I remember how much I disliked the season of Lent as a child. We would go to Church on Ash Wednesday, and for the next forty days, we would hear the same song.

The song, *These Forty Days of Lent*, was a constant reminder of how long the Lenten season is, and of the disciplines we are to implement into our spiritual journeys as the season progresses. I am not making light of the season of Lent; how we perceive this season will determine its outcome.

If we perceive Lent as a time when we have to give up this or that, then Lent is seen as something to “get through.” Then the song *These Forty Days of Lent* becomes a dirge or a funeral march. But if we perceive Lent as a time to step back and reflect upon the journey of life, then that same song takes on a totally different meaning.

The Church, as well as the calendar, informs us that the forty days of Lent draw us toward the Great Feast of Easter. Easter will come whether we have prepared for it or not, and the season of Lent should allow us time to prepare for the Risen Christ. Let us use this season for self-reflection, self-discovery, and renewal within ourselves and those we come in contact with.

Many people have walked with us on the journey of life. Let us pause to thank God for placing those people in our lives, just as He places us in the lives of others. As I have always said, God has a plan for us. It is not for us to understand what that plan is. Our role as Catholics is to accept His plan.

I recently read the book *On Heaven and Earth*, co-authored by Jorge Mario Bergoglio (Pope Francis) and Abraham Skorka. The book addresses issues of faith, family, prayer, and the Church in the 21st century. I would recommend it for one’s spiritual reading during Lent.

The essence of this book can be summarized by a quote from Pope Francis. He says, “God makes Himself felt in the hearts of each person. He also respects the culture of all people. God is open to all people. He calls everyone. He moves everyone to seek Him and to discover Him through creation.”

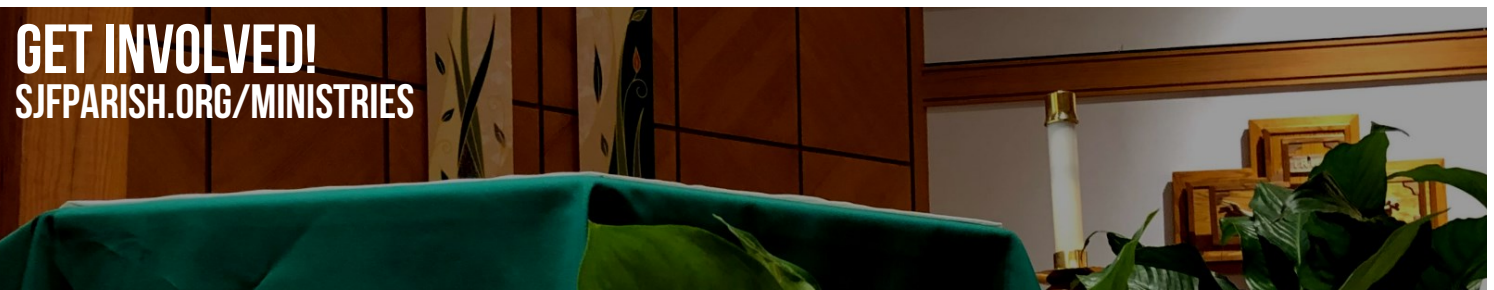
May Mary’s response to the angel Gabriel become our humble prayer: “I am a servant of the Lord; let it be done unto me as you will.”

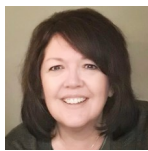

This Lent, we continue on our journey to holiness to live life as a reflection of the love and teachings of Jesus Christ, made possible by the grace given us in the Sacraments.

Our review of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist) continues this week with the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The relationship that God began with us in the Sacrament of Baptism is strengthened in Confirmation. The sacrament of Confirmation strengthens and seals one's faith with the gifts of the Holy Spirit that make following our call to holiness possible. Just like in Baptism, in Confirmation, the soul is impressed with a seal—or character—that is indelible, which is why this Sacrament is conferred only once. Confirmation strengthens us to be greater witnesses to Christ by word and action, fulfilling our mission to spread the gospel and defend the faith (CCC 1285).

Like all the Sacraments, Confirmation was instituted by Christ. This Sacrament was prefigured in the Old Testament with the anointing with oil of priests, prophets, and kings. When King David was anointed by Samuel, the Spirit of the Lord came upon him (1 Samuel 16:13). The great prophet Isaiah proclaimed that "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; He has sent me to bring good news to the afflicted..." (Isiah 61:1).

In the New Testament, Jesus quotes Isaiah as he begins his public ministry, identifying that the Scripture is fulfilled in him and that he is the anointed one, the awaited Messiah, the Good News. Before the resurrected Jesus returns to the Father, he promises to send his people the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-5, 8). This promise is for the power that the Apostles themselves did not possess: the power to be witnesses to the Gospel.

