



#### Sacramentals What are they? What to do with them when no longer being used?



Catholic tradition holds that when a material sacramental becomes so worn out that it can no longer be used as a sacramental, it should be disposed of in a becoming manner and not merely tossed into the trash. Catholic custom is to burn those things that can be burned — for example, rosaries, Bibles, prayer books. For items that cannot be burned — a statue, for instance — they should be buried. We ask you not to bring them to church, but to take care to dispose of them yourselves in the proper manner. Thank you.

## Canticum Novum – St. Joseph, Fatherhood, and the Catholic Faith

...the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David,

do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home.

For it is through the Holy Spirit

that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus,

because he will save his people from their sins". Mt 1:18-20

As I sat down today to compose an article for the bulletin, I wondered to myself what I might write about today, March 20, 2017. A glance at my calendar reminded me that today we celebrate the feast day of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is also a year since my family buried my Father after a long illness. We celebrated my Dad yesterday with a visit to the cemetery, and a lunch afterward. It was a nice day sunny, with a bit of chill due to the wind. Looking toward our Catholic faith for some inspiration, I took out my copy of the Catechism. It states "The divine fatherhood is the source of human fatherhood; this is the foundation of the honor owed to parents. The respect of children, whether minors or adults, for their father and mother is nourished by the natural affection born of the bond uniting them. It is required by God's commandment." (CCC 2214) There is a great wealth of spiritual inspiration in the paragraphs following. I encourage you to read it and ponder it as a parent, child, and child of God.

As a child, I struggled with my relationship with my parents sometimes. I am that person who marches to a different drummer. Often, my parents disagreed with my direction in life. (My mother still wants me to be a Priest) but the disagreement was never something I thought of as discouragement. Defending your choices, especially those regarding how you will make your way in the world, is a portion of growing up. I am grateful for the dialogue they opened with me about my choice of music and ministry. So too, for the support they gave, especially that of my Mother, who drove me to lessons and clubs as a youngster. Church choir, vocal lessons, theatre clubs; these were places where bright kids and wonderful mentors gathered together to learn artistic craft. My parents never insisted I practice, nor forced me to go to church. Both spiritual and musical practice found me eager to get to work. My sister and brother are no different. Thirty-five years of professional service later, I am still eager to practice spiritually and musically. I credit my Father with a "never quit" attitude. He was a person who never gave up. He ran until he was in his late 70's, hit the gym, played golf and bowled nearly until the day he passed. His Doctors credited his attitude and dedication to fitness with extending his life ten years. Something I remain grateful for since his passing.

The foundation of our faith is our relationship with the Father. God himself opens a pathway through belief in Him. We come to know God through His works, but mostly through divine revelation. By sending Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, God reveals His plan of loving goodness. Through His holy cross and resurrection, Jesus redeems the world. How deep is the Father's love for us, that He would give His only son to redeem the world? It is unfathomable to me. I hope you will celebrate your earthly father and your heavenly Father this week.




