THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

As a result of the tragic events which took place in Charlottesville, Virginia last month, the Catholic bishops of the United States have established an ad hoc committee (a committee convened for a specific purpose) which *"will be wholly dedicated to engaging the Church and our society to work together in unity to challenge the sin of racism, to listen to persons who are suffering under this sin, and to come together in the love of Christ to educate and emphasize we are all brothers and sisters."* Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, the Archbishop of Galveston-Houston, Texas (and the current president of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) recently made this statement in a press conference announcing the ad hoc committee.

Additionally, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued the following press release,

In July of 2017 we remembered the 50th anniversary of the 1967 civil disturbance in the city of Detroit and the ongoing effects of what took place a half century ago. A year ago, at our Mass for Pardon, we acknowledged and prayed for forgiveness for any 'institutional racism' ever perpetuated in and by the Archdiocese of Detroit. Beyond southeast Michigan, recent events have demonstrated that the sin of racism still exists in our nation. As the Chief Shepherd of the Archdiocese of Detroit, I strongly support the creation of a committee by my brother bishops to address this sin – racism – and to work toward bringing the light of the Gospel to dispel this scourge from our society. I encourage the people of the Archdiocese of Detroit to uphold the dignity of each person in our society, regardless of race.

Notice the continual use of the phrase "sin of racism". It is important to understand what is meant by the use of this phrase. We cannot change a reality unless we truly know what we are dealing with. Racism is not just individual bigotry, though it is usually accompanied with an abundance of individual bigotry. I have had conversations with people who insist they are not racist because they treat people with dignity and respect. What I say to them (if they are white) is "You are not prejudiced or bigoted, but you still benefit from racism. In fact, I, and anyone who is white, benefits from racism, because of how our society and culture currently work." How can this be?

Racism is a structural reality. It is sadly embedded into the fabric of our culture and society, and so it is present and affects us, whether we want it to or not. It affects the opportunities people have for their lives. The sin of racism makes the life experiences of a person of color quite different and more difficult than for a person who is Caucasian. Some simple examples of this: If someone is stopped for a traffic ticket, what is their experience? How often do they get stopped? Are they hassled and harassed by the police? I have never had the experience of having my rights violated by an officer of the law - even when I was in the wrong. I was always treated with dignity, courtesy and respect. There have been far too many stories in the news of someone who is a person of color being treated in ways which violated their civil rights. A young adult of color wanders through a store looking over a variety of items, but makes no purchase of any of them. How are they viewed by the staff of that store? Are they eyed with undue suspicion because they look 'shifty'? Would a white person be scrutinized in the same way in that store for doing the exact same thing, or, would they more likely be dismissed as just 'window shopping'? A person of color walks down a residential street in our community. In the process of doing this, he or she, is talking on a cell phone and perhaps stops or lingers in one spot before concluding the conversation. Would that person be more likely to be eyed with skepticism because of their color? Would someone just automatically assume they are a drug dealer or involved in some type of nefarious activity? The latter is oftentimes the assumption many people make.

Fr. Jerry Slowinski Pastor Ext. 101 We live in a society that has been deeply scarred by racism. Frequently, or habitually, it is not what the person is doing that makes others uncomfortable. Rather, it is the difference in the color of a person's skin which leads someone to be seen in an unfavorable way.

This is why it is important to name racism as a sin, a sin of our whole society, even if we are not personally bigoted or prejudiced, so that we recognize the long, hard work that needs to be done to change embedded realities. The Bishops of the United States are saying that they are committed to that long, hard work.

It has been said that racism is America's original sin, because it has been tolerated and deemed acceptable since the Colonial era of American history. The Catholic Church still has the capacity to be the much-needed prophetic voice that speaks out against America's original sin. The Gospel remains clear! The Church should be at the forefront of asserting that the ugly barrier which divides people along racial lines is not acceptable. Then, and only then, will the American Dream, that every person is entitled to an equal opportunity to achieve success and prosperity through hard work and determination, be realized.



JUST A NOTE

St. Francis of Assisi (Italian: San Francesco d'Assisi, born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone, but nicknamed Francesco ("the Frenchman") by his father, (1181/1182 – October 3, 1226) was an Italian Catholic friar and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, and the Third Order of Saint Francis for men and women not able to live the lives of itinerant preachers followed by the early members of the Order of Friars Minor or the monastic lives of the Poor Clares. Though he was never ordained to the Catholic priesthood, Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history.

Francis' father was Pietro di Bernardone, a prosperous silk merchant. Francis lived the high-spirited life typical of a wealthy young man, even fighting as a soldier for Assisi. While going off to war in 1204, Francis had a vision that directed him back to Assisi, where he lost his taste for his worldly life. On a pilgrimage to Rome, he joined the poor in begging at St. Peter's Basilica. The experience moved him to live in poverty.

Francis returned home, began preaching on the streets, and soon amassed a following. His Order was authorized by Pope Innocent III in 1210. He then founded the Order of Poor Clares, which became an enclosed religious order for women, as well as the Order of Brothers and Sisters of Penance (commonly called the Third Order).

In 1219, he went to Egypt in an attempt to convert the Sultan to put an end to the conflict of the Crusades. By this point, the Franciscan Order had grown to such an extent that its primitive organizational structure was no longer sufficient. He returned to Italy to organize the Order. Once his community was authorized by the Pope, he withdrew increasingly from external affairs. In 1223, Francis arranged for the first Christmas manger scene. In 1224, he received the stigmata, making him the first recorded person to bear the wounds of Christ's Passion. He died during the evening hours of October 3, 1226, while listening to a reading he had requested of Psalm 140.

On July 16, 1228, he was pronounced a saint by Pope Gregory IX. He is known as the patron saint of animals, the environment, and is one of the two patron saints of Italy (with Catherine of Siena). It is customary for Catholic and Anglican churches to hold ceremonies blessing animals on his feast day of October 4. He is also known for his love of the Eucharist, his sorrow during the Stations of the Cross, and for the creation of the Christmas creche or Nativity Scene.

The Prayer of Saint Francis (*Make Me a Channel of Your Peace*) is a Catholic Christian prayer. It is widely but erroneously attributed to the 13th-century saint Francis of Assisi. The prayer in its present form cannot be traced back further than 1912, when it was printed in Paris in French, in a small spiritual magazine called *La Clochette* (The Little Bell), published by La Ligue de la Sainte-Messe (The Holy Mass League). The author's name was not given, although it may have been the founder of La Ligue, Fr. Esther Bouquerel.

A professor at the University of Orleans in France, Dr. Christian Renoux, published a study of the prayer and its history in French in 2001 - (Renoux, Christian (2001). La prière pour la paix attribuée à saint François: une énigme à résoudre. Paris: Editions franciscaines.)

The prayer has been known in the United States since 1927 when its first known translation in English appeared in January of that year in the Quaker magazine *Friends' Intelligencer* (Philadelphia), where it was attributed to St. Francis of Assisi. Cardinal Francis Spellman and Senator Albert W. Hawkes distributed millions of copies of the prayer during and just after World War II.


