#### FR. T'S TIDBITS: HOLY BIRTHDAY TO US

This weekend the church celebrates the feast of Pentecost – the birth of the church. We observe the fulfillment of the Lord's promise to his disciples, "I will send you the paraclete. The Holy Spirit will instruct you on what you should do."

There are many titles that are used to refer to the Spirit—the wind, the fire, the comforter—but there is one title that sums up what we are called to be

about as people who have been gifted by the Spirit:

#### **DIVINE ARCHITECT.**

The Holy Spirit is the architect and we are the co-workers in the building process. In this particular essay, there is one section that I believe is the core of what we must do as people who are empowered by the spirit. It is entitled Digging the Foundation.

...to fulfill God's plan for us, we must dig deep into the foundation of who we are. To do that we must plow into the very depth of our being.

God created us in His image and likeness, bestowing upon us gifts and talents that are unique to us and us alone. The challenge for us is to become aware of those talents and gifts, and to use them to enhance and to build up the body of Christ, the church

As co-workers in the building process, we are called to work as one team, with one common goal--- namely to proclaim the Gospel message knowing at all times and at the core of our being that it is God's work that we are doing and not our own.

#### Some question to reflect upon:

\*What signs of growth can you detect in our Church?

\*How do we encourage individuals to share their gifts and talents with the parish community?

\*What particular gifts of the Spirit provide the foundation of St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish?

We celebrate 42 years as a parish community in the city of Sterling Heights. May the Spirit that empowered our founders and forebearers, continue to empower us to build up the Body of Christ. As we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost may we reflect upon the prayer of the Holy Spirit, "Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts and minds of your faithful servants. Spirit of the living God fall afresh on us."

Interested in "becoming" Catholic? Know someone who is seeking a deeper connection with God? Were you raised in a family that did not practice any faith yet you feel a call to be baptized?

- Perhaps you were baptized in another faith, married a Catholic and are raising your children Catholic?
- Or, you are thinking of getting engaged to a Catholic and are interested in knowing more about the faith.
- Have you been attending Mass but have not received the sacraments?
- Maybe you know someone who is seeking a deeper connection with God?
- Or possibly you just have an intellectual interest in the Catholic church.

For these situations and for answers about the Catholic faith, St. Jane Frances' Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is for you. The RCIA is a process where we learn together about the Catholic faith, discern if it is what is

being searched for, delve deeper into our spiritual lives, pray together, and serve together. It begins the last Sunday of September, culminates with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter (if appropriate) and continues through to Pentecost in May. Classes are generally held each Sunday from 10:00am -11:30am.

Today we celebrate the great solemnity of Pentecost, remembering the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. Recorded in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells his disciples, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." The Holy Spirit dwells within us, strengthening us and guiding us to live out our baptismal call. The gifts of the Holy Spirit help us to fulfill our mission to spread the Good News to all the corners of the earth. This week, spend some time reflecting on these gifts and pray the prayer to the Holy Spirit. Then, go out and share the Good News of Jesus Christ!

#### GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

**WISDOM:** With the gift of Wisdom, we see God at work in our lives and in the world. We are directed in matters of judgment about the truth and being able to see the whole image of God. Helps us to understand the purpose of God's plan for us and for the world and to see the world through God's eyes.

**UNDERSTANDING:** With the gift of understanding, we comprehend how we need to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with understanding is not confused by all the conflicting messages in our culture about the right way to live. This gift helps us to learn about ourselves and how to grow in knowing God. Understanding clears away obstacles to true faith.

**KNOWLEDGE:** With the gift of knowledge, we understand the meaning of God's Revelation, especially as expressed in the life and words of Jesus Christ. A person with knowledge is always learning more about the scriptures and tradition. This gift enables us to judge what must be believed and what must not be believed.

**FORTITUDE:** With the gift of courage, we overcome our fear and are willing to take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with courage is willing to stand up for what is right in the sight of God, even if it means accepting rejection, verbal abuse, or even physical harm and death. The gift of courage allows people the firmness of mind that is required to do good and stand up to evil and especially to stand up for Jesus and his teaching.

**COUNSEL:** With the gift of right judgment, we know the difference between right and wrong, and we choose to do what is right – we make better moral decisions. The Holy Spirit points us to the most important considerations as we make decisions in life, always choosing good as a means to an end.

**PIETY:** With the gift of reverence we have a deep sense of respect for God and the church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before God with humility, trust, and love. In piety we pay worship and duty to God as our Father and have immense trust in God's fatherly love.

**FEAR OF THE LORD:** With the gift of wonder and awe we are aware of the glory and majesty of God and the grateful wonder of His love for us. This fear of the Lord is like a child's fear of offending his father, rather than a fear of punishment. The worst thing that could happen to us is separation from the God that we love.

#### PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT:

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created and You shall renew the face of the earth. O God, Who instructed the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, Grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolation.

