The 90+ degree temperatures of this past week have served to verify that summer is well on its way. That means we can look forward to more outdoor activities such as vacations, working in the garden and backyard barbecues. Unfortunately, another inevitable part of summer includes mosquitoes. We all know how mosquitoes can ruin a picnic or a barbecue. Here's an

example: You are celebrating your birthday with a backyard barbecue and you're having a great time with family and friends. The weather is perfect, the sun is warm and the mood is mellow. Everything around and within you is an invitation to be joyful and grateful for all that you have been blessed with. This is what the "Sabbath", in the biblical sense, is all about. You are celebrating life, your birthday. You are healthy, surrounded by those who truly love and care for you. You savor this leisure time, an opportunity to take your nose off the grindstone and enjoy life. You do this with good food and good drink. Grace has entered into your life and everything is wonderful, except for one thing, mosquitoes. As dusk begins to take hold these insects begin to infiltrate, inflicting a bite here and a bite there until eventually most everyone loses his or her focus and is preoccupied with keeping exposed areas of flesh under vigilance. Sooner, rather than later, most of the good cheer and the gratitude evaporate and irritation at the mosquitoes effectively ends any inclination to sing, dance and celebrate. The entire evening is brought down by a series of little bites!

We can all recount a hundred kind of incidences of this sort. Given the complexity and contingency within our everyday lives, mosquitoes of some type are invariably present. There is some rain on every parade, some irritation in virtually every situation in life, and some element challenging pure grace within almost every moment of life. In fact, life rarely comes to us pure and free from all shadow. That is why, if we are familiar with the Scriptures, we read that we are "living in a valley of tears". In our lives we never experience a moment of clear-cut, pure joy. Everything comes with a shadow, every picnic comes with mosquitoes.

As a result, it is not always easy to sing, dance and celebrate, even in presence of pure grace. Mosquito bites can easily cause us to lose perspective, to fail to see the big picture, the one that would allow us to see and celebrate grace, even in the face of some minor irritation. A minor irritation can make us lose sight of grace.

Today there are rich spiritual and psychological writings which challenge us to try to live more fully inside the present moment and not let our heartaches about the past or our anxieties about tomorrow cheat us out of the riches of today. But as we know, that is easier said than done. Elements from our past – half remembered lullabies from childhood, an almost forgotten face, a past love, and a humiliation on the playground deep in our minds, a misstep that still haunts us and thousands of other things from our past – impale themselves into our present. And the future, as well, colors our present as we anxiously worry about an impending decision, the meeting we have tomorrow, what the doctor is going to tell us on our next visit, and how we will meet our next mortgage bill. The present moment never comes to us as pure.

MCREST stands for Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team and was founded to provide homeless and displaced individual's temporary emergency shelter. Their goal is to provide the opportunity for successful transition to independence.

Our MCREST Program has formed subcommittees, each headed up by coordinators whose responsibility will be to work with and inform some 200 volunteers of tasks needed. The subcommittees are:

Father's Day TIPS because we LOVE YOU!

You've probably heard this over and over but NEVER STOP TRYING TO IMPROVE! Gentle reminders about 6 (+1) ways you can refocus on your health, courtesy of the CDC:

- Get Enough Sleep~Aim for seven to nine hours per night.
- Stop Smoking~If you quit now, you'll lower your risk for cancer, COPD, and other smoking-related illnesses.
- Exercise More~Try to fit in 2 ½ hours of aerobic activity, plus muscle-strengthening exercises, each week.
- Eat Healthy~Your diet should include a variety of fruits and vegetables daily.
- Reduce Stress~You'll feel much more relaxed if you avoid drugs and alcohol, connect socially, and find support.
- Get Regular Checkups~You need to know your blood pressure and cholesterol numbers, because if they're elevated, your risk for heart disease and stroke goes up. You also need screening for colorectal and prostate cancer: Positive outcomes are more likely with early detection.

Build your relationship with The Lord daily.~Prayer, devotions, regular attendance of church and fellowship with immediate and faith family.

