THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

One of the final administrative acts I have put into motion before Fr. Tony Sulkowski begins his assignment here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal on Monday, November 13th, is to follow through on a recommendation made by the Worship Commission and ratified by the Parish Council last June. This recommendation involves the removal of the eleventh and final pew in the row that is closest to the tabernacle.

We are doing this in order to facilitate a more fluid plan of egress in the case of a fire, tornado warning, or an incident of violence. The removal of the pew would allow people in wheelchairs to exit church by

an alternate route in an emergency situation. As things currently stand, the pew nearest the structural laminated column near the door marked '7' is only 38". There is no way a person in a wheelchair could exit through such a narrow opening if the primary exit from church could not be used. The removal of one pew expands the opening near door 7 from 38" to 72".

There is the realization that this will possibly draw some irritation on the part of those who sit in the pew that is soon to be removed from church. People tend to be rather territorial regarding where they sit for Mass. Please, if you are unhappy about this, try to put it in perspective. The difference in the width of the egress in church could save the life of a person, or even a group of people, with a disability who need to get out of church because of grave and serious circumstances. When put in those terms, it doesn't seem so unreasonable for some to sacrifice for the great good of all.

To be totally honest, the removal of this pew was something that should have be done in July. Unfortunately it got placed on the back burner since we were in the process of interviewing candidates for the position of Director of Music. Things then got further sidetracked with my being asked to take a new parish assignment and Maureen Blair's stepping down as pastoral minister due to reasons related to her health. As we are now so close to the month of November, in which we pray for all those who have died, might I suggest that, rather than express exasperation or displeasure with the removal of a pew from church, you just instead say a little prayer and offer up any potential sacrifice for the poor souls in purgatory.

Please note that we are not offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) or 7:00pm Mass either this coming Tuesday, October 31st or the following Tuesday, November 7th. Tuesday evening Confessions and Mass will resume on November 14th.

As we enter into the month of November, we are again offering people an opportunity to write the names of deceased family members and friends into our Book of Remembrance which has been placed in the gathering space/vestibule. This is a fitting way of continuing to pray for those who have gone before us marked with the Signs of Faith.



Don't forget to set your clocks back one hour next Sunday, November 5th!

JUST A NOTE

A couple of weeks ago, I received an e-mail from a parishioner concerning the removal of the embolism during the Lord's Prayer. The concern was that we were doing the "Protestant" form of the prayer instead of the "Catholic" version. This person also reached out to an internet blogger to question whether or not this could be done. I presume that the ultimate concern was: Is this a liturgical abuse? Quite simply, it is not.

Although I profess to be no liturgical expert, there are a couple of things that hold true. 1.) The celebrant is the chief liturgist of the Holy Mass. 2.) The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops write extensively about the Mass Ordinary and these writings are considered a primary source; not a

blog. Information found on websites can be highly misleading and biased; therefore, they should not be considered as a primary source. 3.) Moreover, there are other non-Scriptural writings which have been preserved from the early days of the Church. It was here, where the doxology was first found in the important document called the "Didache," (written between 70-140 AD). "Didache" (Did-ah-kay) simply means 'teaching'.

The "Our Father" in the Didache had the doxology tagged onto the end without the words "the kingdom." The tradition of the doxology was carried into the Liturgy, and became so closely associated with the Lord's Prayer that it is now often mistaken to be part of the prayer itself. The words "the kingdom" were added later and are preserved in the document "The Apostolic Constitutions" (written 250-380 AD). The "Our Father" is contained twice in the Bible (Matt. 6:9-13; Luke 11:2-4) with no doxology, for although very ancient, it is not found in the original manuscripts. This is simply a prayer from the believers in the early centuries of the Church whose spirits were moved by the Holy Spirit to close this beautiful prayer in grandiose fashion. These early writings never present it as an essential part of the "Our Father," but rather as an embolism (added prayer) intended to increase fervor and direct the intention of the faithful. 4.) In regards to The Lord's Prayer, *the General Instruction of the Roman Missal clearly states in Chapter Two, Article 81:*

In the Lord's Prayer a petition is made for daily bread, which for Christians means principally the Eucharistic Bread, and entreating also purification from sin, so that what is holy may in truth be given to the holy. The Priest pronounces the invitation to the prayer, and all the faithful say the prayer with him; then the Priest alone adds the embolism, which the people conclude by means of the doxology. The embolism, developing the last petition of the Lord's Prayer itself, asks for deliverance from the power of evil for the whole community of the faithful.

The invitation, the Prayer itself, the embolism, and the doxology by which the people conclude these things are sung or are said aloud¹.

The Roman Missal is clear in its language regarding the celebration of the Holy Eucharist in respect to the rights and prerogatives of the celebrant:

23. Moreover, in order that such a celebration may correspond more fully to the prescriptions and spirit of the Sacred Liturgy, and also in order that its pastoral effectiveness be enhanced, certain accommodations and adaptations are set out in this General Instruction and in the Order of Mass.

24. These adaptations consist, for the most part, in the choice of certain rites or texts, that is, of the chants, readings, prayers, explanatory interventions, and gestures capable of responding better to the needs, the preparation, and the culture of the participants and which are entrusted to the Priest Celebrant².

I hope this clears up any confusion and maybe gives you a brief catechetical moment about the prayers of the church, the celebration of the Mass, and the responsibilities of those who lead worship.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) REGULAR AND THANKSGIVING FOOD COLLECTION

Due to an increase in calls for food, our pantry is running low on the following items: canned tuna, chicken, & ham; macaroni & cheese, canned baked beans, canned fruit, beets, & soups, as well as peanut butter & jelly/jams, powdered milk, cake frosting, Jell-O, rice, instant potatoes, and cans/jars of spaghetti sauce.

We are also now collecting food for the SVdP Thanksgiving food baskets to make the holiday a little better for the less fortunate. It is expected that we will have requests for help from about 50 families this year. At St. Leo's, meals are served from 11:30am to 12:30pm with clean-up following. We will return to the St. Jane parking lot around 1:30pm.

If you are not able to go down but wish to contribute, drop off a Sweet Potato Pie or Apple Pie only. **Please, NO PUMPKIN PIES**. Food cost is constantly going up so monetary donations are also appreciated.