Pentecost is celebrated on the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday following Easter. Pentecost (Greek for 50<sup>th</sup> day) marks the day that the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles. Did you know that the feast of Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Church? How can you celebrate Pentecost? Here are some thoughts adapted from a post by Susan Hine-Brigger at Franciscan Media:

- Celebrate it with cake and ice cream, but rather than singing "Happy Birthday" recite a prayer for Pentecost
- Wear something red to symbolize the love of the Holy Spirit, or the tongues of fire, use a red table cloth, eat off red paper plates, incorporate red into the day, week...
- Read aloud the story of Pentecost in the 2<sup>nd</sup> chapter of Acts
- Make an effort to try to overcome differences. Try to converse with people you have previously avoided or not understood
- Go fly a kite or make a pinwheel with a child and watch what the wind does, talk about the Holy Spirit



The **Prayer for the Seven gifts of the Holy Spirit** may be a great prayer to reflect on today as you pray:

**O Lord Jesus Christ,** Who, before ascending into heaven, did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish your work in the souls of your Apostles and disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me, that He may perfect in my soul the work of your grace and your love. Grant me

#### THE SPIRIT OF WISDOM

that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal, THE SPIRIT OF UNDERSTANDING

to enlighten my mind with the light of your divine truth,

#### THE SPIRIT OF COUNSEL

that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining Heaven,

#### THE SPIRIT OF FORTITUDE

that I may bear my cross with you, and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation,

#### THE SPIRIT OF KNOWLEDGE

that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the science of the Saints,

#### THE SPIRIT OF PIETY

that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable, **THE SPIRIT OF FEAR** 

that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God, and may dread in any way to displease Him.

# Unused Prescription and OTC Medications Unused Wound Care Products Collection JUNE 2 through JUNE 15, 2019

# Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your home??

The Health Ministry at St. Jane will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *Soup Kitchen*, to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.

Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

#### **RULES FOR MEDICATION DROP OFF:**

- Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. You can block out your name before bringing the bottles to church.
- Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
- NO LIQUIDS.
- NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES
- Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

#### **RULES FOR WOUND CARE PRODUCTS DROP OFF:**

- Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- No liquids or ointments.

Summer is a great time to explore our faith in creative ways! Here are a few ideas to help deepen your relationship with Jesus over the summer months as a family:

- Explore nature and talk about the beauty and variety of God's creation. Use this opportunity to talk about how people are uniquely made in God's image.
- Visit the Christian art exhibit at the Detroit Institute of Arts. Learn about the many ways people have used art to share and worship Christ. Create your own art project to express your relationship with Jesus.
- Take a trip to the Solanus Casey Center in Detroit and explore the life and work of Blessed Solanus Casey. Learn about the beatitudes and the Works of Mercy through the statues and tiles displayed in the center. Experience the communion of Saints and leave a prayer request at the tomb of Blessed Solanus.
- Find a place to serve those in need together as a family. Explore Matthew 25:34-30 and discuss how Jesus is present in the "least of these."
- Go swimming and use that as a chance to talk about the waters of baptism. Talk about your kids' baptisms and remember your call as priests, prophets, and kings!
- Find a new way to incorporate prayer into your family life. Come to a daily Mass. Stop by Eucharistic Adoration. Pray the Rosary. Find a new devotional to work through.

Plus, don't forget to keep an eye out for Faith Formation registration for the Fall!

Happy Pentecost to everyone! As we celebrate this Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks, we remember God's providing for us and His keeping of His promise to us, of everlasting life with Him. We reflect on the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples, and can , hopefully, see the fruits that the Holy Spirit imparts to us, as we use the gifts of the Spirit that were given unto us.

All the way back to my Baptism, my parents did the absolute best that they could in raising me in the teachings of the church, from forming my faith formally (in "classrooms" at church), making sure we prayed before our meals, prayer at bedtime, and recognizing first and foremost the reason for our holidays (holy-days) - Christ. Jesus' birth; His Passion, Death and Resurrection; and the working of the Spirit in our lives through the multiple other holidays to include (but not limited to) Memorial Day, Labor Day, our individual birthdays, Mother's Day, Father's Day, etc.

Without the freedom that Jesus gave to us—the freedom of life beyond our time in the here and now—we would only be in the here and now. Once we pass away from this life, without Jesus there would be nothing. By God's mercy and the sacrifice of His Son, we have been granted the opportunity for meaningful expiation of our personal sins and by doing so we have been allowed entrance to the Eternal. Not through the act of confession and penance in and of themselves, but in doing so, God can see our repentance and accepts us to Himself.

The Holy Spirit entered us "formally" when the Church recognizes us in Baptism, and we get sealed with the Spirit. When we confirm our Faith, we cement our bond, through our free will, with the Holy Spirit. We *choose* to live as directed, in God's way, not because of a fearful worry of our lives but because of a hopeful and assured promise of Life beyond our knowledge. The God of all Creation, of all there ever was, is and will be, has promised us this. With one simple rule—Do Good, and in doing Good you *will* avoid evil. We should commit ourselves to this idea. As the playwright, Robert Oxton Bolt, once wrote:

"A belief is not merely an idea the mind possesses; it is an idea that possesses the mind."

Allow your belief in the Goodness of God, to possess your mind in such a virtuous way, that there is no other choice but to be Good. I'm working on it myself. Even God knows that we are not perfect, but we need to continually strive for that perfection during the journey that we call life. I'll see you on that path, leading toward God.