The Apostles received the gifts of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost (the Jewish celebration of the Mosaic Covenant) as is retold in Acts 2:1-31. The gift or grace of Pentecost is perpetuated and made present in the Sacrament of Confirmation. As a result, we can do what Jesus told the Apostles to do—spread and defend the faith. When we receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, we join in the mission of Christ.

The matter of the Sacrament of Confirmation is both the imposition of hands and the anointing with chrism oil. The form is the words, "[Name], be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Ordinarily, the minister of Confirmation is a bishop. If there is imminent danger of death, a priest is the extraordinary minister. Also, at the Easter Vigil, when adults are brought into the Church, the priest is the extraordinary minister.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is conferred upon adults immediately following Baptism and prior to receiving Eucharist. Young people are generally confirmed around eighth grade as they mature and grow in faith. For anyone who has not just received the sacrament of Baptism, to be properly disposed and prepare for Confirmation, they must first receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION WITH RECITATION OF DIVINE PRAISES

Come spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament! Please join us in the chapel **on Tuesday, March 22nd, anytime from 1:00pm until 6:30pm** for Eucharistic Adoration, ending with recitation of the Divine Praises at 6:30pm.



The effects of the Sacrament of Confirmation are that the recipient experiences a “personal Pentecost”—a giving of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel (or right judgement), fortitude (or courage), knowledge, piety (or reverence), and fear of the Lord (or respect for the Lord).

The fruits of the Holy Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control. These fruits come from our cooperation with the Holy Spirit, using the gifts we are given in Baptism and that are strengthened in Confirmation to live a life in Christ.

In our mission to evangelize the world, Confirmation strengthens us and provides us with gifts we would not otherwise have in order to both spread the faith in the world and to defend the faith of the Church in Christ. With the great gifts of the Holy Spirit, we are prepared to follow our call to holiness, living out our lives as members of the body of Christ, a reflection of Christ in the world.

This Lenten season (and into Easter), as we explore the seven Sacraments, we hope that you will come to a deeper understanding of and appreciation for the way God speaks to us through the Sacraments and the great grace they impart. Next week, we will explore the Sacrament of the Eucharist!

St. Joseph is the favorite saint of many of us who seem to have an affinity for unsung heroes. His feast day was Saturday, March 19th, and for his Mass this year, the Entrance

Antiphon is from Luke 12:42: "Behold, a faithful and prudent steward, whom the Lord set over His household." The closing Antiphon is from Matthew 25:21: "Well done, good and faithful servant. Come share your Master's joy." Think about it: here is this kind and hardworking man who happens to fall in love with the young woman who, unbeknownst to him, will bear the Savior of the world. He endures criticism from those who insist he should quietly divorce Mary for her so-called "sins" and also from those who call for the harshest punishment for her "infidelity." Fortunately, an angel brings some wise and faith-filled counsel. Through it all, Joseph remained steadfast to his calling.

While not much is known about Joseph in his later years, we still respect all he did to raise Jesus along the right path—even if he didn't know exactly where it would lead. Last year, I shared a special song written in honor of St. Joseph, and I will do so again. The words were written by Michael Gannon in 1966 and can be sung to the tune of *The Church's One Foundation*:

Look down to us St. Joseph, protector of our Lord,
who followed you through deserts and gave you blessed rewards.
Our foes are yet about us; be strength now at our side.
Be light against the darkness; St. Joseph, be our guide!
We venerate your justice; the Gospels praise your name.
You are the saint all humble who gained eternal fame.
In your devoted family, our souls in trust confide.
Direct our way to heaven; St. Joseph, be our guide.

St. Joseph's Day is an important holiday celebrated all throughout Italy. As with anything Italian, there is food involved. Because the holiday falls during Lent, meat is generally not eaten on the feast day, and certainly not on Friday. Foods containing breadcrumbs, or the "poor man's parmigiano," are prepared. Perhaps you may enjoy making this simple pasta dish, Pasta di San Giuseppe, which is pasta with breadcrumbs, symbolizing the sawdust created from St. Joseph's carpentry work:

Sauce: Sautee 2 tbsp olive oil with 5 chopped garlic cloves and a pinch of red pepper flakes. Add 2 cups chopped fresh fennel, 2 cups crushed tomatoes, 2 tbsp tomato paste, and 1 tbsp chopped fresh basil. Cover and let simmer 30 minutes until fennel is tender. Add 4 small cans of drained, skinless, boneless sardines (or substitute another fish) and simmer a few more minutes.

To Serve: Cook and drain 1 lb. of pasta. Heat 1 tbsp olive oil, adding 1 cup fine Italian-style breadcrumbs and heat until golden brown. Pour sauce over the pasta, then sprinkle with the breadcrumbs.

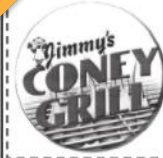
