I would like to share with you these words of announcement and invitation as the Church of Detroit celebrates with great joy:

“With praise and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Archdiocese of Detroit joyfully announces the Ordination to the Priesthood of Jesus Christ of these

chosen men through the laying of hands and the invocation of the Holy Spirit by His Excellency, the Most Reverend Allen Vigneron.”

On May 15, 2021, Archbishop Allen Vigneron will ordain three priests to serve within the Archdiocese of Detroit. These men will serve as associate pastors in parishes within the Archdiocese. Those to be ordained are Fr. John Eugene Dudek, Fr. Robert Joseph Voiland, and Fr. Zaid Badros Chaban. I ask that you remember these newly-ordained priests in your prayers as they begin their ministry as priests to the people of God.

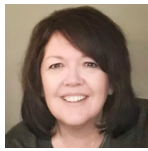

May is the Month of Mary! As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints—and indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace, she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam, she is one with all those who are to be saved. (*Lumen Gentium*, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and [...] all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.

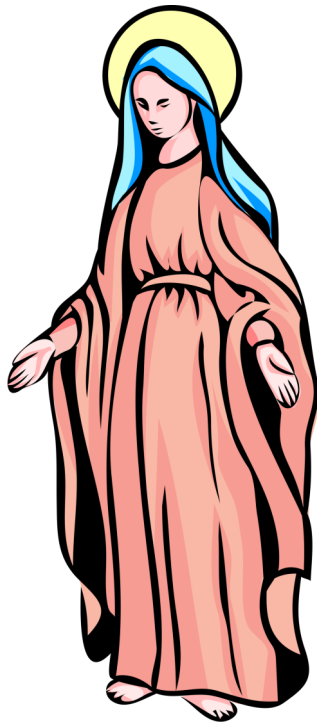

## THREE KEY WAYS TO LEAN ON THE HOLY SPIRIT IN YOUR FAITH JOURNEY

Our faith is tested every day. Whether in big, traffic-stopping ways or small, conscience-pestering ways, we are faced with opportunities every single day to either lean into the Holy Spirit or lean away from Christ. Each of us, of course, knows the choice we *want* to make, but we also know that sometimes the choice to lean on the Spirit can be a challenge.

In a recent Open Door Policy episode, featured guest Curtis Simpson Jr., Director of Christian Service at Corpus Christi Parish, shared two ways to deeply lean on the Holy Spirit and allow it to change not only our lives, but the lives of those around us.

### Get comfortable being uncomfortable.

So much of humanity lies in dispelling or preventing discomfort as best we can. We take a Tylenol when we feel a headache coming on; we make small talk with new people to avoid “awkward silences.” We hope for the best but prepare for the worst, and we try to anticipate any and all obstacles so we can determine how we’ll handle them if they arise. We keep our hands in the mix and try to control as many variable elements of our lives as we can.

But so much of discipleship means wearing our heart—and the heart of Jesus—on our sleeves. Being a disciple requires us to lean into the vulnerability of faith. It’s not only hearing God’s promise of great plans for us, but believing it, understanding it, and trusting in it. This seems counterintuitive to our natural inclination, but by embracing the discomfort of vulnerability, of differences between ourselves and our neighbors, we are truly relying on the Lord.

### Know your role and live it out.

God equips those he calls to carry out his mission; if we are struggling to preach, perhaps it’s because we’re really meant to pray for those who preach! Evangelization is not a one-size-fits-all tool. Each of us shares the Gospel in different ways. Each of us has specific gifts—whether they’re gifts of preaching, intercessory prayer, evangelical charity, or accompaniment—that allow us to spread the love of God. These gifts are not just natural talents; they are charisms given specifically from the Holy Spirit to help each of us fulfill our divine purposes.

Once you’ve established this openness and docility to the Spirit, pay special attention to its movement in your life. Often we expect signs from God to be lightning bolts or visitations in dreams—clear, grand productions that stop us in our tracks. But the Lord is working in your everyday life, so look for him! Get to know what the Lord sounds like and be open to what he calls you to do.

Saint Paul—one of (if not the) most prolific writers of the Scriptures—had gone by the name of Saul through the early part of his life as a devout Jewish boy and man. Raised as a Pharisee

(and, due to many privileges granted to him in Scripture, likely a Roman citizen), he used his knowledge of Pharisaic Law as a violent persecutor of the earliest generation of Christians. This violent attitude towards Christians sets the tone for this weekend’s readings.

Saul, fresh off his conversion to being a disciple of Jesus, attempts to join the disciples in Jerusalem. These disciples, persecuted by the Jewish authorities (and most likely by the Romans, inciters of unrest in the Jewish community, as well) feared for their lives daily—and along comes one of their chief opponents, Saul. How were they ever to trust such a man? It took a while, but as the next few verses of Acts state, Saul began to “move freely with them in Jerusalem.” The Acts of the Apostles is difficult to read in that there are many stories happening concurrently. Overviews are given and then details are cross-referenced later in scriptures, so a definitive timeline is sometimes difficult to comprehend—but we can be sure that it took Saul a while to lose his image as a persecutor of Christians and become Paul, a trusted Apostle of Christ’s Good News.

Our second reading, once again from the first letter of John, moves from its declaration of “God as Light” into our duty as Christians to spread the Word of God in our Love for one another. Like Saul telling Jesus’ disciples that he now follows Christ, it is difficult for humans to imagine until we witness in “deed and truth” that someone truly is who they say they are. God knows what is in each of our hearts, and we can have confidence in God’s promises, due to the Holy Spirit which he gave us. This, however, does not absolve us from acting out against His Commandments; rather, it binds us more intimately to the precepts that are laid out in them. We need to speak the Good News, but more than that, we need to live and act out the Good News of Jesus for the world.

Each of the readings this week flow perfectly from one to the next as example of their truth. The Gospel speaks of the Father as a vine grower and of humanity as the vine. The branches, leaves and fruit, are our lives and what we present to the world around us. Just as Saul needed to do, we need to prune those branches that produce little or no fruit in our lives. We need to properly strip back the branches where fruit is being produced so that our energies go toward the best fruit, the best outcome. Balance is key. We must eliminate that which draws energy needlessly while providing enough energy to that which shows our best to the world. We cannot put all our energy toward one thing, however; we need to properly identify, diversify, and prioritize, so that our lives can provide not just the biggest, but the sweetest and most plentiful bounty of Jesus’ Good News. Scripture, prayer, acting for the good of others, and recognizing where we need to nurture and where we need to prune is tantamount to our success in growing.

As we enter the second half of the Easter Season, are we looking at the potential of what we are in God, or are we looking at what is best for us right now? Let us make wise decisions as we prune where we must, and nurture in our lives that which bears the most fruit.
