FR. T'S TIDBITS:


This year because of the way Christmas Eve and Christmas day fall (namely Christmas Eve falls on Sunday and Christmas on Monday) the fourth week of Advent lasts but a day and a half. The Advent season is cut short which means we have to be prepared to celebrate the great Feast of Christmas.

One of the materials I use every Advent season is what has become known as the "the little blue book." The little blue book contains writings or reflections by Bishop Ken Untener. These little six minute reflections allow us to center our attention on the season of Advent in the midst of our busy life and

Christmas preparations. I would encourage you to pick up an Advent book in the gathering space and spend that six minutes a day reflecting upon the scripture verse, the reflection, and the prayer at the bottom of each page.

Also, many people have asked, "What is the meaning of Carpe Diem?" It is Latin for "seize the day." I began using the term after I saw the movie Dead Poets Society. It is a reminder for us to see God's hand in our work, our play, and our interaction with each other. As we journey through this season of Advent, may we seize each day and each moment as a gift from God knowing that He loves us and cares for us.

– 2 Peter 3:8

I had the pleasure of participating in the Monday afternoon Lectio Divina session this week. It was a wonderful time of prayerful reflection on this weekend's Gospel. It is such a familiar gospel and yet we were able to enjoy new insights due to the different viewpoints of the group. (Thank you to the group for the opportunity!) Before Lectio Divina started, I had been reflecting on the scripture above. One of the group members mentioned that verse just as we were finishing up, causing me to think about today's Gospel message and what we discussed about forgiveness in relation to the concept of God's time.


The author of 2 Peter reminds us that our time is not the same as God's time. In the midst of Advent, a time of waiting and anticipation, patience and living in the moment can become a challenge. We are inundated with "hurry up" messages like "only 15 days until Christmas!" and "don't delay, act today" or "flash sale – one day only!"

Thankfully, God gives us no such messages. God's time does not require us to act without discernment, or complete tasks within a certain time frame. God is patient with us, always waiting for us to hear and respond to God's call. We may have our entire lives to work on the things that challenge us, like forgiveness, love of others, or resisting gossip. Yet, we must be aware that God's time is not like our concept of time.

Mark's Gospel reminds us of what is written by Isaiah the prophet: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." Last week we were told to be watchful and alert as we do not know when the time will come. Putting all this together, we can't help but realize that delaying our response to God's call and ignoring our challenges may not work out. It may be prudent to think about this message in terms of "don't delay, act today."

On a personal note...thank you all so much for your warm welcome at the Masses last weekend...I truly appreciate your kindness and your obvious love of God and the community of St. Jane Frances!



Last week we were told to "Stay awake! Be ready!" (Mk 13:33). This week we come back to the *beginning* of the Gospel of Mark, where John the Baptist announces the beginning of Jesus' ministry, "a voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mk 1:3). John is the last of the prophets, calling everyone to a new testament, a new witness, a new tangible understanding of God's love for us. No longer will God speak through the prophets of old, the crazy looking people like John, "clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey." (Mk 1:6).

Our new understanding comes in the way of God *incarnate*, embodied in flesh, "The Word" who comes, so that we may not just "hear" what God tells us, but see, touch, smell and experience "(some)one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin." (Hb 4:15). A young child, boy, teenager and adult, growing up, choosing right from wrong, choosing to continue his studies, choosing to learn more and more about God, the best way that he knows how.


God gives us ample time to decide to follow Him. He calls every moment of every day, each of us, by name. Have I heard? Have I listened? Have I taken 5 minutes to be quiet and wait for the whisper of God's call?

God has given us prophets, priests, leaders, and His Son. We hear but often struggle to really listen to the former, will we take the time to listen to and experience the latter? How can we each be better listeners?

Last week, we lost a friend, a mentor, a prayer supporter and an all around wonderful woman, in Maureen Blair. She showed us Jesus in everything that she did! She battled cancer for years, doing so with grace, dignity and perseverance, finishing her calling here with us at St. Jane Frances, and getting us set on a good path. She pushed through pain with prayer, she encouraged her family and each of us in prayer, many people's lives were changed by her prayer, her life.

Jesus was present, in her life and being, in everything that she shared and passed on to all of us. Have you heard the call of John the Baptist, the call of the prophet Isaiah? Can we use the example of a God-fearing woman, like Maureen, to help us hear and better understand God's call for us? Where are each of us being asked to do God's will? How will we each challenge and stretch our comfort zones to help grow the Kingdom of God in this world?

As we get closer to the end of our preparation period, closer to that Holy Day, are we ready? What can each of us do for each other, to help prepare not just for the holiday, but for the Holy Day? Spiritually, are you set? Pray for me, and I will pray for everyone here at St. Jane, as I prepare myself for the day when Christ comes again. ~ Peace, Ben
