Every year on February 11th, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the Universal Church celebrates the World Day of the Sick. This is a day in which we remember those individuals in our lives who are ill.

Praying for the sick is one of the seven corporal works of mercy. Praying for those who are ill reminds us that we belong to a community; on World Day of the Sick, we continue to lift up those in our community who are in need of prayer.

As it is important to pray for those who are ill, it is also important to pray for those who are caregivers. At some point in our lives, each of us will become a caregiver for a loved one—if we have not already been a caregiver for a spouse or friend.

Those who have been caregivers will tell you that it can sometimes become very taxing and exhausting to care for a loved one who is terminally ill. I recall when my mother was undergoing chemotherapy; my siblings and I would share the responsibility of taking our mother to her doctor’s appointments. This sometimes meant that we had to rearrange our schedules to take her to her various appointments. Sometimes that was easier said than done, but it all worked out in the end.

After my mother’s death, my siblings and I would talk to each other about those appointments. Even though some were challenging at times, those three years were graced-filled—and God gave us the strength when we needed it the most.

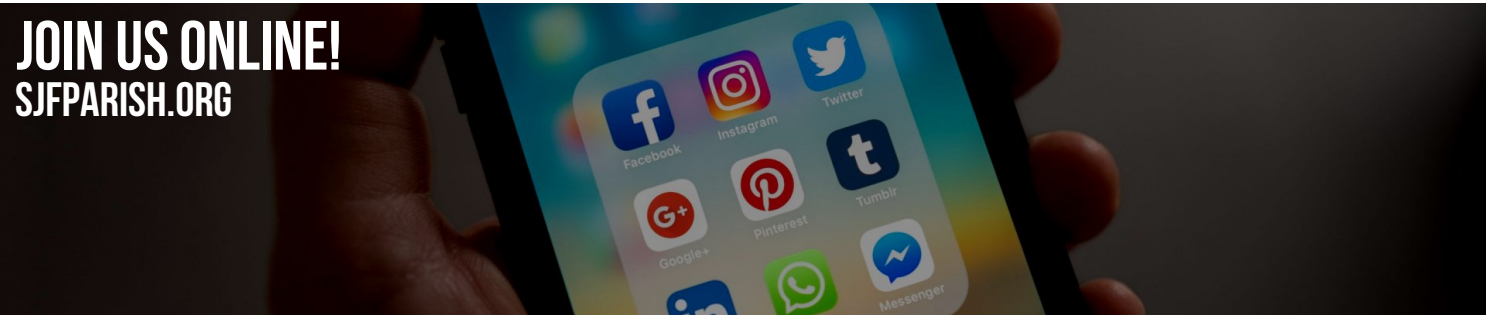
When we celebrate the World Day of the Sick, let us be mindful and lift up in our prayers not only the infirmed but also those who care for them. I share with you a prayer I recite every day: “Oh Lord, I lift up in prayer all those people who are most in need of your attention today.” This prayer is a reminder to me that others are more in need of God’s attention than I am.

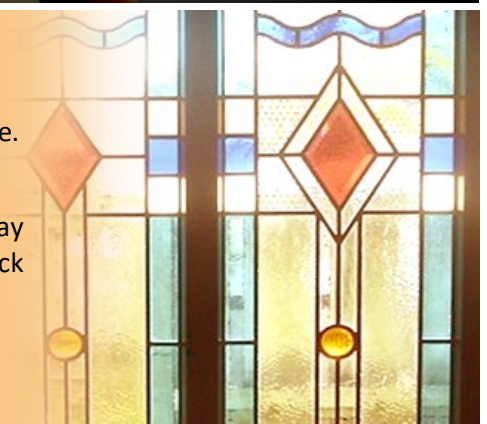
The First Sunday Monthly Memorial Forms for 2022 are now available in the Parish Office.

The Old Testament Scriptures contain accounts of men called into God's service as prophets. Each prophetic book is theologically significant in salvation history.

Today's first reading is from the great prophet Isaiah and speaks of the sinfulness of humanity. Understanding the events of Chapter 6, heard today, begins with reading the vision Isaiah receives as recorded in the first chapter.

Chapter 1 of the Book of Isaiah details the sins of the people of Judah and Jerusalem and the judgment that God will bring upon them. Isaiah's call, found in Chapter 6, follows that vision and begins the narrative with the theme of divine judgment and restoration found in the following chapters of the book. The book of Isaiah recounts the fall of Judah and the Exile into Babylon, but, as in the call to Isaiah, the suffering of the Israelites has purpose and will not be in vain; God will provide new growth, holy growth, from the destruction.

