Recently I received a letter from a friend of mine who attended St. Basil from time to time. Enclosed in her note was the following article that was obviously written some years ago because the picture of me in the article shows me with longer hair and, more importantly, no gray hair. I hope you find this article by an unknown author thought provoking.

SOME FOOD FOR THOUGHT:

With our nation at war we find ourselves struggling with conflicting attitudes about what life has to offer. At times we have to step back and ponder the meaning of life and our role in God's plan. As we draw ever closer to the great feast of Easter may we see the hope that the Risen Lord will bring to our country, our world, to ourselves and to our life.

Thoughts to Ponder:

The paradox of our time in history is that we have taller buildings but shorter tempers, wider freeways but narrower viewpoints. We spend more but have less—we buy more but enjoy less. We have bigger houses but smaller families; more conveniences but less time; we have more degrees but less sense, more knowledge less judgment; more experts but more problems; more medicine, but less wellness.

We have multiplied our possessions, but reduced our values. We talk too much, love too seldom and hate too often. We've learned how to make a living but not a life. We've added years to life, not life to years. We've been all the way to the moon, but have trouble crossing the street to meet our new neighbor. We have conquered outer space, but not inner space. We've cleaned the air, but polluted the soul. We've split the atom but not our prejudice.


We have higher incomes but lower morals. We are long on quantity but short on quality. These are the times of tall people and short character---steep profits and shallow relationships. These are times of world peace but domestic warfare—more leisure but less fun--- more kinds of food but less nutrition. It is a time when there is much in the show window and nothing in the stockroom; a time when technology can bring you a letter or a text and you can choose to make a difference or delete it.

THE MISSIONARY NATURE OF THE CHURCH

The very last words Jesus spoke to his disciples before he ascended into heaven were the commission to evangelize all people: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This mandate defines the Church for all time. As Blessed Pope Paul VI wrote, "Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize."

Evangelizing is therefore a responsibility not only of bishops, priests, and religious, but of every individual Christian. Evangelization is, very simply, proclaiming the good news of Jesus to those around us. This proclamation is to be both in word and in deed.

If we share the good news of Christ's love in words only, not demonstrably living what we preach, people will rightly suspect us of hypocrisy, and we may even give Christianity a bad name. On the other hand, if we share the good news in deeds only, people will not learn of the One who is the source of the joy and divine love we carry within us. Those around us are thirsting for the Gospel, the words of eternal life, even if they do not realize it. How can we fail to share generously what we have freely received?

HAPPY MEMORIAL DAY

To say "Happy Memorial Day" seems to be a bit of an oxymoron! How can we be happy, when Memorial Day is actually a day we will remember those who died in the service of our country. However, isn't this similar to Easter when we are overjoyed with the resurrection of Jesus Christ?

On Memorial Day we honor those that gave their life for us to have freedom. In looking at Memorial Day, I found some interesting facts:

- ♦ Memorial Day has its roots in the Civil War
- Memorial Day was once called Decoration Day—decorating graves of soldiers to remember their sacrifices
- More than 260,000 graves are Decorated in Arlington for over 60 years known as "Flags In"
- Red Poppies are the symbol of the holiday—inspired by a WWI poem by John McCraae, "In Flanders Fields"..."In Flanders fields the poppies blow/Between the crosses, row on row"
- "Rolling Thunder Annual Memorial Day Demonstration" is a tradition of thousands of bikers descent on Washington DC to raise awareness of those soldiers missing or lost
- Memorial Day's Moment of Silence is a law passed in 2000 declaring 3:00pm National Moment of Remembrance

In addition to honoring our fallen soldiers, we as Catholic Americans, can also reflect on this day that Jesus gave his life for us to have freedom. We should be thankful of the true meaning of freedom and thank God for the Church which proclaims the way to the fullness of that freedom.

She met almost every single Sunday with our young disciples to share God's Word with them, during the 11:30am Mass. We are taking a break during the upcoming summer months, but hopefully we will welcome new Ministers, Ms. Angela and more disciples back in the Fall!

Happy Memorial Day! As many people gather together with friends and family, we make sure that we remember those who gave the ultimate sacrifice for us. Men and women, (some boys and girls, too, in the Civil War era) would stand for an ideal in which they believed so greatly in, that they put their very lives on the line. We especially remember those who lost their lives throughout our Nation's history, fighting for the freedoms of all. Soldiers and civilians alike; fire and police officers, mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, etc. Each individual no matter what they had done, would perform their duty to protect something they felt was greater than themselves, alone.

Veterans march in parades throughout the nation on this day, not for accolades for themselves (they are honored on November 11th) but rather as an example, as a symbol, as something tangible for us to remember those who sacrificed their lives. A sacrifice for an "ideal", a notion that all humanity is created equal. Everyone is entitled to basic liberties, life and a pursuit of happiness. If I want to raise a flag, someone died for my right to do that. If NFL players wish to kneel at the playing of the National Anthem, someone died for their right to do just that. I enlisted in the Marine Corps, because someone gave their life to allow me that opportunity.

When we live with an understanding of Christian Faith, we understand this same ideal of Jesus, giving of Himself so greatly, that we are able to live a life free of the burden of sin. We are able to continue living our lives, with a knowledge that Jesus' sacrifice for us (along with our admission of wrongdoing and attempting to follow His example) will allow us to join God for all eternity. The sacrifice of many people to help make our lives on Earth freer. The sacrifice of One to secure our "spot" in eternity. Spend some time on Monday, May 27th, to remember these sacrifices. Take a moment to remind those that you celebrate with, what it is that we are truly commemorating!
