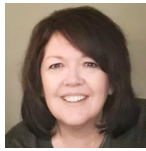

During the month of November, the Universal Church traditionally honors our dearly departed. Last Tuesday at our All Souls' Day Mass, I found the reading of the names and the single toll of the bell for each

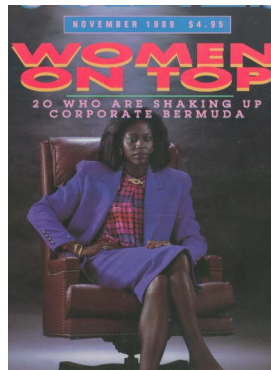
person buried from our parish especially moving. With the number of funerals I am asked to celebrate through my music ministry, you should know that I always keep a memorial card in a prayer box on the organ and personally reflect on and pray for each person.

In his article last week, Michael Novak asked some intriguing questions. I'd like to answer them. The first, "What happens after you die?" is one for the ages—everyone wishes they knew exactly what happens. Jesus says, "I have prepared a place for you," and I'm banking that this special place is one where there is total happiness, sort of like when you go on that perfect vacation and the weather is gorgeous, the water is turquoise and cerulean blue, the flowers are abundant and fragrant, the people are extremely friendly, and the food is superb. You want for nothing. There are no problems, no mean people, and you never want to go back to your daily struggles. That is heaven.

"Who is someone who has died with whom you feel a special connection?" There are many, but lately, I find myself thinking a lot about my dad Buck, my brother Michael, and my friend Madeline from Bermuda. Dad was my biggest fan and supported everything I ever did. Even though he never was one to say that aloud to me, he told everyone else. He's been gone for over 12 years, and I still feel his presence.

My oldest brother Mike died suddenly in October 2018, and his death reminds me that life can change in an instant. He was always the "life of the party," but the financial crash of 2008 sent him into a tailspin from which he never recovered. As he was a different man, nothing we did as a family could restore his unique personality. I trust that he is at peace now.

Madeline (pictured left) was a force of nature and was one of the first people I met when visiting Bermuda in 1988. We bonded quickly. She was a great golfer, a former Miss Bermuda, a prominent international businesswoman, and had been elected to Parliament. She probably would have been Prime Minister eventually, but a brain aneurysm claimed her in 1999 at age 39. Ironically, we'd had conversations about her turning 40—she joked about not liking it! I guess God had plans for her to celebrate that milestone with Him.



"If there was a blueprint on becoming a saint, what would it include?" I think we need look no further than our own St. Francis statue outside in his various outfits and accessories that change with the weather. He was a person, like us. Saints don't start out saintly; they are just people living their lives the best way they can. Sometimes, extraordinary events come along and propel one toward greatness, but I believe someone doesn't act saintly because of that—they do it because it is the right thing to do. People are inherently good, and we all have saintly qualities. We simply must try and let that side win out.
