In an era of the never-ending news cycle and instant communication, it can begin to feel as though there is no good news. As a consumer of media as well as a creator of messages - personal and public - it is important to filter what we see and share through the lens of our faith in Christ. In today's Gospel, we are reminded to let the Holy Spirit reveal to us what is good and true in our time. Pope Francis, in his message for World Communications Day earlier this year, challenged the faithful to consume media with caution while also being attentive to be "beacons in the darkness of this world." He proclaims,



Access to the media – thanks to technological progress – makes it possible for countless people to share news instantly and spread it widely. That news may be good or bad, true or false. The early Christians compared the human mind to a constantly grinding millstone; it is up to the miller to determine what it will grind: good wheat or worthless weeds. Our minds are always "grinding", but it is up to us to choose what to feed them (cf. ST. JOHN CASSIAN, Epistle to Leontius).

I am convinced that we have to break the vicious circle of anxiety and stem the spiral of fear resulting from a constant focus on "bad news" (wars, terrorism, scandals and all sorts of human failure). . . Everything depends on the way we look at things, on the lens we use to view them. If we change that lens, reality itself appears different. So how can we begin to "read" reality through the right lens?

For us Christians, that lens can only be the good news, beginning with the Good News par excellence: "the Gospel of Jesus Christ, Son of God" (Mk 1:1). Saint Mark opens his Gospel not by relating "good news" about Jesus, but rather the good news that is Jesus himself. Indeed, reading the pages of his Gospel, we learn that its title corresponds to its content and, above all else, this content is the very person of Jesus. This good news – Jesus himself – is not good because it has nothing to do with suffering, but rather because suffering itself becomes part of a bigger picture. . .

In Christ, even darkness and death become a point of encounter with Light and Life. Hope is born, a hope accessible to everyone, at the very crossroads where life meets the bitterness of failure. That hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts (cf. Rom 5:5) and makes new life blossom, like a shoot that springs up from the fallen seed. Seen in this light, every new tragedy that occurs in the world's history can also become a setting for good news, inasmuch as love can find a way to draw near and to raise up sympathetic hearts, resolute faces and hands ready to build anew. . .

Today too, the Spirit continues to sow in us a desire for the Kingdom, thanks to all those who, drawing inspiration from the Good News amid the dramatic events of our time, shine like beacons in the darkness of this world, shedding light along the way and opening ever new paths of confidence and hope. *Pope Francis, Message for the 51st World Communications Day*

Here are three questions to ponder as we live and share in the world today:

- 1) Does what I am reading, seeing, and/or sharing allow room for the Good News?**
- 2) Does this narrative build people up and uphold their dignity or belittle and dismiss them?**
- 3) Do my words contribute to "opening paths of confidence and hope" or do they generate discontent, anxiety, fear, and distrust?**

In today's social climate especially, let's commit ourselves to being discerning users of media, firm in the hope of Christ and dedicated to helping others encounter Light and Life.

WHEN A STRANGER ASKS FOR MONEY

At St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have a very active St. Vincent de Paul Society that provides food and resources to those in need. Anyone soliciting for money in our parking lot before/after Mass is doing so without permission from the parish. Please **DO NOT GIVE CASH** to any such individuals.

Instead, politely refer such individuals to speak with the receptionist in the parish office. The receptionist will contact one of the members of our St. Vincent de Paul society who will do an intake in order to determine if the request has validity. If the person refuses to do so they, in all likelihood, are not in need of legitimate assistance.

When you give money to a person who does not have permission to solicit people going into or out of church there is no way to guarantee the money is going towards the purpose they claim. The St. Vincent de Paul never gives cash to a person. A person in need, if it is determined that there is a legitimate request, can be helped by being given food, a voucher, or a check made payable to a utility company or landlord, if they are truly in need.

This week's offertory hymn "How Firm a Foundation" is a hymn that for over two centuries has assured believers of the faithfulness of Christ and the certainty of hope. The first verse acts almost as an introduction to the rest of the text, giving us cause to stop and ponder the Word of assurance that God has given us, described in greater detail in the next four verses. Those four verses are in fact paraphrases of Scripture passages: Isaiah 41:10, 43:2, Romans 8:3-39, Hebrews 13:5, and Deuteronomy 31:6. In the words of this hymn then, we carry with us the Word from God, and the call to trust in that Word. But God's Word is expansive and not limited to letters on a page - the fourth verse moves us to a trust in the Word made flesh in Jesus Christ. Thus we are assured by the words we sing, the Word we are given, and the Word made flesh, of the steadfastness of God and His unfailing love.

This hymn, believed by most to have been written by Richard Keen, was first published in 1787 in John Rippon's *A Selection of Hymns* (Rippon was minister at the London church Keen attended). Keen's text originally included seven stanzas and was entitled "Exceeding great and precious promises." It appeared in A. Fletcher Baptist's 1822 *Collection of Hymns* in only four stanzas, omitting the original second, fourth and fifth. Today, hymnals include anywhere from three to five stanzas, often the original first, third, fourth, fifth and seventh stanzas. The number of verses found in each hymnal differs, but the actual text has not been altered much. When all five stanzas are used, the text powerfully moves from references to the faithfulness of God in the Old Testament to the certainty of the faithfulness of Christ.

On a side note, thank you all for making me feel so welcomed! I look forward to meeting with the Parish Choir on Wednesday, September 6, 2017 at 6:30pm. I would encourage those of you who may be interested in singing to make it out to rehearsal. Several existing members have expressed to me that there is a need for more voices. There is no need to know how to read music (I will teach you). The more solid voices we have, the more music we can do. Please prayerfully consider joining this ministry and pray for all ministries at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.
