Have a wonderful week and enjoy the summer. As we all know it goes by quickly.

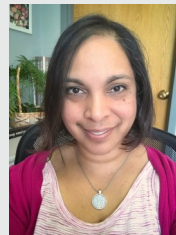

A FEW CHANGES . . .

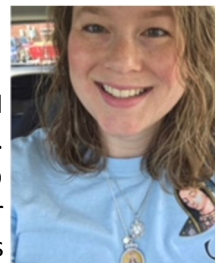

We have returned to Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar of the Church. Our readings will now follow the same structure as those from Ordinary Time in the fall and winter. The First Reading is taken from the Old Testament and is chosen to reflect the message of the Gospel. The Second Reading is a somewhat continuous reading from one of the New Testament letters. In the three-year cycle of readings, we are in Year C where we focus primarily on the Gospel of Luke.

Throughout this summer season, Luke will share with us the demands of discipleship as the apostles accompany Jesus on the public journey to Jerusalem. As we hear and reflect on these Gospel readings, consider your own discipleship and the demands it places on you in our society. How do you bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to everyone you meet? How do you counteract societal norms that contradict the teaching of Jesus? What practices do you follow that strengthen you for this work?

Today is also the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, always observed on the Sunday after the Solemnity of Pentecost. This celebration dates back to the seventh century. In paragraph 234 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church we hear that, "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them."

When we recite the Creed each week we proclaim our belief in the Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. When you speak the words of the Creed, reflect on what you believe and how you live out those beliefs.

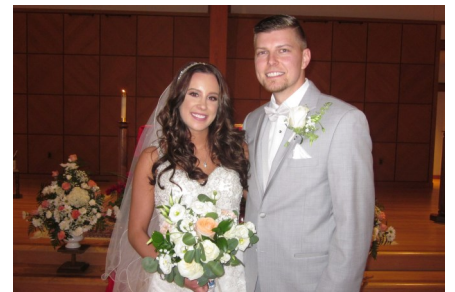

You’ve probably heard this over and over but NEVER STOP TRYING TO IMPROVE! Gentle reminders about 6 (+1) ways you can refocus on your health, courtesy of the CDC:

- Get Enough Sleep— Aim for seven to nine hours per night.
- Stop Smoking—if you quit now, you’ll lower your risk for cancer, COPD, and other smoking-related illnesses.
- Exercise More—Try to fit in 2 ½ hours of aerobic activity, plus muscle-strengthening exercises, each week.
- Eat Healthy—Your diet should include a variety of fruits and vegetables daily.
- Reduce Stress—You’ll feel much more relaxed if you avoid drugs and alcohol, connect socially, and find support.
- Get Regular Checkups—You need to know your blood pressure and cholesterol numbers, because if they’re elevated, your risk for heart disease and stroke goes up. You also need screening for colorectal and prostate cancer: Positive outcomes are more likely with early detection.

Build your relationship with The Lord daily. Prayer, devotions, regular attendance of church and fellowship with immediate and faith family.

Welcome “back” to Ordinary Time! Even though we celebrate, for the next couple of weeks, some Solemnities (Most Holy Trinity, Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ), we have come back to the longest Liturgical Season of the year. This year, however, will be a little different for our community, as Fr. Tony let us know last week. St. Jane Frances de Chantal is part of the initial planning, for the second part of Unleash the Gospel’s second phase of implementation (now that was a mouthful)! Fr. Tony has asked a few parishioners, and two parish staff members, of which I am one, to be a part of a Parish Visioning Team (PVT), but this has larger implications and responsibilities for *everyone* in the parish, from our eldest parishioners to our youngest and newest parishioners.

The Church is the Body of Christ in the world today. Each of Her members, are vital to Her overall mission in the world today. As I write, I am watching some men (whose names I do not know) work on the street, preparing it for re-paving. Old concrete removed, new drainage placed at the edge to assist runoff and hopefully prevent future heaving of the new concrete, and they are now scraping and preparing the existing base material for the new concrete to go in. A tree was damaged, but it will be repaired to the best of our ability. My newer driveway is (so far) unscathed, but the lives of our neighbors and the commuters who use our neighborhood as a “passthrough” is now disrupted.

What does this have to do with the Body of Christ? Each individual plays a part in the mission, no matter how big or small. Those performing “simple” tasks learn the more “difficult” tasks by watching and taking part, and then step up, on another project, to lead those more complicated tasks. This is the way with each of us. There are eight people from our parish (and two archdiocesan reps) in this PVT, out of the whole parish, but everyone still has a role to play. In the upcoming weeks you will begin to hear more about the process we are involved in.

Everyone was given the opportunity to pick up literature on this movement we are a part of (if you didn’t pick it up, there are some more copies in the parish office). Stay on top of what is going on, ask questions, and let your voice be heard. Sign up to get the messages from the team, and most of all - pray! Pray for God’s will to be done. Pray for the members of this team. Pray for Fr. Tony as he squeezes this into his agenda. Pray for the parish and all of the parishioners. Pray...commit however much time you can for prayer.

Join the PVT in saying a prayer around noon everyday for each other in adoration of God the Creator and in thanksgiving for the gifts that He gave to each of us. Start small, increase gradually, make this a part of your day. Pray as Melchizedek did in our first reading from today, and come, celebrate the Thanksgiving meal (Eucharist) with us and be a witness through your actions of God’s mercy and blessings in the world. I’ll see you along the road on our journey towards God!
