As we celebrate life, may we also recall those who have walked with us throughout our journeys—those who have supported us, loved us, challenged us, and consoled us, and who, by their very being, revealed Christ to us. Life is a pilgrimage—a journey from one point to another. In reflecting upon the journey, it is amazing to see how many people have walked with us throughout our lives. Some join us for only a short period of time, and some stay until a particular situation has remedied itself; others remain for a lifetime.

To all those who are celebrating milestone anniversaries, I extend to you a simple blessing taken from the *Liturgikon*:

May the Lord, who was a guest at the wedding of Cana,
bless you and your families and friends.

May Jesus, who loved his Church to the end,
always fill your hearts with love.

May he grant that, as you believe in his resurrection,
so you may wait for him in joy and hope.

Amen.

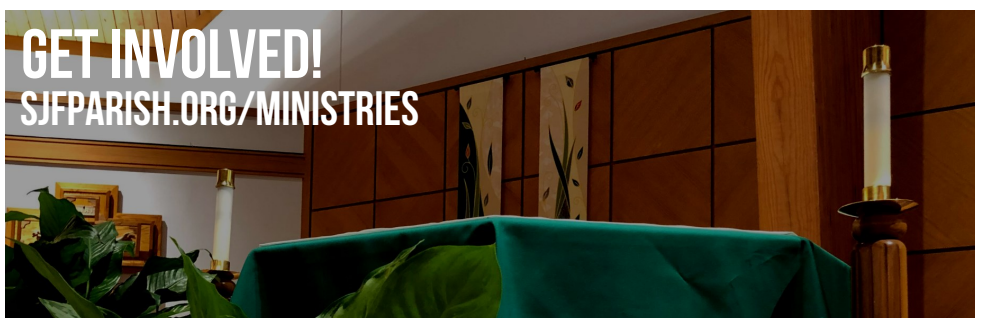

Love is in the air! Valentine’s Day is February 14th, but there are many who will celebrate the occasion all weekend, including here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

On Saturday, February 12th, couples who are celebrating a significant wedding anniversary attended the parish Anniversary Mass at 4:00pm and received a special blessing from Fr. Tony. Congratulations to all couples in attendance and to those celebrating online as well.

St. Valentine, a Catholic priest, is the patron saint of love, as well as young people, marriage, travelers, people with epilepsy, and even bee keepers! It is said God worked through him so he could teach people how to recognize and experience love. In early Rome, Emperor Claudius II outlawed weddings because he believed marriage was a distracting obstacle to young men’s commitment to fight. Despite the edict, St. Valentine continued to marry young couples in secret, even after being jailed in defiance of the law. Oddly enough, Emperor Claudius actually liked Valentine and offered to pardon the priest if he’d renounce Christ and worship Roman gods. Valentine refused and then even tried to convert the Emperor. Enraged, Claudius had him killed. However, word spread about Valentine’s devotion to faith, love, and of one final note he’d sent to a young blind girl—the jailer’s daughter—he’d been schooling in the faith. The note was signed “From your Valentine.” While today’s “Valentine” greetings may not come from such severe situations, they still radiate love and devotion from one person to another. We all need more of that.

Anyone who is married knows it is hard work. Two individuals who have lived two very different lives come together as one and share everything as they go forward. For me, it is a privilege to work with engaged couples as they plan their special day. In addition to planning their music, I also try to help them enjoy the process and not get too caught up in the stress of putting on the “perfect wedding.” It doesn’t really exist, just as a “perfect marriage” doesn’t either. Only God is perfect, and we humans must do the best we can to emulate Him. Happy Valentine’s Day!

With Deepest Sympathy: Rev. Leon Joseph Page

The community of St. Jane Frances de Chantal extends support and prayers to the family and friends of Rev. Leon Joseph Page, who passed away Saturday, January 29, 2022.



Fr. Page was the founding pastor of our parish and cared deeply for the members of our faith community. He will be missed.

