PENTECOST & THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT

WISDOM: With the gift of Wisdom, we see God at work in our lives and in the world. We are directed In matters of judgment about the truth and being able to see the whole image of God. Helps us to understand the purpose of God's plan for us and for the world and to see the world through God's eyes.

UNDERSTANDING: With the gift of understanding, we comprehend how we need to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with understanding is not confused by all the conflicting messages in our culture about the right way to live. This gift helps us to learn about ourselves and how to grow in knowing God. Understanding clears away obstacles to true faith.

KNOWLEDGE: With the gift of knowledge, we understand the meaning of God's Revelation, especially as expressed in the life and words of Jesus Christ. A person with knowledge is always learning more about the scriptures and tradition. This gift enables us to judge what must be believed and what must not be believed.

FORTITUDE: With the gift of courage, we overcome our fear and are willing to take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with courage is willing to stand up for what is right in the sight of God, even if it means accepting rejection, verbal abuse, or even physical harm and death. The gift of courage allows people the firmness of mind that is required to do good and stand up to evil and especially to stand up for Jesus and his teaching.

COUNSEL: With the gift of right judgment, we know the difference between right and wrong, and we choose to do what is right – we make better moral decisions. The Holy Spirit points us to the most important considerations as we make decisions in life, always choosing good as a means to an end.

PIETY: With the gift of reverence we have a deep sense of respect for God and the church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before God with humility, trust, and love. In piety we pay worship and duty to God as our Father and HAVE immense trust in God's fatherly love.

FEAR OF THE LORD: With the gift of wonder and awe we are aware of the glory and majesty of God and the grateful wonder of His love for us. This fear of the Lord is like a child's fear of offending his father, rather than a fear of punishment. The worst thing that could happen to us is separation from the God that we love.

Jerry-atrics Fr. Jerry Slowinski ext. 102 Pastor On Saturday, May 14th, at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit, Dominic Macioce, Paul William Graney, Kevin Joseph Roelant, David Mark Tomaszycki and Timothy Joseph Wezer were ordained priests of the Archdiocese of Detroit. Through the laying on of hands and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, Archbishop Allen Vigneron elevated these men to the order of presbyter for service to the People of God in this Archdiocese.

The lives of these five men have changed dramatically. During the praying of the Litany of the Saints, these five men, as a sign of their willingness to serve, lay prostrate on the floor of the Cathedral. They did not lay on the floor of the Cathedral because the floor is comfortable or because they sought to rest. They did not make promises to the Archbishop, and his successors, because they were looking to gain anything in return. They did all this because they felt called by God to serve. It is God's will. God's choice. God's gift, which led them to enter into intense study and formation for the priesthood. It is God's gift that these men were found worthy to answer the call. And we rejoice in that call and the willingness of these men to answer to it.

The world needs priests. The world needs witnesses who are willing to demonstrate their desire to serve the Lord and members of the Body of Christ. To be Christ's witness is not easy. St. Paul reminds us that Christ died for all, so that all who live might live no longer for themselves but for Christ. Christ teaches us how to love; His cross is the greatest example of love the world has ever known.

While these five men have taken on a new challenge by virtue of their ordination, each and every one of us is also called to take on a role which is filled with challenges. By virtue of our baptism, we are called to love as Christ does. To seek the good for others, even at a cost to our very self. The world though oftentimes rejects this type of love – a love that is not self serving; a love which makes demands upon us. The world does not always understand the love of Christ just as it oftentimes does not understand the call to serve as a priest. That a man would give his life away, and forsake physical intimacy and the possibility of a family, confuses the world. The reality though is that we receive so much more than we give. The Cross teaches us that too, that it is in giving our lives away freely, we are ultimately made free. The world desperately needs this type of witness of love, of people willing to lay down their lives so that others might have life and have life to the fullest. This is why these five men have freely chosen to answer God's call to serve. In the years to come, they will be called, sometimes in the middle of a cold night, when they are tired and on the verge of exhaustion, to go to a person who is on their deathbed and offer words of comfort, forgiveness and peace. They will be privileged to be present at key moments in the lives of so many people – at Baptisms, First Communions, weddings and funerals. They will seek to mend broken relationships, to forgive those seeking to be reconciled to God. It is nothing short of remarkable that God chooses mere mortals with such an awesome responsibility.

We are grateful that St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish was able to play some role in Fr. Macioce's call to the priesthood. We are honored that he is here with us this weekend to offer his first Mass as a priest on the Feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. We ask God to guide and watch over Fr. Dominic Macioce, helping him to persevere in fidelity, love and service in the years ahead which we pray will be many and blessed.
