Here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal, we have a wonderful ministry of Hospitality: our Ushers group. Everyone who enters the worship space at weekend Mass encounters an Usher, and each person is greeted as they enter the Church with a smile and a hymnal.

Ushers are also available to help if you need assistance in any way. Maybe you're being dropped off and need assistance getting to a seat. Let us know when you walk in, and an Usher will assist you.

Need help with a hearing device? Let an Usher know when you enter the worship space, and they will get one for you.

Want to take up the Offertory gifts? Feel free to sign up ahead of time in our Offertory gift bearers book at the welcome desk—or ask an Usher!

Arrived late and want assistance finding an available seat? Ushers are particularly good at this.

Not feeling well during Mass? Ushers can assist with a wheelchair to help you exit the worship space, or bring you water or juice if your blood sugar is low. They can also contact 911 in the case of an emergency.

Unable to join the line for reception of Communion? Let an Usher know when you arrive, and they will direct a Eucharistic Minister to come to you at the appropriate time.

Our Ushers serve for the express purpose of assisting all the faithful in participating in the Mass. They are the embodiment of Jesus' words, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Please don't hesitate to ask them for help, as they are happy to be of assistance!

I began this column prior to Fr. Tony's homily a couple weeks ago, but it sure struck home when he mentioned "pushing the envelope." When was the last time

you pushed yourself and took that leap of faith—when you attempted something you weren't quite sure you could pull off?

For me, it was undertaking the 100-Hole Hike to benefit thousands of kids for Youth On Course (YOC). It works like this: you play 100 holes in one day, walking and carrying your bag along the way in hopes you'll "earn" the per-hole amounts you've asked friends, relatives, and colleagues to pledge. Despite having played tens of thousands of golf holes in my lifetime and walking four to six miles daily, it is still a stretch. Could I trek 12 to 13 miles and make hundreds of swings in an 8-hour time frame? I hate to fail at anything and never want to disappoint my supporters—but at age 65? I had to do it, to push myself for the benefit of the kids. But guess what else? In addition to asking for monetary pledges, I also asked for prayers to complete the task—and I was pleased to see so many people did just that.

For most, the question was, "Why are you doing this?" Mainly, I did it to give back. The *Detroit Free Press* held golf schools in the 60s for us inner city kids, and upon completion, my brothers and I earned the coveted pink card, which allowed us to play 9 holes daily for 25 cents at Palmer Park. Without that, my parents could never have afforded the sport. Because of golf, we learned valuable lessons about honesty, integrity, hard work, discipline, and fair play that propelled us all toward success in life.

In 2021, YOC does the same for young people today, but instead of 25 cents, it's \$5, which is what kids who join the YOC program pay to play 9 holes at hundreds of courses all over the state and country. The program has exploded in only a few years, giving so many juniors a lot of opportunities.

On Wednesday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, I teed off at 8:45am and didn't stop playing until 5:00pm, pausing only to grab some water or bites of food while passing the first tee again and again. You see, this journey of 100 holes is much like a journey of faith. It begins with one step—one hole. You have a goal, but getting there presents challenges. You have doubts, but you also have hope you've prepared properly by exercising and practicing for the 100 holes of the physical journey—

or for your spiritual journey, by praying, attending Mass, reading Scripture, and living a good life to shape your faith. It's a long road, but if you don't take that first step, your journey never begins. Truthfully, the anticipation of a grueling 100-hole trudge was far worse than the experience actually was. With six other people



out there playing, I was not alone—just as we are never alone with God at our side, always helping us out. Simply said, just "keep the faith."

Our Michigan contingent raised over \$60,000, but I was pretty pleased with the number of people who offered their best wishes, support, and especially their prayers for my own leap of faith. My body cooperated: no blisters on my hands or feet, no sprained ligaments or tendons, and no sore fingers. I must confess that the "hammer" hit two days later, when my movement was robotic and slow, and my calves were barking for mercy—however, *I did it*, and I still made it to choir practice at 7:00pm. The choir got off easy that evening!

Last week at Youth Group, one of Faith Formation & Youth Ministry the teens commented that they wished Michigan would just make up its mind—be hot or be cold. I kind of snickered and thought

to myself, I kind of like it exactly as it is.

Earlier that day, I met with a group of adults and had a discussion about the journeys of our lives and how our faith is woven into them. We even drew a timeline, complete with pictures.

In both instances, I couldn't help but reflect on how this time of year has always been so special to me. I love autumn in all its wonder. I love the transition of seasons, and this one tops them all. The fall just seems to tap into all of our senses in so many ways: the sights, the sounds, the smells, and the traditions.

In my ministry, it has been the same. I remember taking youth groups to the cider mill and having them go on blind trust walks in open areas and along the river. I remember acting out Bible stories there—and an observer almost called the police, because a group of teens was acting out the Parable of the Good Samaritan, and when they beat up the traveler, it looked a bit too real. We all chuckled as the group finished their demonstration and received a round of applause from many gathered there that day.

I have also been a firm believer in fall Confirmations for our young disciples. Fall Confirmations provide time after receiving the Sacrament and before going off to high school for the students to discover what it is they are called to do as young disciples of the new millennium—which is exactly how I view them: no greater and no lesser than all other disciples, tracing back in time even to those who walked with Jesus.

We have a job to do this and every season. Even as Walmart and other stores bombard us with Christmas decorations in mid-October, we can't look beyond what this day, what this month, what this season holds and promises.

I dug out an old, framed poem I wrote back in 1988. It was one of my early attempts at poetry. I now have over 800 poems published in seven different books. Change is inevitable, and each color of the falling leaves reminds us that we too are an ever-evolving part of God's plan. We each have to do our part to make a difference. Autumn is a cool, crisp reminder of that: a crunching, cheering, laugh-filled, joyous season of transition, both inside and out. Advent may be right around the corner, but today is our chance to take in the beauty and bask in the glory that surrounds us during this special time of year.

#### **Shades**

Falling, falling slowly in a faded shade of green; falling to the end to find what others before you have seen.

Falling, falling faster in a deepened shade of gold; such beauty is in Autumn that my mind longs to behold.

Falling to the finish in a righteous shade of red; bringing to mind the glory after His precious blood was shed.

Fallen, left to wonder what shade my final fall may bring; and to confirm in me my glory if I'm one day reborn, as in Spring.


