We are drawing closer to that time of the year when the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) will be kicking off throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit (AoD). On the weekend of Saturday, April 30 $^{\rm th}$, and Sunday, May 1 $^{\rm st}$, I will be speaking at all of the weekend liturgies and asking for your support for the CSA so that we might reach our target goal.

The 2016 target goal assigned for us by the AoD is \$90,176. This is a *decrease* of \$2,975 from last year's target goal of \$93,151. We did make our CSA goal for 2015 and, with your generous assistance, hope to once again achieve the number that has been allocated for our parish.

Through the CSA we share Christ's message by serving large numbers of people in ways we may not even realize. The Offices of Stewardship, Evangelization, Catechesis and Parish Life also receive subsidies through the CSA. Our gifts through the CSA also support the Office of Priestly Vocations and Sacred Heart Major Seminary. As you are perhaps aware, the first parishioner ever from St. Jane Frances de Chantal to be ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit's Dominic Macioce. 

WE GIVE THANKS FOR GOD'S BLESSINGS

The best way to respond to God's loving generosity is by reflecting that generosity day by day. The stewardship question is not, "Should I do these things?: but rather, "How much should I do?"
