

FATIMA: ROSARY PRAYER SERVICE Friday, October 13th at 7:00pm

One hundred years ago, one of the most important series of apparitions in Church history took place. The Blessed Mother appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal, six times between May and October 1917. Her calls to conversion and repentance are profound and were life-changing. Fatima has become one of the major pilgrimage sites in the world with over 4 million people a year visiting the basilica on the site of the appearances in Fatima. There has been an ever-increasing devotion to praying the Rosary as Our Lady requested.

Here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have been celebrating these appearances and promoting the prayer of the Rosary. Since the weekend of May 13th/14th, various parish members and families have been taking a 12" statue of Our Lady of Fatima to their homes for a week to use in their Rosary devotions.

Now, in these difficult times, we reflect on Our Lady's message that prayer and sacrifice can achieve world peace. As Sister Lucia (who as a child, was one of the three children who witnessed these apparitions) said, "the Rosary is the prayer which sustains and increases our faith." On Friday, Oct. 13th, the anniversary of the last apparition, we will close out our anniversary celebration with a Rosary prayer service to be held at 7:00pm in the chapel. Please plan to join us as we raise our voices together in this prayer for peace.

CAPUCHIN HEALING SERVICE

The Capuchin Friars of St. Bonaventure are coming to St. Jane Frances de Chantal on Tuesday, October 24th for a traditional Blessing of the Sick service. This will not be a Mass, but will be in place of the regularly scheduled Tuesday evening Mass with Anointing.

The friars will use a relic of the True Cross to bless all who are in need of healing, either in mind, body, or spirit. When Venerable Fr. Solanus Casey was at St. Bonaventure's in Detroit, he would often help and bless those seeking healing. This service is regularly available at St. Bonaventure Chapel which is attached to the Solanus Casey Center, but we are making it available to our parish and our neighbors on this occasion.

This week I thought it would be nice to feature a biography of a celebrated composer of the Catholic church.

Marty Haugen, (born December 30, 1950 in Wanamingo, Minnesota), is an American composer of liturgical music. He was raised in the American Lutheran Church (ALC) in Minnesota, and also writes contemporary hymns and liturgies for the Lutheran church despite being a member the United Church of Christ. Despite being a non-Catholic, his music has found favor in the both liberal Roman Catholic and Protestant congregations. Haugen holds a B.A. degree in psychology from Luther College and an M.A. degree in Pastoral Studies from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. For the past 25 years Haugen has pursued a career as a liturgical composer and workshop presenter.

The majority of his compositions are published by GIA Publications, Inc.. His best-known works are two Lutheran liturgies, "Holden Evening Prayer" and "Now the Feast and Celebration", and settings of the Catholic Mass, the most widely-known being the Mass of Creation. He has also composed dozens of other works, including liturgy settings, choral arrangements, sacred songs, and hymns, including "All Are Welcome", "Here in this Place (Gather Us In)", "Canticle of the Sun", "We Are Many Parts", "We Remember", and "Shepherd Me, O God," as well as several psalm settings and paraphrases.

Haugen is a performing musician, and has recorded a number of CDs. He holds a position as composer in residence at Mayflower Community Congregational Church (UCC) in Minneapolis.

Following the movement that began with the St. Louis Jesuits in the 1970s and 1980s, Marty Haugen, together with David Haas, became one of the most prolific composers of contemporary Catholic liturgical music during the period of rapid liturgical change following Vatican II. Their hymns, songs, and liturgy make up a good deal of the contents of the GIA Gather hymnals, and are widely published in other hymnals used by the Catholic Church in the United States. Haugen's Mass of Creation has become one of the most widely used settings of the Mass throughout the English speaking world.

Because Haugen and Haas have become synonymous with this style of music, their names are often mentioned in criticism of liturgical use of music of this style. One of the main criticisms is that the musical style is similar to that used for children's musicals, thus trivialising the mood and feel of the

liturgical celebration and betraying 1960s-era folk music stylings that sound dated to critics.

Haugen has written several liturgies for the ELCA. These include "Now the Feast and Celebration, (written in collaboration with then campus pastors at Pacific Lutheran University Susan Briehl, Dan Erlander and Martin Wells), "Unfailing Light," an evening communion service written in collaboration with Pastor Susan Briehl, "Setting Two" for the Evangelical Lutheran Worship Book (ELW), and an evening prayer service, "Holden Evening Prayer", originally written for Holden Village. These liturgies have been published in various forms, with some of them appearing in the ELCA hymnal supplement With One Voice and the newest hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship (2006). --wikipedia.org
