This weekend, the Church celebrates and reminds us that life is sacred as we celebrate Respect Life Sunday. The Catholic Church teaches and affirms that all life is sacred from the moment of conception to natural death.

Respecting life is not only part of one day that comes and goes on the calendar each year; it is a lifestyle and an attitude that we carry with us on a daily basis. It becomes a part of our being and who we are as Catholics.

As we read and hear so often in the Book of Genesis, “God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them and God said to them: Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it.” (Gen 1:27-28.)

Our attitude toward others must keep in mind that each of us is created in the Divine image of God, and so we should see others as being created in that same Divine image. There is so much anger in the world, whether it is in the form of road rage, drive-by shootings, innocent people being killed for no reason whatsoever, or people addicted to drugs or alcohol—and the list goes on.

At times it can be difficult for us to see the beauty that is around us, because the world shows us things that are contrary to the mandate to respect life from the first moment of conception to natural death. We must remember that respecting life is a daily activity; much like breathing or eating, it is important to our physical and spiritual wellbeing.

In a message to Catholics taking part in the annual Day of Life in Britain and Ireland on July 28, 2013, Pope Francis said this about the sanctity of human life:

“All life has inestimable value: even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn, and the poor are masterpieces of God’s creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect.”

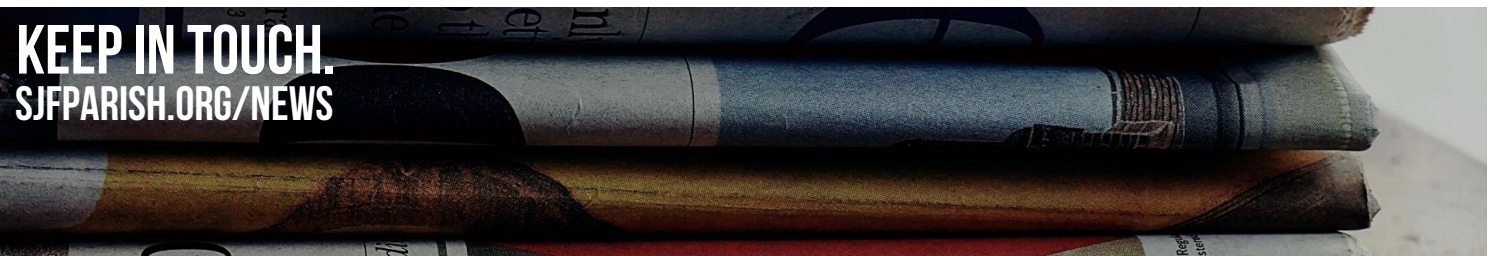
Have a wonderful week, and may you take some time out of your scheduled events to reflect upon the blessings and the beauty which God provides for each of us.

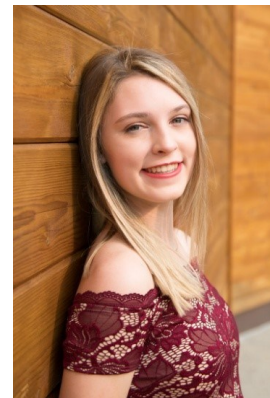

After our recent remembrance of the 20th anniversary of 9/11, I received some responses from parishioners regarding the use of patriotic music during Mass. Most

I received direction from the Worship Commission a while ago that using one song to honor our country during a national holiday weekend is appropriate. The fact that these songs appear in almost every published hymnal is also a testament to that school of thought. You may have also noticed that I do tend to sing the verses which refer to God simply to emphasize the relevance of God within that song.

Looking fundamentally at why our forefathers (and mothers) formed these United States, the root cause was religious suppression. In 1700s England, people were persecuted for simply worshipping their own faith, including Catholicism. King George III insisted that everyone must be recognized as a member of the Church of England. Obviously, there were many people who thought this was wrong and were compelled to do something about it. Is there anyone here who would want someone in power telling us that, "No, you cannot be a Catholic anymore"? Certainly not.

Personally, I am proud to live in the United States of America and to be free to worship God in peace and love as a Catholic Christian. Our national holidays give us the chance to express our gratitude for the brave people who fought and died to protect our hard-won freedoms. There is no better way to do that than to celebrate Holy Mass in prayer, praise, and song.

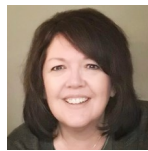

Today is Respect Life Sunday! The following is adapted from catholiccurrent.org and provides important information on the role of St. Joseph as protector of mother and child:

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for, and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support, and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage. Amen.

THE 2021 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: FUEL THE MISSION

St. Paul wrote to the Colossians, “Whatever you do, do from the heart” (Colossians 3:23).

As we face so many challenges in 2021, we are reminded of our call as missionary disciples to act out of the heart that God has formed in us. The CSA raises funds that make possible the work of the AOD, including supporting more than 100 ministries, programs, and services. This includes helping the hungry and homeless, supporting AOD parishes, priests, and seminarians, promoting the work of the Catholic schools, and so much more.

What is the CSA?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish. The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ’s command “to love one another as I have loved you” (John 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan.

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including support for men discerning God’s call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, grants to Catholic schools, and young adult programs.

Our parish goal is \$91,324.00. Once a parish reaches its individual annual goal, 100 percent of the overage is returned to the parish.

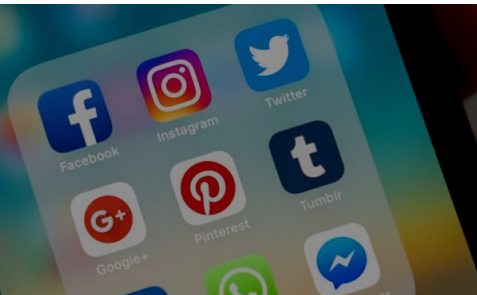

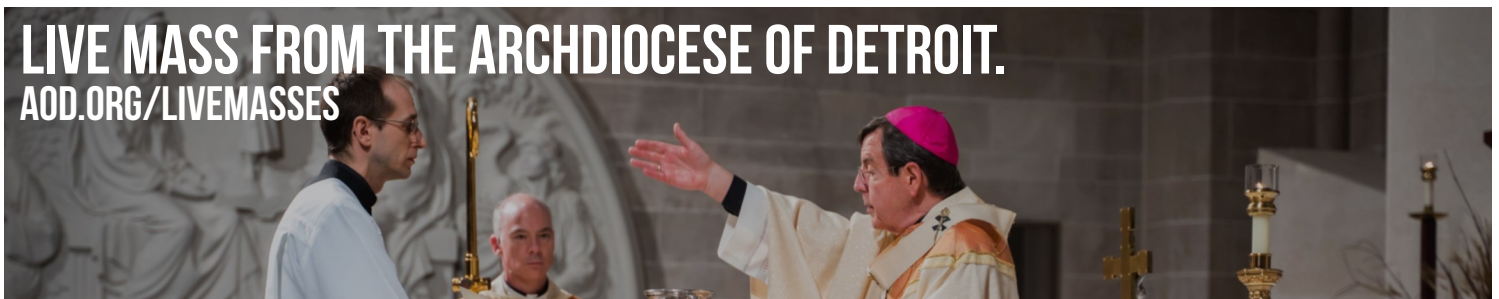
