If you saw a child drowning in the ocean, would you drop everything to save that child? **Most would.**

If you saw someone on the street without food, without shelter, without support, would you drop everything to help that person?

What would you do?

Our response to the poor and vulnerable must be the same as our response to a drowning child.

“If we love others with charity, then first of all we are just toward them,” Pope Benedict XVI says. “**Justice is inseparable from charity**, and intrinsic to it.”

The needs of the poor must come first.

Charity meets an immediate need. I give to a food bank every Christmas. That might help someone spend Christmas with enough to eat.

But what happens after the holidays?

Catholic Social Teaching calls us to work for justice for those in need. While charity helps in the moment, **justice** for the poor addresses the root causes of poverty.

Justice asks the question, “Why?” and calls us to do something about it.

What does it mean to help the poor and vulnerable? First, we must see and understand the world through their eyes.

God sent Jesus to show us the way. Raised in poverty, Jesus affirmed the human dignity of the poor. He cared for the impoverished and oppressed. At the same time, he challenged the wealthy and powerful, calling on them to change the systems that oppressed the poor and vulnerable.

We must recognize the privilege that many of us have. That privilege insulates us from the realities of what it’s like to be poor and vulnerable. The reality of the poor and vulnerable is different than ours. We must hear the cry of the poor to understand what living in poverty is like.

We must reject bias and prejudice when we think of the poor. People do not choose or wish to live in poverty—nor do they deserve it. Despite their circumstances, they have inherent human dignity. **The poor are our neighbors.**

It is our Catholic duty to address the causes of poverty.

Pope St. John Paul II reminds us that God made us responsible to care for the other (*Evangelicum Vitae*).

Once we understand the injustices the poor face, **we must work to reform the structures and institutions that keep the poor from obtaining the resources they deserve as children of God.**

“Society has a moral obligation, including governmental action where necessary, to assure opportunity, meet basic human needs, and pursue justice in economic life” (USCCB).

Like the drowning child, **we must give our attention first to those around us who are struggling.** We need to address those systems which make their lives a struggle.

“Whatever you do to the least of these, you do to me” (Mt. 25:40).

How can I look at the world through the eyes of those living in poverty?

How can I support and advocate for laws and policies that protect the poor and vulnerable?

This October, on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis signed and promulgated his latest encyclical *Fratelli tutti* (*Brothers and Sisters all.*)

I recall with great fondness the last

time I visited Assisi. It was in 2018 with the group from St. Jane Frances de Chantal. We celebrated Mass in the church that St. Francis of Assisi built, and we later toured the town of Assisi. It was a most memorable trip.

I had the opportunity to read Pope Francis's latest encyclical, and would invite and encourage you to use it for your own reflection and meditation. It is very user-friendly and easy to read. In reading the encyclical, you might find the following insights pertinent to our society, our world, and our spiritual well-being:

That we share in a common membership in the human family and that we are created in the image and likeness of God, who is our Creator. *Fratelli tutti* reminds us that as members of the human family, we are called to be mindful that we are in fraternity with every human person.

That we are to care for those who are less fortunate than ourselves, and that we are to be neighbors to those who are frail, suffering, or cannot care for themselves. We are invited to put into practice the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Pope Francis uses the phrase, "the art of the encounter" to say that God places people in our lives for us to encounter—and through that encounter, we can learn something.

That what happens in other parts of the world does indeed have an impact upon us, whether directly or indirectly. We are called to see our mission as not limited to our own surroundings, but rather as a wider mission for the world—a global vision.

That the dignity of the human person has to be forefront in our mind and in our action. We can agree to disagree, yet still respect each other for who we are and who we can become. I am reminded of the words of St. Francis of Assisi, who said, "At all times preach the Gospel; if necessary, use words." In other words, fraternity is to be encouraged not only in words, but in our actions toward each other.

You can Google *Fratelli tutti* to find the document. I hope you enjoy the read as much as I did.

Bon mot: "It is not that the Gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better."

There's a "chat" feature on our live Masses. People don't typically use it, but on occasion, someone will say an "Amen." It's a nice, digital way of participating in Mass.

Sometimes, though, I'll see a message that says "Greetings from Texas!" or "Hello from Florida!" Although we're a parish in Sterling Heights, the beauty of putting a Mass online is that anyone can watch it, whether they're in the neighborhood or across the country. It's a great way to be reminded of the fact that we're a Catholic *community*—and that our community is bigger than our parish.

Today's first reading speaks to a sense of worldliness. Jesus reminds us to be kind to "aliens"—people from outside one's own community and borders—and reminds us that we, too, were once "aliens." We all arrived at our present circumstances—our home, our city, our parish, our country—in different ways. But we must be compassionate to everyone, as Jesus says, regardless of where any one person comes from.

