During the day, the "tree" doesn't look like much. In fact, it appears to be rather ugly, a mishmash of a whole lot of stuff thrown together in a sort of haphazard way. Upon closer examination, it's not really a tree

after all: hanging from a hook on the patio ceiling, it is a fishing net, bound at the bottom by an old green hose. Fishing reels are attached underneath, as are large colored lights and very atypical ornaments. What kind of Christmas tree is this?

Sometimes, things are not as they seem. While this tree would never make the cover of Homes and Gardens or House Beautiful, what it stands for goes far beyond any normal Christmas tradition and has created a tradition of its own. You see, in the aftermath of Hurricane Irma in September 2017, the rebuilding of the lower Florida Keys stretched into December, the Christmas holiday season, and well beyond. People were displaced, their homes in complete disarray, while workers and contractors were practically non-existent, and materials were scarce or not available at all.


Yet, Christmas remained a magical time, even if you weren't a kid anymore. What to do when there are no evergreen trees to be had, no stores at which to shop, no ornaments, and nothing to celebrate the birth of Christ? Well, you make do. You go out and join in the rebuilding and removal efforts. You donate your time and your expertise—and even your blood—to those who were injured. While you are doing that, you find interesting items and objects in the debris fields, the trees, the mangroves, the neighbors' yards. And then your creative streak takes over, and you think, "Well, why not?"

So you separate the wheat from the chaff, wash everything, sort it out, and then begin to build a very unique and individual Christmas tree that represents everything lost and found during that awful time. It's treasure from trash, life from death, happiness from despair.

Isn't that what Christmas is all about? Jesus was sent to earth to save us. He didn't arrive in a fancy palace but in a lowly stable. He wasn't born to wealthy parents but to a simple man and his wife. He didn't have a layette or onesies; he was covered only in swaddling clothes.

When I view the Hurricane Irma Christmas tree, I don't see junk or items plucked from the refuse pile. Instead, I see something that was less than nothing but now symbolizes the human spirit, an entity so strong that it cannot be dissuaded by adversity or obstacles. Every eclectic ornament, every bulb, and each strand of beading on that tree represents triumph—and it is beautiful.

Merry Christmas to all of you, my St. Jane family, and may you find the beauty of the season no matter where you look.

BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS TREE

The use of the Christmas tree is relatively modern. Its origins are found in the medieval mystery plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, the light of the world.

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of the Epiphany.

The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.

The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

"Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever."

All reply "Amen."

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

"My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders, Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light."

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

"Listen to the words of the Letter of St. Paul to Titus (3:4-7):

But when the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life."

Or Ezekiel 17:22-24:

"I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel."

Reader: "The Word of the Lord."

All reply "Thanks be to God."

The intercessions are then said. The leader says:

"Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord."

All reply "Lord, give light to our hearts."
