FR. T'S TIDBITS: CHALICE OF A PRIEST

Recently someone saw my chalice and asked me what the history was behind it. The sacristans who set up for Mass have seen the names on the chalice. However, I realized that most of the congregation has not seen or even know that every priest has his own chalice.

My chalice was given to me by my mother's side of the family, The Jakubiak family in 1985 at our annual family reunion. Prior to them purchasing the chalice, I had two requests with regards to it - that it be simple and not ornate, and that it not be too expensive.

The stem of the chalice has the symbol of wheat. The base of the chalice has a small cross. The names engraved on the base are people who have had an impact upon my life and my preparation for the priesthood.

- Daniel Harland, my cousin who died at the age of 4.

- On the bottom of the chalice are the initials R.M.F., a good friend

Every time I preside at the Eucharistic celebration I remember those who have gone before me. I also thank God for their influence on my life and my priesthood.

As we journey through this season of Lent in preparation for the great feast of Easter may we always pray for priestly and religious vocations - that God will touch the minds and hearts of men and women to respond to His calling and share their gifts with the Church. God always calls. The challenge is that we have to respond to His call.

WHEN: Wednesday, April 17th: 6:00pm-7:30pm (and plan ahead for May 15th as well!)


Join us at whatever time you are able, whether for all or a portion of the session. Attend yourself, bring a friend or bring the family (children 4th grade and up are welcome with their parent)





Family Corner

A woman is caught in a serious sin, and people want to punish her. Jesus stops the crowd from hurting her. He reminds them that they are also sinners. He tells the woman that she should not sin anymore. His message also applies to us.

IN CHURCH:

During the Sign of Peace at Mass, extend not only your hand but also your heart and forgiveness to others.

<u>QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:</u>

- ♦ Have you felt alone with no friends? How can remembering that Jesus loves you help you during those times?
- ◆ Do you show mercy to others? How can you show mercy, rather than an accusing and condemning attitude?
- ◆ Does any good come from blaming someone of something? Instead of blaming, what can you do for their (and your own) good?
- Are there any closed doors in your life? Do you keep them closed, or do you work at opening them?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Help us to see our faults, Lord, before looking at the faults of others.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ♦ What is Peace? Do you practice peace at home, school or work?
- ♦ How do you welcome new people to your neighborhood, to school, or even to your house?
- ◆ Do you know the story of Holy Week?

Forgiveness. I have written 2 or 3 different things for this week, and each thing has abruptly ended in an open thought, no conclusion, no closing thought. This past week, my father experienced a medical issue and has been admitted to the hospital. A man who was instrumental in my formation as a person, an extremely important man in my life, my father, my dad, my daddy. Where does forgiveness lie in this thought? Where does it lie in my Dad, with him in the hospital, in a state that leaves more questions than answers?

I watch the medical professionals and the many, many patients that come through the waiting areas and the hospital. I see much grief and worry, as well as some joy, as hospital stays come to an end. I see peace on some faces. How can some faces show such peace and contentment, where others show such *extreme* pain, worry and disbelief? The only answer that I have been able to come up with, is our knowledge (and firm belief/understanding) of God's loving mercy.

My dad knows God, he knows the saving Grace that Jesus offered us through His suffering, death and resurrection. He, like each one of us, had questions, concerns and worries, but he knows that God is real, and that He is present to each and every person on this planet, whether they believe, understand or acknowledge the fact of His existence.

In our first reading(s) for this weekend, God's message is that of delivery, from sin and death, slavery and oppression. In our second reading(s) this weekend from Paul, he reminds us that when we live *in* Christ and live *the ways* of Christ, all of the things of this world, the things that seem important right now, have importance in the here and now only. How we treat others, our belief in God, our sharing of God's Love, in and to the world, is the really important thing that we should be focused on and that we should direct each of our tasks to every day, whatever it is that we do.

Our two Gospel readings are the story of Jesus' friend Lazarus being raised from the dead (Cycle A) and the story of the woman caught in adultery (Cycle C). Each of these stories speak to me of God's forgiving Love. God's miraculous working in our lives and in the lives of those that question Him as well. God loves each of us, because we are His Creation, both individually and collectively. We are called to remember His Love and share it with everyone that we share air with. This is how we Evangelize, this is how we Love, this is how we share happiness as well as pain, and help those that are struggling.

I know where my Dad is, bodily and in his heart. I know of his love for people in our parish community and for his family and I will continue to try to be more like him for others. Thank you for your prayers and well wishes at this time! Remember, God loves you, and through you He shows his love, forgiveness and mercy for others. Be the hands and feet of Christ in the world today, pray for those of us who struggle at it daily, and stay strong in your faith, hope and love for and to everyone around you!
