## JUST A NOTE

Our Opening Hymn "We Gather Together" was originally a Dutch patriotic song, written around 1600 to celebrate the freedom of the Netherlands from Spanish rule. However, God's kingdom transcends national and ethnic boundaries. When the Church sings this hymn, she is reminded of the words of the apostle Paul: "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12, ESV). The day will come when God will overthrow the devil and all evil. Even now, we can say, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). In singing this hymn, the people of God seek His help and thank Him for His presence in the pursuit of victory over evil, for we know that God "forgets not His own."



### ADVENT: BE WATCHFUL, BE ALERT!

So the joke goes: *Did you hear what happened to our Thanksgiving turkey? He got run over by Santa's sleigh!*

We are all too familiar with the rush that is already upon us, the mad dash to the Christmas holidays. Even Thanksgiving gets crowded out! The Church tries to help us keep it all in perspective. As we begin the season of Advent, she gives us Scriptures that are rich in language that advises us to slow down and pay attention. *Be alert! Be watchful! Make straight His paths!*

To help us to be more alert, we are offering two opportunities for *Lectio Divina* for the four weeks of Advent. We will have an afternoon session on Mondays from 3:00pm - 4:00pm beginning on Nov. 27 and running through Monday, Dec. 18. We will repeat this session on Wednesdays from 7:00pm - 8:00pm beginning on Nov. 29 and continuing for 4 weeks through Dec. 20. Each of these sessions will use the *Lectio Divina* method to explore the Gospels for the Sundays of Advent. As we experience God's Word we will come to hear what He has in mind for us this year as we again prepare to celebrate His birth. Come, join us. Attend one, two, three, or all four sessions at whichever time and day is most convenient to you.

Listen. *Be watchful. Be Alert!*

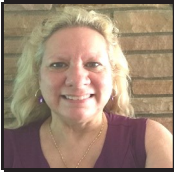

**SOUP KITCHEN MINISTRY - Thanksgiving Day @ St. Leo's**

Volunteers from St. Jane's will be going to St. Leo's in Detroit to prepare and serve Thanksgiving Lunch/Dinner to hungry guests living in that area. **Please mark your calendars for Thanksgiving Day, November 23<sup>rd</sup>.** This has been a tradition for the St. Jane Soup Kitchen Ministry for over 15 years without omission. In order for a successful meal service, we need **20 adult volunteers maximum** to sign up. Similar to last year, volunteers will serve turkey with mushroom gravy, turkey stuffing, mostaccioli, green beans, yams, and cranberry sauce. Additionally, we will be baking corn bread at St. Jane to serve with the meal.

**As always, VOLUNTEERS MUST SIGN-UP at the parish office.** You can do this in person or by calling the office at (586) 977-8080 and asking to be placed on the list. St. Leo's has an age requirement. **You must be at least 16 years old** to volunteer for St. Leo's service.

If you sign-up to serve and wish to carpool, we will meet in the South parking lot at **8:15am** and form groups with volunteer drivers to carpool. We leave by 8:30am. **DRIVERS ARE NEEDED.** At St. Leo's, meals are served from 11:30am to 12:30pm with clean-up following. We will return to the St. Jane parking lot around 1:30pm.

If you are not able to go down but wish to contribute, drop off a Sweet Potato Pie or Apple Pie only. **Please, NO PUMPKIN PIES.** Food cost is constantly going up so monetary donations are also appreciated. You can help this ministry greatly by writing a check out to St. Jane's with "Soup Kitchen Ministry" in the memo line. God bless you for your help in this ministry. 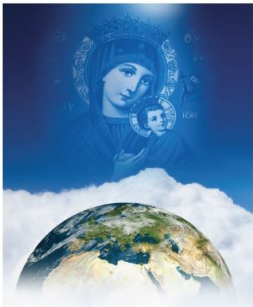

One of the tools given to us with the Faith Formation Curriculum is a Family Section entitled "Family Corner." We will begin to use and publish this resource for the community in hopes that each and every one of us will grow in faith and knowledge, boosting our understanding of self and of each other.

Look for this section below each week as we leave from Mass to Unleash the Gospel that we *just* heard back into the world!

#### **About the Gospel:**

This Sunday's Gospel is about multiplying the gifts God gives us. The best gift is the Good News of Jesus' birth, death, and resurrection. When we use our talents to spread the Good News, we give glory to God.

#### **In Church:**

Singing is praying twice. Sing the songs at Mass, using your voice to praise God.

#### **Question of the Week:**

- What talent has God given you? How can you use it to tell others about Jesus?
- What does Jesus want us to do with the talents we have?
- Which servant, in the Gospel story, is most like you? Why?

#### **Family Prayer:**

Lord, help us to discover our talents. Show us how you want us to use them.

#### **Questions to ask yourself next week, in preparation for Mass:**

- When, over the past week, did we see Jesus in someone?
- Who are the poor in your community, not just in money, but maybe in spirit or faith or happiness?
- When was the last time you really stretched yourself for someone else, that wasn't "expecting" it?

## **Family Corner**

The Church year is coming to a close (next week is almost like a Catholic "New Year's Eve" as we start a new liturgical year), and we will be celebrating the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. I remember always calling it the Feast of Christ the King, and I have been wondering why it has been lengthened to the new title. As I sit and ponder, I begin to wonder—what else have I "gotten used to" in my life (and faith life). In this ministerial position that I took on a little over a year ago, I tell students that change is healthy, natural, and actually good. It means that we are growing, hopefully for the better. Only when we grow and mature can we respond to all of the changes in our lives.

My faith life needs to begin to change as well! I have put a LOT of faith and trust in God over the past year that I might live up to some excellent examples I have been given in life and ministry. None of us are the same, none of us walk the same exact footsteps on the path of life, some of us (myself foremost) like to take the occasional detour that doesn't always save time or energy, BUT... we are ALL on that same journey! We need to look around us, and encourage everyone that is walking right near us, and be encouraged that even though sometimes we get lost in our own minds, we are not alone on the path.

I don't think I have any original thoughts. Rather, I take all the things I have heard through my years journeying, try to look at a bigger picture, hear all those stories that have been told, and retell them so someone else might be able to glean information from the same story. Here is one little bit of wisdom that I have learned:

People do not turn away from change out of fear of change itself. They relish it because it means growth, it means newness, it means dynamism in our lives. What they really fear is the transition from a current state to a new state of being. Transition can be painful, it can slow us down, and it can make us feel silly, but it is necessary to get where we need to be. I am paraphrasing thoughts and talks, and couldn't even begin to remember the 3-4 sources that I have heard this from, but I know it to be true!

Back to my personal journey - it is time to change what I do, a little bit at a time, because I dislike that transitional period as well. I am comfortable working alone behind a machine, behind a table saw, inside my own mind, doing things that I already know how to do. I need to change, transition, and grow in my life and consequently my faith life.

I hope to look around and see you walking right beside me as we begin Advent in a couple of weeks. This "coming wind" in the church is vital as we see numbers and participation wane in the greater Church and even in our own community. Have we "gotten used" to our faith life of showing up and simply doing what we do? Have we gone deeper in our faith? I'll make you a deal. Come and see those of us on staff, those of us who are in the gathering area almost every weekend. Ask us questions, push our knowledge and find answers from us about even little things, like "Why do we genuflect, to what (whom) do we direct a genuflection, or even, what is genuflect?" Challenge us so we may serve you better. Get the tools we need for our journey together and lend them unselfishly to your neighbor, but remember to show them how to use the tools. Let's see where we can, as a community, help each other through those transitions, to our new state of being, with God in His Kingdom.
