I remember how much I disliked the season of Lent as a child. We would go to Church on Ash Wednesday, and for the next forty days, we would hear the same song. The song, *These Forty Days of Lent*,

set in my mind a constant reminder of how long the Lenten season is, and of the disciplines that we are to implement into our spiritual journey. I am not making light of the season of Lent. How we perceive it will determine the outcome.

If we perceive Lent as a time when we have to give up this or that, then Lent is seen as something to "get through." Then the song, *These Forty Days of Lent*, becomes a dirge or a funeral march. But if we perceive Lent as a time to step back and reflect upon our life's journey, then that same song takes on a totally different meaning.

The Church, as well as the calendar, informs us that the forty days of Lent draw us to the Great Feast of Easter. Easter will come whether we have prepared for it or not. The season of Lent should allow us time to prepare for the Risen Christ.

Let us use this time for self-reflection, self-discovery, and renewal within ourselves and in those whom we come in contact with. Many people have walked with us on life's journey; let us pause to thank God for placing them in our life, just as He places us in the lives of others. As I have always said, God has a plan for us. It is not for us to understand what that plan is; our role as Catholics is to accept His plan.

I recently read the book titled *On Heaven and Earth*, co-authored by Jorge Mario Bergoglio (Pope Francis) and Abraham Skorka. The book addresses issues of faith, family, prayer, and the Church in the twenty-first century. I would recommend it for one's spiritual reading during Lent. The essence of this book can be summarized by a quote from Pope Francis. He says, "God makes Himself felt in the hearts of each person. He also respects the culture of all people. God is open to all people. He calls everyone. He moves everyone to seek Him and to discover Him through creation."

May Mary's response to the angel Gabriel become our humble prayer: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38).

Bon mot: "He who runs from God in the morning will scarcely find Him the rest of the day." —John Bunyan on prayer.

Temptation, temptation. What more need be said about Lent, about life, about humanity? Each day brings more and more temptation. Let's see what I can get away with today... I can have one more [fill in the blank]... Oh, that can wait until tomorrow. Boy oh boy, am I the biggest perpetrator of that last one—I'm easily distracted and easily led away from tasks that I "should be" working on.

The key to Lent is remembering this simple thing: Lent was put in place to prepare us (oh, that whole number "40" thing in the Bible as a number of preparation) for Easter, but not just Easter 2020; not just the single day or the single season. We are an Easter people! We live our lives in the Good News that Jesus was born, He lived among us, He ministered to humanity (in person), He was tortured, suffered and died. The End... Wait, NO! He rose again and He defeated death! Those first sentient beings brought death into the world, and Jesus conquered it! After this, He made final preparations for those who would minister in His name (another one of those 40 day things) before ascending into heaven.

Lent prepares us not for the "day" or the "season" of Easter. It is meant to prepare us for our LIFE—our life in Christ and our life spreading the message of Christ to the world! Each of us does this in very distinct ways. Fr. Tony is called to be an ordained minister in the Church. As you can tell, many people do not answer that call (we are woefully short on those in the religious life!)—or is it that they do not listen for God's call because it doesn't fit into "their" plan? (Sorry, another babble for another day!) Some people are called to ministry in many different forms, but ALL of us are called to full, conscious and active participation in the Church's mission. At Liturgy, at school, at work, at home, in public, and in private, we are called to participate and form ourselves in holiness.

If it were easy, then we wouldn't need the Church to help us resist temptation (remember—the Church isn't just a building or an institution, but is ALL of us working together). This Lent, don't just "give up" something that you'll start doing again after Easter. Make a difference in your life that brings you closer to God. Build up your body, soul and mind, so that when you are tempted by the world, you can respond that you know the reason why the temptation is wrong and why it will fail. Use your newfound strengths to help your neighbor who might be just learning, and give them a hand so that they know who they can count on.

In your Lenten preparations this year, please remember to pray especially for our young disciples who are in their Sacramental preparations for this year and next! We'll see you on that rocky path of life. Pray for strength, pray for peace, pray for each other, and pray for [fill in the blank].

From the Letter of James 5:13: "Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise!"
