FR. T'S TIDBITS:

I recall the date November 22, 1986 as if it were yesterday. On that day, I was ordained a priest to serve the Church of Detroit. Much has taken place in the last 30 years.

In our class, there were fifteen of us who were ordained that year. Since that day, eight have left active ministry to pursue a different career. I think of them fondly and pray that they be happy in their new ventures. Three have gone home to the Lord. The remaining four of us serve the Church in various parts of the state – from Monroe to Traverse City.

As I celebrate my 31st Anniversary, I thank God for calling me to serve the Church as a priest. I thank God for you, the people of St. Jane Frances de Chantal. May we continue to call people to various ministries in the Church, whether that is to religious life, priesthood, or lay ministry. We are all called to respond to God's call.


Personally, I feel that there is no greater life than that of a priest. Certainly, there have been challenging times. However, the joys of priesthood have outweighed the challenges. I would ask that we not only pray for vocations to the priesthood, but also actively recruit vocations. In a past issue of the National Catholic Reporter (known as the NCR), Cardinal Mahony of Los Angeles said, "The priest shortage is the responsibility of us all." We are invited to call forth from our community priestly vocations to serve the needs of the people of God.

I thank God for my vocation, and my family and friends for their understanding, support, and love. I ask that you pray for me – that whatever the Church may ask of me, I would respond in faith and with courage. To my classmates and brother priests, I recall that Latin phrase, "Ad Multos Annus."

Shifting gears for a moment, as we prepare for the winter months, we also enter the cold and flu season. This raises a concern about the use of the common communion cup. Many studies have been done in regard to this issue, both pro and con. If you are aware that you have a cold or the flu, I would ask that you refrain from taking the cup at communion time. The Church has always held this as an option and not a requirement as Jesus is fully present in both forms of the Eucharist. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

BON MOT: We must encourage people to respond to God's call.

ADVENT: BE WATCHFUL, BE ALERT!

So the joke goes: *Did you hear what happened to our Thanksgiving turkey? He got run over by Santa's sleigh!*

We are all too familiar with the rush that is already upon us, the mad dash to the Christmas holidays. The Church tries to help us keep it all in perspective. As we begin the season of Advent, she gives us Scriptures that are rich in language that advises us to slow down and pay attention. *Be alert! Be watchful! Make straight His paths!*

To help us to be more alert, we are offering two opportunities for *Lectio Divina for the four weeks of Advent. We will* have an afternoon session on Mondays from 3:00pm - 4:00pm beginning on November 27th and running through Monday, December 18th. We will repeat this session on Wednesdays from 7:00pm - 8:00pm beginning on November 29th and continuing for 4 weeks through December 20th. Each of these sessions will use the Lectio Divina method to explore the Gospels for the Sundays of Advent. As we experience God's Word we will come to hear what He has in mind for us this year as we again prepare to celebrate His birth. Come, join us. Attend one, two, three, or all four sessions at whichever time and day is most convenient to you.

JUST A NOTE

Crown Him With Many Crowns---

One of the most effective and simple costume changes is to put on a hat. When you walk off stage and return wearing a top hat, you are suddenly a different person. A "man of many hats" is someone who can be a different person in different contexts or crowds. This hymn declares that we are to crown our Lord with many crowns, but this does not mean that Jesus is a "man of many hats." Christ was not simply a prophet, He was not simply the carpenter's son, and He was not simply human, nor simply divine. Rather, this call to "crown him with many crowns" is a simple and yet profound declaration that Christ is many things, and everything. He is Lord of all, to be crowned for many things that all add up to Him being Savior of the world. Each crown represents a different aspect of who Christ is – Lord of life, Lord of love, Lord of

years, Lord of heaven, the Lamb upon the throne. Christ is King, Servant, Lamb, Shepherd, and we celebrate this allencompassing, paradoxical nature of our Savior by crowning Him the Lord of all.

The original text was written by Matthew Bridges, and later revised in his second edition of *Hymns of the Heart*, published in 1851. Another text was written by Godfrey Thring, who wrote, "The greater part of this hymn was originally written at the request of the Reverend H. W. Hutton, to supply the place of some of the stanzas in Matthew Bridges' well-known hymn, of which he and others did not approve; it was afterwards thought better to rewrite the whole, so that the two hymns might be kept entirely distinct" (*Lutheran Hymnal Handbook*). Thring's original second verse is now commonly paired with Bridges' original stanzas.

About the Gospel:

Jesus reminds us that when we care for the poor, hungry, sick, tired, and lonely, we are loving him. We also remember today that Jesus is the King. If we wish to be in service to our King, we must be in service to those in need.

In Church:

As you enter and leave the pew, remember to genuflect, all the way down and touch your knee to the ground and make a deliberate sign of the cross, to honor Jesus, our King.

Questions for the Week:

How can you recognize the needs of others and help fill those needs?

What loving actions does Jesus ask us to do?

What are the Corporal Works of Mercy? Search for them on the internet (especially at www.USCCB.org). When was the last time you worked on one of these?

Family Prayer:

Jesus, help us to notice when someone is poor, sick, lonely, hungry, or in need in any way and help us to have the courage to step forward to help them.

Questions to ask yourself next week, in preparation for Mass:

Are we ready for Jesus? What , over the past week, did we do to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming to the world? Did we pay attention to others this past week? Did we treat *everyone* the way that we want to be treated?

Last week, I mentioned this weekend's feast day, the "change of name," and my wonderment at why the name changed. As I prepared for the Faith Formation sessions I really began to ponder how this "simple name change" got me to thinking.

20 years ago - even 5 years ago - I never would have imagined being where I am today. I was working in home improvement, doing almost everything involved from electrical, plumbing, drywall, drywall mudding, finishing, and painting. I can rough frame, as well as finish trim moulding, hang doors, install cabinets, etc. For each of these jobs, I can "get away with" having a limited set of tools. To make the job easier, I tended to get all the latest and greatest tools, and the job would come screeching to a halt if I forgot that well earned tool. Soon I realized that "latest and greatest" doesn't *always* mean "newest and best." A well maintained handsaw does just as good a job and is faster and easier for 2-3 pieces versus having to haul an electric Miter Saw, saw horses, worksurface, extension cords, etc. into a jobsite and out again at the end of the work day. Many of the tools that we use today use principles, techniques, understanding, and knowhow that were in place YEARS ago! They just tend to take the "thinking" out of the equation. I would never have thought I would be working in the Church again. Never would I have been a Confirmation program head, or a Director of Faith Formation, but God is calling each of us along a certain path. What does God see in me? I do not know, but it took someone (a Parish Priest– in each of my professional church experiences) to stand face to face with me and nudge me in that direction.

How does this tie into the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe? Sometimes <u>I</u> need to think. Sometimes <u>I</u> need to reflect back on why we do certain things and the things that we celebrate. Christians follow Christ. Christmas is all about Christ. Easter is about the sacrifice of you know who - Christ, the Pascal Lamb, the Passover Lamb, the Lamb who leads us, not around but through death into a new life with God. Jesus, the Christ, without whom we would die a final death, to be eternally separated from God.

Let's break this down. This feast day is a "formal celebration of the man Jesus, who we recognize as the anointed messiah, the Son of God who leads us through death into a oneness with the Almighty, the Creator, the One God for all of eternity." This fills it out a little better than "Feast of Christ the King", don't you think?
