THE FINAL JERRY-ATRICS

12 years, two weeks, and one day. That is the amount of time I have served at St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish. I began my assignment on October 22, 2005, and after the 11:30am Mass on Sunday, November 5, 2017, my term as pastor comes to a close. That is a total of 4,397 days.

First and foremost, I want to express my appreciation for the kindness you have extended to me. I have, these past few weeks, been reflecting fondly on the time we have shared together. The people of St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish will always have a special place in my heart.

Since I am only human, I realize I have made my share of mistakes along the way. I apologize to anyone who I have hurt, and pray that you could find it in your heart to forgive me if you feel you have been wronged.

Over the course of the 628 weeks and one day I have served as pastor of this faith community, I've baptized hundreds of children, witnessed the wedding vows of approximately 250 couples, performed too many funerals, heard a staggering number of confessions, visited hospitals and shut-ins, anointed an inestimable number of people, and celebrated more Masses than I could ever venture to postulate. Together, over the course of that time, we have realized a few dreams, lived through a few trials, and have persevered in faith.

While I am leaving, there is One who remains constant: Jesus Christ. Jesus has been here from the beginning and will be with you always. St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish always has been and always will be Christ's church. God is the One who deserves and should get all the glory for all that is good which has resulted over the time I have served here as your pastor. God is the One who is forever faithful. It has been a privilege and an honor to minister to the people of God here at St. Jane's in both times of tribulation and joy.

I do feel compelled to convey the following and hope it is understood in the right way. When this weekend concludes, I will no longer be the pastor of this faith community. Fr. Tony Sulkowski has been assigned by Archbishop Vigneron to serve as the fourth pastor of St. Jane Frances de Chantal. It is my hope that no one would ask me to (Continued on page 3)

return to be the celebrant for a family wedding, funeral, baptism, etc. I will have to say no to any such requests. I don't believe it is right to return to a former assignment unless there is some extremely compelling reason to do so. I am aware of priests who regularly return to parishes where they have served. Such a practice only undermines the work of the new priest who is beginning an assignment. Additionally, I am looking at a steep learning curve in serving as the only priest in a parish that is twice the number of registered families as St. Jane Frances de Chantal. It is just not humanly possible to honor such requests to return where I have previously served.

I am so grateful to members of the parish staff, both those I have worked with in the past and those who I presently serve with, for all they have done. They have made me look far better than I ever could.

I'd like to close this final edition of Jerry-atrics by offering you the following blessing:

May God bless you with a restless discomfort about easy answers, half-truths, and things which only have superficial meaning so you may seek truth boldly.

May God bless you with a holy anger at injustice and oppression of people, so that you may tirelessly work for justice, freedom, and peace.

May God bless you with the gift of tears to shed with those who suffer from pain, rejection, starvation, or loss of all they cherish, so that you may reach out your hand to comfort them and transform their pain into joy.

May God bless you with enough audacity to believe that you can really make a difference in this world, so that you are able, with God's grace, to do what others claim cannot be done.

And may God, the Creator of heaven and earth, Jesus Christ, the Word made Flesh, and the Holy Spirit, our Advocate and Guide, be with you and remain with you this day and forever more. Amen.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Unused Prescription and OTC Medications Unused Wound Care Products Collection November 4 - 19, 2017

Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your home??

The Health Ministry at St. Jane Frances will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *to the pharmacist at the Soup Kitchen who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.* Please bring unused medications & wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates .

Rules for medication drop off:

- 1. Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. **Please block out your name** before bringing the bottles to church.
- 2. Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- 3.Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.

4. NO LIQUIDS.

5. NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

Rules for wound care products drop off:

- 1. Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- 2. No liquids or ointments.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) REGULAR AND THANKSGIVING FOOD COLLECTION

Due to an increase in calls for food, our pantry is running low on the following items: canned tuna, chicken, & ham; macaroni & cheese, canned baked beans, canned fruit, beets, & soups, as well as peanut butter & jelly/jams, powdered milk, cake frosting, Jell-O, rice, instant potatoes, and cans/jars of spaghetti sauce.

We are also now collecting food for the SVdP Thanksgiving food baskets to make the holiday a little better for the less fortunate. It is expected that we will have requests for help from about 50 families this year. The following food items will be needed for the food baskets: canned sweet potatoes, boxed stuffing, canned cranberries, canned pumpkin for pies, frozen turkeys (10 -12 lbs.), turkey breasts, and hams. Please note that the meat items will not be collected until after November 12, 2017. These items are needed no later than November 19th. Thanksgiving food baskets will be delivered on Tuesday, November 21, 2017.

Your food donations can be deposited in the basket in front of the Church (during the offertory collection or before/after Mass) or you can give them to one of the ushers. To make a cash donation, you may use one of the envelopes on the table located in the hallway marked St. Vincent de Paul (or any envelope and write St. Vincent de Paul on it) and place it in the collection basket or drop it off at the office.

SOUP KITCHEN MINISTRY - Thanksgiving Day @ St. Leo's

Additionally, we will be baking corn bread at St. Jane to serve with the meal.

As always, VOLUNTEERS MUST SIGN-UP at the parish office. You can do this in person or by calling the office at (586) 977-8080 and asking to be placed on the list. St. Leo's has an age requirement. You must be at least 16 years old to volunteer for St. Leo's service.

If you sign-up to serve and wish to carpool, we will meet in the South parking lot at **8:15am** and form groups with volunteer drivers to carpool. We leave by 8:30am. **DRIVERS ARE NEEDED.** At St. Leo's, meals are served from 11:30am to 12:30pm with clean-up following. We will return to the St. Jane parking lot around 1:30pm.

If you are not able to go down but wish to contribute, drop off a Sweet Potato Pie or Apple Pie only. **Please, NO PUMPKIN PIES**. Food cost is constantly going up so monetary donations are also appreciated. You can help this ministry greatly by writing a check out to St. Jane's with "Soup Kitchen Ministry" in the memo line. God bless you for your help in this ministry. Through your participation and generosity, it is possible to serve.


