no different. Part of the language specific to Roman Catholic celebration of Mass is musical terminology. Music specific to Mass is referred to as "Chant" by the Missal. This term is often associated with a style of music known as Gregorian chant. There are other types of chant (Ambrosian, Mozarabic, Plain) that were and are used during Roman Catholic liturgy, specific to location (France, Spain, or Italy), but Gregorian is referred to in the documents as having "Pride of Place" during liturgy. I refer to the music we sing during Mass as chant. I do this because the Missal refers to these points during Mass as the Entrance Chant, or the Offertory Chant, not because I will be using the style of music known as Chant. It is simply my desire to be true to the document and use the language that is traditional for the church. Hymn, Song, or Chant are all fine words to use and, for our purpose at Mass, are interchangeable.

As we enter Lent we will make a musical attempt at increasing the solemnity of Mass (progressive solemnity). By adding sung prayers, like the Kyrie (Kyrie/Christe Eleison is the only ancient Greek phrase to survive in our modern liturgy), Universal prayers with a sung response, Agnus Dei (Latin meaning Lamb of God) and a meditation or mantra entitled "Abba-Father" after communion (Abba means Father in Aramaic, the language of Jesus), we hope to help you enter your Lenten walk inspired to pray. These languages continually remind us that catholic means universal, and the church historically draws from many cultures it's wealth of beauty, history, and inspiration. The community of St. Jane Frances de Chantal seeks to become disciples of Christ. What better way than to sing a few words in the language He spoke.

Human Trafficking Awareness

The following information is adapted from The Hill by Deborah Gibbs, opinion contributor

U.S. Federal law defines human trafficking as labor—or the exchange of sexual acts for something of value-under conditions of force, fraud or coercion.

The legal umbrella encompasses a tragic array of victims:

- An Asian woman promised a high-paying job in the U.S. but instead trapped in domestic servitude
- A homeless person trading sex for food and shelter
- Traveling crews selling magazine subscriptions to benefit questionable charities and not being fed until they meet daily quotas
- A woman who stays with her pimp because he threatens to harm her child or family member
- A runaway from an abusive home who is forced to commit crime for food or shelter

Trafficking victimization has many faces. individuals whose lives offer so few choices that relinquishing control over body and future becomes a plausible option. The traffickers seems to be the best available resource for supplying shelter and food, ensuring available resource for supplying shelter and food, ensuring safety, providing emotional connections and offering a sense of worth. These often lead to exploitive, abusive and dangerous relationships.


