This Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, we will begin the season of Lent. Lent is a season during which we prepare ourselves for the Feast of Easter.

While serving as an associate pastor at Shrine of the Little Flower, I received a book titled *What Color Is Lent?* Of course, we all know that the color purple is the color

that signifies the Lenten season—and we would be correct. However, the book challenges the reader to think beyond the actual color of Lent and consider how we enter into the Lenten season. To summarize the book, Lent is what you make it. How we will enter the season of Lent is a question we have to answer for ourselves.

You might be surprised to know that most priests enjoy the season of Lent. I recall a trip I took to California to attend a board of directors meeting for the National Federation of Priests' Councils. This group began in 1968 and has been instrumental in addressing many issues regarding priestly life and ministry. I have been a member of this group for the last five years.

After the meeting each day, we had the evening free to get together and socialize. The priests that serve on the board represent priests from every part of the country. At one of our evening gatherings, the topic of Lent came up. All of us said that we enjoy the season of Lent. Certainly there are extra activities during this time, but overall it is a wonderful season. These activities prepare us to celebrate the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ.

We will hear in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday that the three disciplines for Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The important thing to note is that the Gospel does not say how we are to incorporate these disciplines into our lives. The three disciplines are open-ended and very broad, which allows us to think outside the box and gain a new perspective into the meaning of Lent. The disciplines allow us to be present in the moment. The Church allows us to choose how to implement these disciplines into our Lenten journey.

I would hope that we enter this season of Lent with a spirit of gratitude to God for the blessing and love He bestows upon us. We are called to share that love and gratitude with those that we meet on our journey. May we see these disciplines not as something we have to do, but as a way to refresh and renew our relationship with God.

I hope your Lent is a time of reflection and meditation on the life of our Lord in preparation for the great Feast of Easter. The parish of St. Jane Frances de Chantal has many prayer forms available to you so that you can enter into a deeper relationship with God and the people you meet along the way. Please refer to the postcard that was sent to your home or the church bulletin for more details.

Our readings this weekend provide a strong message about personal authenticity and the importance of avoiding hypocritical behaviors.

This message will be the center of the readings we hear next week as we enter into the Lenten season on Ash Wednesday. While it is challenging to look at our own shortcomings, people in general are quick to point out the flaws of others. The readings remind us that we must seek to be people who are merciful and loving, as God is toward us when we fall short of the ideal.

The short verses from the prophet Sirach make a clear statement that one cannot hide from their shortcomings: “The fruit of the tree shows the care it has had.” Our actions will always reveal who we are. If we are people of God, living out our call to holiness, we will bear fruit, demonstrating the care we have first received from our loving God. The Gospel is very clear on this point, as Jesus provides a parable about the need to be cared for and to learn from teachers so that we too can teach in reflection of the teacher. His reminder that we cannot be God is following by a direct approach to the problem of hypocrisy, saying, “Why do you notice the splinter in your brother’s eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?” (Luke 6:42).

It is important to remember our own flawed nature as imperfect beings just like everyone else and practice love and mercy toward family, friends, and even strangers. Social media has become a place where people feel they can express their opinion on any topic, including attacking those who think differently than they do. This is a perfect example of where we must remember ourselves as disciples of Jesus, following his teachings, not the ways of the world. In a reflection of God’s love, we examine our own behaviors and seek to work through the challenges that separate us from God. Are we bearing good fruit? When we speak of others, does our mouth speak from the “fullness of the heart”? Today is a good day to examine the wooden beam in our own eyes, reflect on God’s love and mercy, and renew our commitment to be Jesus in the world, bearing the good fruit of the Gospel to all we meet. In preparation for Ash Wednesday’s start to the season of Lent, ask yourself, “What can I do this Lent to more fully bear fruit in the world?”

## ASH WEDNESDAY IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Lent is right around the corner; this year, Ash Wednesday is on **March 2, 2022**. On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass at **8:00am and 6:00pm**. Video Mass will also be available online. There will be two additional opportunities to receive ashes at a Liturgy of the Word **at 12:15pm and 4:00pm** the same day.

You may recall that ashes were distributed by sprinkling last year. This year, we will return to the regular distribution of ashes. When you approach the minister, they will say, “Repent and believe in the Gospel” or “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” Ashes will then be placed on your forehead. No response is necessary.

The message of the ashes remains the same: we are creatures of the earth, and our earthly life will pass away. But we are also baptized people on a journey to “turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.”