Today's reading encapsulates Isaiah's overall theme of suffering for redemption, beginning with Isaiah seeing "the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty" (Isaiah 6:1) and realizing that he is not worthy to be in God's presence as "I am a man of unclean lips" (Isaiah 6:5). In a parallel of the judgment, suffering, and redemption of the whole of the Book of Isaiah, one of the "seraphs" takes a "live coal" and touches Isaiah's mouth (Isaiah 6:6-7). In this experience we see Isaiah's suffering from his lips being burnt and the seraph's statement that "now your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out" (Isaiah 6:7). So too will all of Judah be judged, punished with suffering, and ultimately restored to a state of holiness.

Today's reading and the book of Isaiah convey that God is a merciful God, and that while God would judge the people of Judah to be prideful and unwilling to recognize their dependence on God, he will still honor his promises to them by purifying them and giving them a "new heavens and a new earth" (Isaiah 65:17).

The Book of Isaiah is rich in imagery and plays a major role in the presentation of the life of Jesus in the New Testament Gospels. Jesus comes to bring forgiveness of sins and salvation to all of humanity. You may consider spending some time with the Book of Isaiah to better understand the importance of today's reading and its connection to the Gospel reading when we hear Simon Peter's echo of Isaiah: "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

At times, we can feel like Isaiah and Simon Peter—that we are sinful and not worthy of God's love. God's word, sacred Scripture, tells us that God's love is always present to us and, as Jesus tells Simon Peter, that there is no need to be afraid. However, there are times when our sinfulness causes us to feel distanced from God; for this, we need purification to live in love of God.

The sacrament of Reconciliation is the gift given by Jesus to help us to be forgiven, as Isaiah was, and to be renewed to answer God's call to bring his mission into the world. The sacrament of Reconciliation is available here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal every Tuesday evening from 5:30pm—6:30pm.

While today's first reading can seem harsh, it gives us a clear picture of the love and mercy of God. It ends on such a hopeful note with Isaiah's understanding of that love and his desire to go out and serve God. May we always feel God's love and mercy and answer God's call with, "Here I am," I said, "send me!"

FEBRUARY IS NATIONAL HEART MONTH: MAKE HEART HEALTH PART OF YOUR SELF-CARE ROUTINE

Devoting a little time every day to caring for yourself can go a long way toward protecting the health of your heart. Simple self-care, such as taking a moment to de-stress, giving yourself time to move more, preparing healthier meals, and not cheating on sleep can all benefit your heart.

That's a good thing, because heart disease is largely preventable—and focusing on improving your heart health has never been more important. Heart disease is a leading cause of death for women and men in the United States, and many Americans remain at risk of getting it, according to the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI). People with poor cardiovascular health are also at increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19.

“Studies show self-care routines, such as taking a daily walk and keeping doctor's appointments, help us keep our blood pressure in the healthy range and reduce our risk of heart disease and stroke,” said David Goff, M.D., NHLBI's director of cardiovascular sciences.

It may be easier than you think to “put your heart” into your daily routine. Each Sunday, look at your week's schedule and carve out 30 minutes daily for heart-healthy practices. Take an online yoga class, prepare a heart-healthy recipe, schedule your bedtime to get at least seven hours of sleep, or make a medication checklist. Then seek out support from others, even if it's online or via a phone call, to help you stick to your goals.

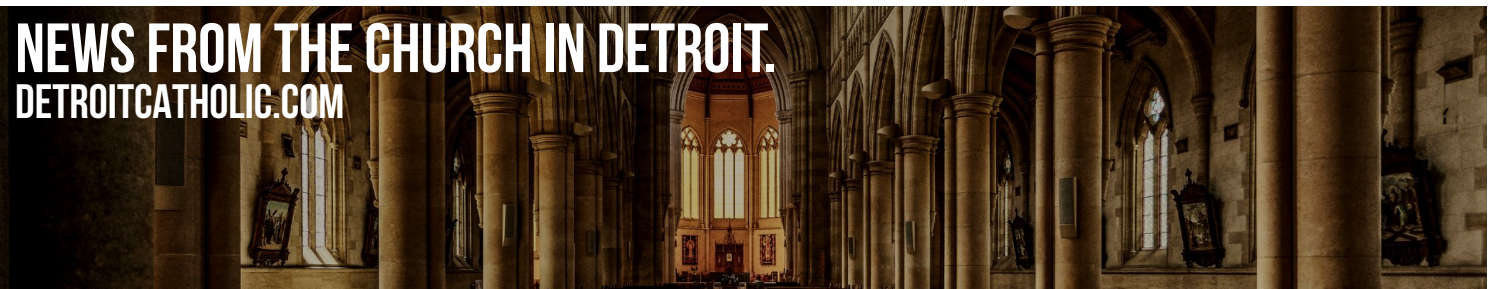

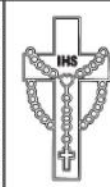
