THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

Growing up I harbored secret dreams of glory. I wanted to be the one who hit the winning home run for the Tigers in the World Series or score the decisive goal which would give the Red Wings the Stanley Cup. It is not unusual for us to fantasize about great achievements which will set us apart from others and lead to fame and fortune. Perhaps our daydreams vary based on what our interests happen to be, but the bottom line is that we would love to have the bright, hot spotlight shine on us and shine on us alone.

While it is not unhealthy to have such dreams of glory such as those just mentioned, there are other dreams of glory that are grounded in ulterior motives. For instance, some dreams of glory take the form of being powerful enough to annihilate an adversary, such as the local school bully, in order to embarrass and humiliate that person. It was this latter dream of glory that the people of Israel fantasized about. Messianic glory would manifest itself in conquering and vanquishing the enemies and armies of nations who occupied the land of Palestine.

As we see from the Gospels, real glory does not consist in outmuscling the bad. When Jesus was crucified, he was offered precisely the challenge to prove that he was special, powerful, and mighty by doing something spectacular, such as coming down from the cross, thereby leaving his oppressors cowering in fear. **“If you are the Son of God, prove it, come down from the cross and save yourself and us!”** (Luke 23:39).

The Gospels, however, teach a very different lesson. On the cross, Jesus proves that he is powerful beyond measure, not by doing some spectacular acts that leaves everyone around him helpless or in awe, but rather, in a spectacular physical act that leaves everyone around him helpless to make any protest. Jesus performs a spectacular act of the heart wherein he forgives those who are mocking him and killing him. In other words, God's power and glory are made apparent in pardon and clemency - not in barbarity and brute strength, but in meekness and forgiveness.

That is real glory and it is the one thing we should be envious of, namely compassion and mercy which was modeled by Jesus in the face of jealousy, hatred and murder. God defines glory very differently from human beings. Divine glory is not winning an Oscar, Emmy or Grammy. Divine glory consists in being deeply compassionate, forgiving, and gracious. These are qualities, unfortunately, which are not associated with worldly success.

Our dreams of glory, as disciples of Christ, begins with envisioning ourselves as standing out, not on talent, looks, muscles, speed, or strength, but in our willingness to forgive in the way that Jesus did prior to his taking his final breath.

BECOME A LITURGICAL MINISTER - SHARE IN THE MINISTRY OF THE CHURCH!

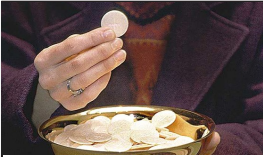
If you would like to join a ministry, training and information sessions will be made by appointment at your convenience.



BE A LECTOR!

Proclaim the Word of God during the liturgy through the prayerful, clear, and strong reading of the scriptures. This ministry is a scheduled ministry. Most lectors are scheduled about once per month, using a six month schedule.

ALTAR SERVERS – one of the most visible ministries during the Mass, an altar server is a minister to the priest. This is a **great** opportunity to really learn about the Mass. **For ages 3rd grade & up.** **Individual Training for all Altar Servers any time (or as a group in October)** This ministry is a scheduled ministry. Most servers are scheduled about twice per month, six months per schedule.



EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION (EMHC)

Assist in the distribution of the Holy Eucharist during the liturgy. It is a privilege and honor to share the True Presence of the Body of Christ to those called to the Banquet. This is not a scheduled ministry - serve when you are available according to your Mass attendance.

COMMUNION MINISTRY TO THE HOMEBOUND

Take Communion to those who are unable to join us in our Sunday worship. Pray with them and bring the sense of belonging to the community directly to them.



BE A SACRISTAN!

Take care of the overall preparations for liturgical celebrations. Preparation includes tending to the books, chalice, linens, candles, cruets, etc. These duties expand for special days such as the Triduum, Easter Vigil, funerals, etc.

BECOME A MINISTER OF HOSPITALITY (USHER)!

Ministers of Hospitality extend a warm welcome to parishioners and visitors to the parish alike. They make those with special needs feel at home and make certain any necessary accommodations are taken care of. Ministers of Hospitality assist anyone in the assembly who may be having a problem or are in need. **This ministry is open to parishioners of all ages and genders.**



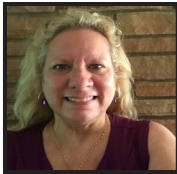
FATIMA: ROSARY PRAYER SERVICE

Friday, October 13th at 7:00pm

One hundred years ago, one of the most important series of apparitions in Church history took place. The Blessed Mother appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal, six times between May and October 1917. Her calls to conversion and repentance are profound and were life-changing. Fatima has become one of the major pilgrimage sites in the world with over 4 million people a year visiting the basilica on the site of the appearances in Fatima. There has been an ever-increasing devotion to praying the Rosary as Our Lady requested.

Here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have been celebrating these appearances and promoting the prayer of the Rosary. Since the weekend of May 13th/14th, various parish members and families have been taking a 12" statue of Our Lady of Fatima to their homes for a week to use in their Rosary devotions.

Now, in these difficult times, we reflect on Our Lady's message that prayer and sacrifice can achieve world peace. As Sister Lucia (who as a child, was one of the three children who witnessed these apparitions) said, "the Rosary is the prayer which sustains and increases our faith." On Friday, Oct. 13th, the anniversary of the last apparition, we will close out our anniversary celebration with a Rosary prayer service to be held at 7:00pm in the chapel. Please plan to join us as we raise our voices together in this prayer for peace.

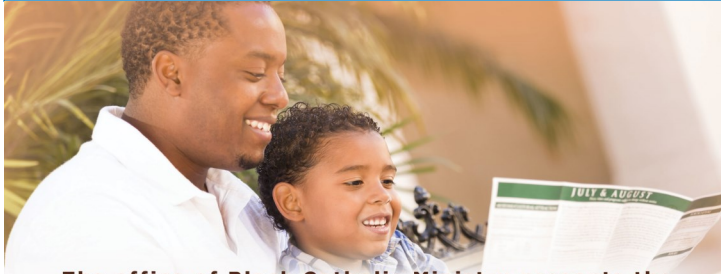

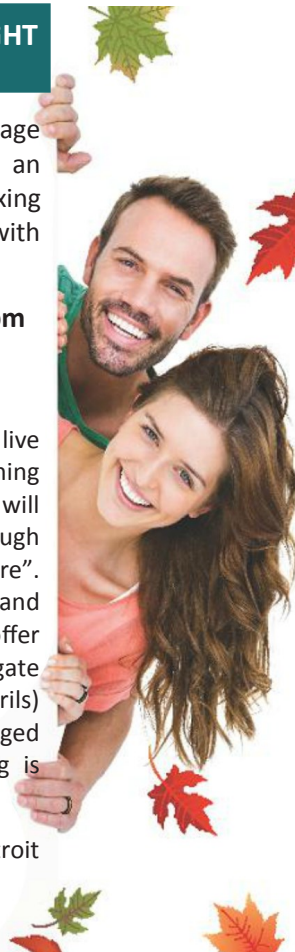
