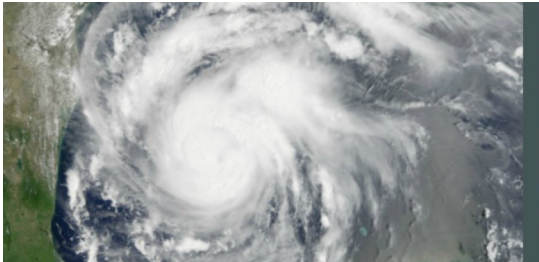

THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

Over the past several weeks I have been going over Archbishop Vigneron's pastoral letter, *Unleash the Gospel*. It struck me, after reading this document with fresh eyes, that there are ten "Guideposts" that act as markers of what any person, parish, or pastoral plan needs to reflect on and understand. For whatever it is worth, I would like to elaborate on these guideposts in both this week's and next week's bulletin.

GUIDEPOST 1: THE NEW PENTECOST

For the Church in Detroit, reliving the Gospel mysteries means we continually return to the Upper Room, asking for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on us and the whole region. We seek to bring every member of the Church, in so far as possible, into a personal and life-transforming experience of the Holy Spirit. We recognized that we cannot give what we do not have, so we seek to continually be refreshed in God's presence and fill again and again with His love, so that it is His own love we are sharing with others. P. 11

For the new Pentecost to happen, the Archbishop believes we must return to the Lord regularly through the reception of the Sacraments, particularly the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession. Doing this returns to the core and heart of who we are as Christians, Catholics, and Disciples of Christ. For a new Pentecost to erupt in our lives, our families, our community, our parish, and our Archdiocese, the key is an openness to God's grace and the demands of the Gospel in concrete situations which go beyond a list of commandments or avoidance of a list of sins.

With a new Pentecost comes an understanding, says Archbishop Vigneron, that we are living Chapter 29 of the Acts of the Apostles. Since the Acts of the Apostles concludes with Chapter 28, it means we need to see ourselves as a living extension of how we proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and live it out in our various life situations.

GUIDEPOST 2: WITH EYES FIXED ON JESUS

In the second guidepost the Archbishop doubles down on an important reality – our relationship with the Risen Christ: *"The new evangelization is not a membership drive, nor is it an effort to shore up a code of conduct. Rather, it is a love affair. All are invited to encounter Jesus and allow their hearts to be captured by Him."* This encounter with the Lord can happen at any time and any place. In many respects, this has special significance for priests. We need to see baptisms, weddings, funerals, Christmas and Easter as times when many Catholics who have been away from the Church re-gather. This is, therefore, not a time to chastise or condemn, but an opportunity to present the joy of the Gospel.

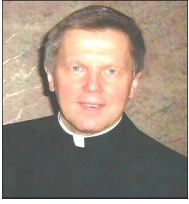

GUIDEPOST 3: THE WORD MADE FLESH

It is important for us as Catholics to see that the more we embrace the sacramental life of the Church, the more we encounter the Risen Christ "in the flesh." The Church is not just another club of like-minded individuals. The Church, though made up of sinners and at times in need of reform of sinful ways, is nevertheless a way Christ uses to reveal His living presence in our historical reality. The more we embrace the Sacraments of the Church, the more deeply we become connected to Jesus Christ.

GUIDEPOST 4: EQUIPPING FOR THE SERVICE OF THE GOSPEL

Archbishop Vigneron writes: *This entails a paradigm shift such that every parish becomes a 'school of evangelization' in which all members are being equipped to be witnesses of Christ* (p.14) In other words, not only does faith formation not stop at the eighth grade, or when one receives the Sacrament of Confirmation, but is, rather, a life-long learning process. This does not mean memorizing Catholic doctrine. Catholics, both individually and as a parish, need to discern what their gifts are and then develop them in order for those gifts to flourish. Not everyone has the same gifts and no one has all the gifts necessary for proclaiming the Gospel, but the ability to see and affirm how God is already at work in a person, as well as in a parish, is itself a gift and a virtue that will lead to greater spiritual awareness.

GUIDEPOST 5: NO BYSTANDERS

For the new evangelization to flourish, for it to be 'new' rather than old, all are called to take an active role in proclaiming the good news. Not just priests, religious, or parish staffs, commissions, or councils, but all fully initiated Catholics (that is Catholics who have been baptized, made their first communion, and have been confirmed.) No one gets a free pass when it comes to unleashing the Gospel. It is a task, a responsibility, a joy, and a privilege that we all must embrace and strive to live out.

The second portion of reflections on *Unleash the Gospel* will conclude in next week's bulletin.

JUST A NOTE

Hymns have a way of weaving themselves into our own life stories. Laura de Jong, MDiv Calvin College, shares about a worship service in which "What Wondrous Love" took on a new, more urgent meaning in her life:

Each year Calvin College hosts a Tenebrae service for students and local churches. I've had the privilege of helping to lead a number of these, but there is one service in particular that I will never forget. This was the second year that we had used the first two lines of "What Wondrous Love" as a refrain sung throughout the service after each Scripture reading. As we heard and reflected on the last hours of Christ, each time we sang this refrain it was more and more powerful. Near the very end of the service, as we sang this refrain during the "Shadow of the Crucifixion," an older visitor from down the road slumped against his wife, having just suffered a fatal heart attack. The congregation sat in tears and prayer as campus safety administered CPR and a defibrillator, to no avail. In the midst of this reflection on Christ's suffering for our sake, this man had gone home to be with his Savior. As I left that place, the last stanza of the hymn came to mind: "And when from death I'm free, I'll sing and joyful be, and through eternity I'll sing on." Indeed, what wondrous love this is, that frees us from the fear of death, and causes us to lift our voices in wonder at the love of the Lamb.

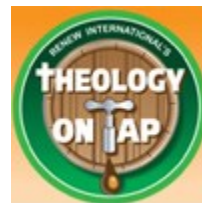