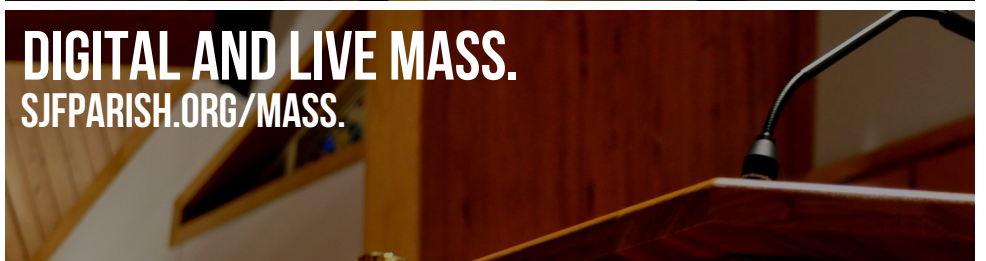
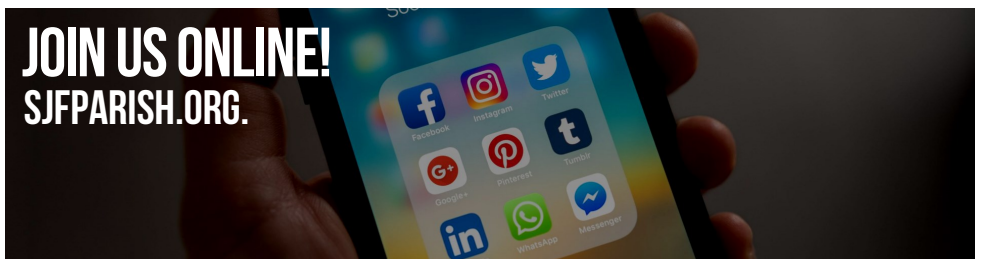
The COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted, more than anything else, the sense of community we must have with each other. To overcome this virus, we must act as a community—to wear a mask and social distance, for the good of all of us.

But the pandemic has shown us something even greater: our sense of worldliness. We are not fighting this virus alone. COVID-19 has spread worldwide, and every nation, large or small, is up against it. Although we might feel alone in our struggle—especially if we're stuck at home—we can feel better by remembering that this is not a struggle we face by ourselves.

That's why we have people from all over the country watching our live Masses. We are all more or less in the same boat, and there are many people who have chosen to participate in Mass from home. When we see people from Texas or Florida watching our live Masses, it reminds us that we face these difficulties together.

Today's first reading, then, reminds us to be kind to everyone, no matter their origin, **because we share a community**. Whether that's our parish, our Catholic community, our neighborhood, our nation, or the world, we must be kind to each other, because what one of us endures, all of us endure. As stated in the book of Matthew:

"Whatever you do to the least of these, you do to me" (Mt. 25:40).



SAINT OF THE DAY: ST. ANTÔNIO de SANT'ANNA GALVÃO

God's plan in a person's life often takes unexpected turns—turns which become life-giving through cooperation with God's grace.

Born in Guaratingueta near São Paulo, Antônio attended the Jesuit seminary in Belem, but later decided to become a Franciscan friar. Invested in 1760, he made final profession the following year and was ordained in 1762.

In São Paulo, he served as preacher, confessor, and porter. Within a few years, Antônio was appointed confessor to the Recollects of Saint Teresa, a group of nuns in that city. He and Sister Helena Maria of the Holy Spirit founded a new community of sisters under the patronage of Our Lady of the Conception of Divine Providence. Sister Helena Maria's premature death the next year left Father Antônio responsible for the new congregation, especially for building a convent and church adequate for their growing numbers.



He served as novice master for the friars in Macacu and as guardian of St. Francis Friary in São Paulo. He founded St. Clare Friary in Sorocaba. With the permission of his provincial and the bishop, Antônio spent his last days at the Recolhimento de Nossa Senhora da Luz, the convent of the sisters' congregation he had helped establish.

Antônio de Sant'Anna Galvão was beatified in Rome on October 25, 1998, and canonized in 2007.

VOTING IN THE 2020 ELECTION: THE BASICS

It is our Catholic obligation to follow the teachings of Jesus—to “do good and oppose evil”—and exercise our right to vote.

HOW DO I VOTE?

It's easy to check whether you're registered to vote! Visit mvic.sos.state.mi.us/Voter/Index and input your information to check your registration status.

Once you are registered, there are two ways to vote:

In person. Polling locations will be open from 7:00am—8:00pm. Simply stop by, get in line, and fill out your ballot once it is given to you. Out of Christian love and charity for the good of all, remember to wear a mask and practice social distancing when you visit the polls!

If you don't know your in-person polling location, you can visit mvic.sos.state.mi.us/Voter/Index to both check your voter registration status and find your polling location.

By absentee ballot. In Michigan, voters can request an absentee ballot **for any reason** at your city or county clerk's office. Once you receive it, follow the instructions included to fill out the ballot, seal it, and return it.

You can return your ballot by mail or in person at your city clerk's office.