Detroit Catholic has published an article about Fr. Page and his ministry as a priest serving the people of God. This article is available in full at sjfparish.org, near the bottom of the page, under "News." The following is an excerpt from detroitcatholic.com:

"Fr. Leon Page, known for the strong sense of community he fostered at his parish for many years, St. Jane Frances de Chantal, and as a devoted family man to his sister and many nieces and nephews, died January 29th.

Fr. Page, 92, was "a minister to the people, and that was his only interest: to use the gifts that he had to be advantageous to the needs of the people he was called to serve," Deacon Johnny Vanneste, who served alongside Fr. Page for many years at St. Jane Frances de Chantal, told Detroit Catholic.

Fr. Page was born July 26, 1929, in River Rouge, attended Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit on June 2, 1956. Perhaps most notably, Fr. Page became the founding pastor of St. Jane Frances de Chantal in 1977, shepherding the original 87 families first at Flynn Middle School, where the parish held Mass before the construction of the church building on Ryan Road. Fr. Page never left St. Jane Frances de Chantal until his retirement in 1999."

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let eternal light shine upon him. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

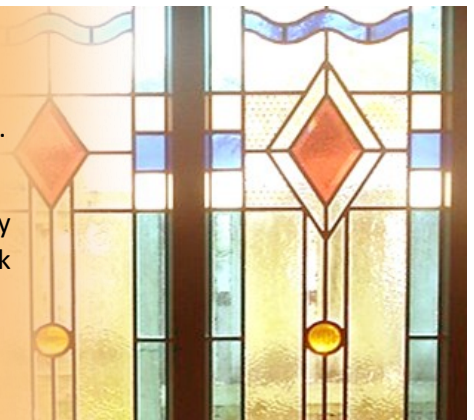
The First Sunday Monthly Memorial Forms for 2022 are now available in the Parish Office.

EXPLAINING THE GOSPEL VERSE

Have you ever had one of those days where everything seems to go wrong—at home, at school, with your family, or with your friends? When those days happen, maybe you just feel lousy.

In today's Scripture story, Jesus speaks to those of us who are having those kinds of days or who maybe just feel bad for whatever reason. He is telling us that God is with us. Jesus shows us how to invite God into our daily lives so that no matter how our day is going, we know how to listen for and follow any instructions or reminders that God is offering us. When we do that—when we receive God's help—then even our bad days have hope. And, if we're not having a bad day, we can still choose to receive God's help in the ways Jesus teaches us. When we do that, then we might better see and know how to help those who are having one of those really bad days.

ACTIVITIES

Be Loving: Use red paper, heart stickers, and crayons to make cards for your parents, family members, or friends. While you work, talk about practical ways that you can help others who are having a bad day.

The Affirmation Plate: Designate one plate as the special "affirmation" plate at dinner or at another family meal. Have it come out at random, unexpected times. Pass it around to everyone; whoever is holding it says something nice about the person next to them. This is a fun and creative way to affirm others and make their day.

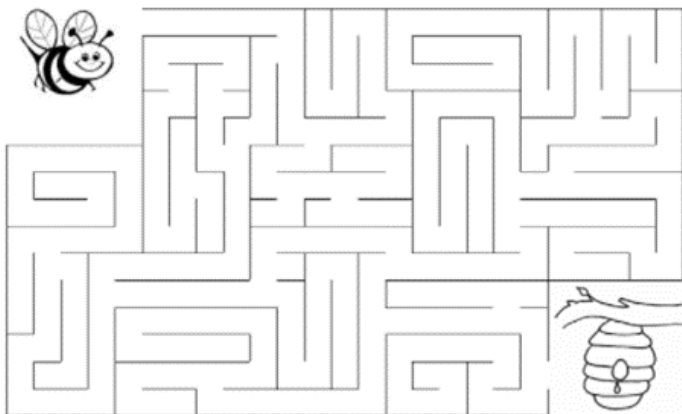