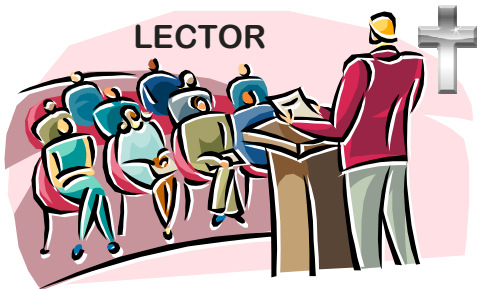

Liturgical Ministers – A Time to Share in the Ministry of the Church!

If you would like to join a ministry, training and information sessions will be made by appointment at your convenience.



LECTOR

Lector – proclaim the Word of God at all liturgies through prayerful, clear and strong reading of the scriptures.

This ministry is a scheduled ministry. Most lectors are scheduled about once per month, during 6 month schedules. You are responsible for substitutes when you are not available. A list of subs is provided.



Altar Servers – one of the most visible ministries during the Mass, an altar server is a minister to the priest. This is a **great** opportunity to really learn about the Mass.

Individual Training for all Altar Servers any time or as a group in October

This ministry is a scheduled ministry. Most servers are scheduled about twice per month, 6 months per schedule. You are responsible for substitutes when you are not available. A list of subs is provided.



Sacristans

Take care of the overall preparations for liturgical celebrations. Preparation includes tending to the books, chalice, linens, candles, cruets, etc. These duties expand for special days such as the Triduum, Easter Vigil, funerals, etc.



(EMHC) Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

EMHC – assist in the distribution of the Holy Eucharist during the liturgy. A privilege and honor to share the True Presence of the Body of Christ to those called to the Banquet.

This is not a scheduled ministry—serve when you are available according to your Mass attendance.

Communion Ministry to the Homebound

Take Communion to those who are unable to join us in the Sunday gathering. Pray with them and bring the sense of belonging to the community directly to them.

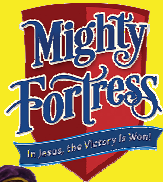

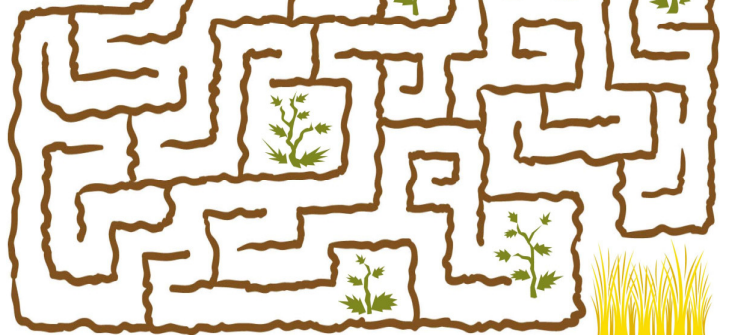

Nevertheless, the challenge remains. Don't let the mosquitoes within life blind you to the larger presence of grace. The trials of remaining positive are a test of our endurance. You think today is just another day in your life. But it's not just another day; it's the one day that is given to you by God. *It's given to you; a pure gift.* It is the best gift you have at the moment and the only appropriate response is gratefulness. If you do nothing else but to cultivate that response to the great gift that is this unique day, if you learn to respond as if it were the first day of your life and the very last day, then you will spend that day very well.

Such a grace to do this does not come easily. It must be fervently prayed for. Mosquitoes will inevitably make their presence known at every barbecue, picnic and birthday party in our lives. That's a given. The challenge is not to lose sight of the larger presence of grace because of minor irritations.

A FATHER'S PRAYER

O God, Giver of Life and Father of us all, help me to be the kind of father to my children that You are to me.

May I love them unconditionally, forgive them when they fail, counsel them when they doubt, lift them up when they fall, guide them in the darkness and walk besides them in the light.

Show me, Loving Father, how to teach them, to play with them, to share with them and to pray with them

Thank You for my children; thank You for my role as a father.

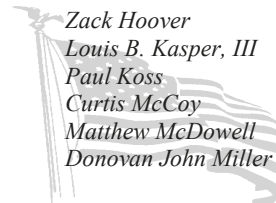
