THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

God does not expect us to know everything, nor is it necessary for us to understand why God does what God does. The Scriptures are filled with examples of people who wrestled with questions of why God allowed something terrible to happen to them, or why God does not punish people on the spot for the terrible things they are obviously guilty of. The Book of Psalms addresses the futility of trying to know the mind of God: "Such knowledge is beyond me, far too lofty for me to attain" (Psalm 139: 6). St Paul wrote "How inscrutable are God's judgments and how unsearchable are the ways of the Lord" (Romans 11:34).

We naturally want to know, or even make up answers, about God's way of thinking. While it is absolutely true that God has imparted many truths and much wisdom in revealing to us the mysteries of the Kingdom, God has not told us everything. For all practical purposes God seems to favor faith over rational knowledge. God's response, when we question, is often "Trust me on this one ... Follow me ... Have a little faith". In moments when we are asked to do this, all we can do is to acknowledge the mystery of God.

One of the first heresies the Christian community had to face was Gnosticism, a false teaching that salvation depended on having special knowledge of God; knowledge not available to everyone. We do not, indeed we cannot, have all the answers to all of life's questions. Instead, we are called to put our trust in The One who offers us salvation – Jesus Christ. When Jesus began calling 'The Twelve', several of the Apostles responded to Jesus' call by asking "where are you staying?" It is a rather simple question and it would seem the answer would be pretty straight-forward. The ways of God though are not always so clear and obvious. Jesus simply replies to the question posed to him by saying, "Come and see." In effect, he is inviting those who would be his disciples to come with him on an adventure into the unknown. Our freedom, our security, and our future can best be summarized in the following four words - "Faith in Jesus Christ!" That is all we know and that is all we need to know.
