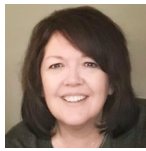

## LENT IS COMING: ASH WEDNESDAY IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Lent is right around the corner; this year, Ash Wednesday is on **March 2, 2022**. On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass at **8:00am and 6:00pm**. Video Mass will also be available online. There will be two additional opportunities to receive ashes at a Liturgy of the Word **at 12:15pm and 4:00pm** the same day.

You may recall that ashes were distributed by sprinkling last year. This year, we will return to the regular distribution of ashes. When you approach the minister, they will say, “Repent and believe in the Gospel” or “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” Ashes will then be placed on your forehead. No response is necessary.

The message of the ashes remains the same: we are creatures of the earth—“remember you are dust”—and our earthly life will pass away. But we are also baptized people on a journey to “turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.”

At the liturgy for Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes and hear Matthew’s Gospel, which explains that we are to cultivate three Lenten practices: fasting/abstinence, prayer, and almsgiving. These practices provide a structure for our penitential season. As we hear the message and receive the ashes on our foreheads, may we embark on a Lenten journey that brings us ever closer to our loving and merciful God.

## LENTEN REFLECTION BOOKS

Both the Little Black Books and two additional reflection books for the season of Lent are available in the Gathering Space this weekend.

The Little Black Book contains six-minute reflections on some of the parables of Jesus. The reflections begin on February 27<sup>th</sup> and continue through Easter Sunday.

We also have a supply of two other booklets this year: *A Time for Mending* by Joseph F. Sica and *A Season of Fresh Hope* by Alice Camille. These booklets contain daily reflections from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday. These booklets are a great resource for learning more about your faith and deepening your relationship with Jesus through prayer.

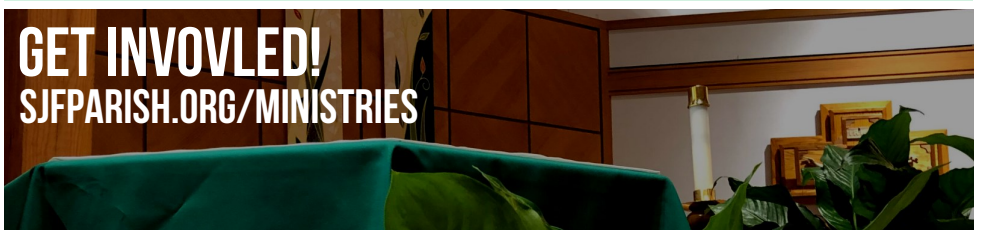
Suggested donation for each of the books is \$1.

**SERVING THE HUNGRY SOUL:  
 STEPS FOR EVANGELICAL CHARITY**

Caring for the material needs of others is central to our identity as Catholics. It is a reflection to “be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect,” as Christ told his disciples (Mt 5:48). It is also an acknowledgment of the spiritual reality that we are far poorer and in need of God’s grace than even the most desperate beggar. St. James seems to tell us that it is hypocrisy to give a poor person a blessing without seeking to assist them in their material need: “If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and in lack of daily food, and one of you say to them, ‘Go in peace, be warmed and filled,’ without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit?” (Jas 2:15-16). As concerned as we are to care for the body, we have a deeper hunger to care for the soul.

Our care for one’s material needs is not dependent on their coming under the kingship of Christ. It is not dependent on their becoming Catholic (nor is it dependent on one being grateful for what is done for them; what we give is freely given—no strings attached) for them to receive it or for us to continue to give and serve. But our service must stem from our relationship with Christ and his Church: “Every Catholic charitable work must also be an authentic expression of Catholic faith” (*Unleash the Gospel*, Marker 8.4).

We must love others how Jesus loved them. This love of Jesus is always concrete. Christian love cannot simply be a sentiment or a feeling. It has to be real and actionable. Jesus did not love us by simply considering taking on our flesh and dwelling among us. He did not love us by only *contemplating* his denial, betrayal, Passion and death.

Evangelical charity can only be effective—and effective here is the spiritual effect which God wants to work in us and in another—if we truly see Christ in the other person in need. When Jesus speaks of the judgment of the nations in the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, those who performed works of mercy are told that the one they are truly ministering to is Christ: “Truly, I say to you, as you did it to the one of the least of these by brethren, you did it to me” (Mt 25: 31-46).

Therefore, our love must be concrete. It must take the shape of caring for the material and spiritual needs of others in the circumstances they find themselves in. There is always the temptation to look for situations that are more to our liking, but this is a deeply unchristian response. Our works of charity respond to the needs of our neighbor, whatever they might demand of us. For our society, in addition to the material needs, it necessarily includes the spiritual goods of others: helping them see Jesus in us.

The Psalm for this weekend's liturgies, Psalm 103, is "The Lord is kind and merciful":  
 "Bless the Lord, O my soul,  
 and all my being bless God's name;

bless the Lord and forget not God's benefits.

God pardons all your inequities and comforts your sorrows,  
 redeems your life from destruction, and crowns you with kindness;  
 merciful, merciful and gracious is our God,  
 slow to anger, abounding in kindness.

As far as the east is from the west,  
 so far has He put his transgressions from us.

As a father has compassion on his children,  
 so the Lord has compassion on those who fear Him."

Mercy is a beautiful concept. With it, we are a kind, happy, and forgiving people. Without it, we are cold and heartless. As Christians, mercy and kindness should be an everyday part of living, because—let's face it—almost every day something happens in our lives that calls for mercy.

Yesterday someone sent me a video of a road rage incident. Normally I wouldn't bother too much with those, but for some reason I opened it and was appalled at what was caught on camera. One car literally attacked another, and the driver aggressively went after the other car, swerving on both shoulders of a busy freeway, passing commercial heavy wheelers within a whisker, and cutting off other vehicles—with no thought at all for the havoc being wrought. Suddenly, the victim's car stopped at a dangerous angle on the left shoulder, and I thought the instigator would also park there (probably in the left "fast" lane), get out, and inflict bodily harm. Unbelievably, the car sped off. Why? A police car, lights flashing, was in pursuit. The person in the car shooting the video then said, "Alright—the good guy finally wins!"

No doubt many of us have been the victim of road rage. Years ago, a car started that mean dance with me on I-696, cutting me off, speeding up, slowing down, tailgating, pulling next to me, and shaking his fist in raging madness. It was very scary, because traffic was heavy, and there was nowhere to go to get away from this crazy person. I had no idea what I could have done to him to provoke his behavior.

We've all made unintelligent moves while driving—I know I have—but they are unintended and are not done in order to aggravate or threaten anyone. They were done by mistake. Mistakes deserve forgiveness, not terrible retaliation or punishment. Unfortunately, when you do something like that, there is usually no way to make the other driver understand you are sorry or provide a "mea culpa" other than with a hand gesture or a mouthed "I'm sorry!" And sometimes, visually asking for that forgiveness might be misconstrued as being even more aggressive. It is dangerous out there!

What can you do? Be the person you want others to be. Always show mercy. Be the bigger person—and always forgive. Keep Psalm 103 close to your heart and know that God forgives you. Always.