At the liturgy for Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes and hear Matthew’s Gospel, which explains that we are to cultivate three Lenten practices: fasting/abstinence, prayer, and almsgiving. These practices provide a structure for our penitential season. As we hear the message and receive the ashes on our foreheads, may we embark on a Lenten journey that brings us ever closer to our loving and merciful God.

Considering the month of February’s traditional designation as Black History Month, I didn’t want the time to go by without acknowledging the importance of

spiritual gospel-inspired music in liturgy and to highlight a couple of Black female composers whose music we sing here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

One popular song *The Lord is My Light* is by Lillian Bouknight. There aren’t very many African-American female composers, and little is known about Bouknight. She was born February 15, 1902 and died at 88 years of age on July 9, 1990. Bouknight lived in the hills of Aliquippa, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, taught school, and was a soloist, composer, and a “prayer warrior.” She was well thought of by her students—especially by one in particular named Ruth, who said, “I was in her Sunday School class and didn’t want to leave. She was super—and she could sing!”

The song is taken from Psalm 27: “The Lord is my light and my salvation. Whom should I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life. Whom should I fear? In the time of trouble, He shall hide me. Wait for the Lord and be of good courage; He shall strengthen thine heart.”

Another song we sing fairly frequently is *Lead Me, Guide Me*, also written by an African-American woman, Doris M. Akers. Doris Mae Akers, one of ten children, was born May 21, 1923 in Brookfield, Missouri. She and her brothers and sisters formed a group called “Dot and the Swingsters.” She then created the Simmons-Atkins trio in 1948.



In the 60s and 70s, Akers found her calling in gospel music for church. She sang and recorded her many compositions, which led to her nickname, “Miss Gospel Music.” In 1990, she became a minister of music at a church in Minneapolis, MN and in 1992 was honored as the “foremost Black gospel songwriter in the US” by the Smithsonian Institute. She died in 1995 and was inducted posthumously into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame as well as the Southern Gospel Hall of Fame. Her songs were recorded by such notable artists as Mahalia Jackson and Elvis Presley, whose love for gospel and spiritual music was well-known. Akers’ melodies and lyrics are both memorable and inspirational.

*Lead Me, Guide Me* is especially fitting for Lent in that it represents the true path God wants us to walk—with Him:

“Lead me, guide me along the way, for if You lead me, I cannot stray. Lord, let me walk each day with thee. Lead me, O Lord, lead me. I am weak and I need Thy strength and power to help me over my weakest hour. Help me through the darkness Thy face to see. Lead me, O Lord, lead me! Help me tread in the paths of righteousness; be my aid when Satan and sin oppress. I am putting all my trust in Thee. Lead me, O Lord, lead me! I am lost if You take Your hand from me; I am blind without Thy Light to see; Lord, just always let me Thy servant be. Lead me, O Lord, lead me!”

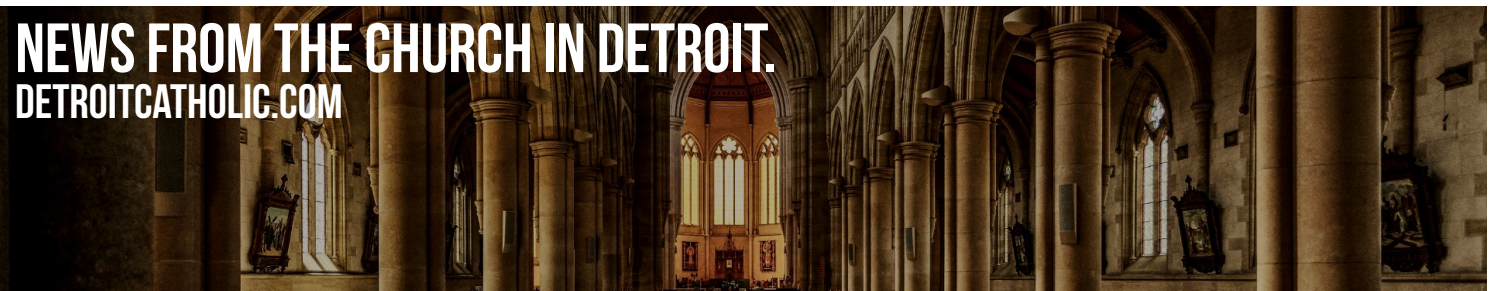
