Next weekend, at the 9:00am liturgy, we look forward to Rev. Dominic Macioce offering his first Mass here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish. Fr Macioce has spent years of spiritual formation, education and training preparing for this day. Speaking from personal experience, the first Mass that a priest celebrates is a mixture of emotions. There is, of

course, a sense of anticipation and nervousness as you prepare to do what you been 'in training' for which sometimes seems like an eternity. The feeling of nervousness is compounded by the idea that all of your family and friends will be present on that day that you offer your first Mass. (How many people ever start a new 'job' with your family and friends in attendance?) It is also a great honor, privilege and joy to return to your home parish, where so many key sacramental moments in your life occurred.

What I would like to do is offer some reflections on what, for me, was key in my training for the priesthood. Throughout the course of the six years of seminary studies and training, the seminary emphasized the role of priest as being one of 'servant leader'. It is all too easy, as you prepare to celebrate Mass and say those words of consecration: "This is my body. This is my blood" to feel an over-inflated sense of self importance. It is all too easy to think 'I have been given the power to do this' and to somehow feel separate from the rest of the assembly.

Of course, this is not true. St. Paul, in writing to the church at Corinth, reminds us that everyone who eats the bread and drinks the cup makes present the death of the Lord until he comes again in glory (1 Corinthians 11:26). We commit ourselves, and this a challenge we don't think about often enough, to share in the sufferings of Jesus. We will share in his sufferings, share in his dying and do it as he did – loving, even those who might be the cause of his suffering. That is what Jesus brought forth on Calvary; a manifestation of God's love that is an unbelievable love, almost.

When we eat the bread and drink from the cup, we *all* recommit ourselves to make the presence of Jesus and his love for all of us present to the world.

There is one other thing we sometimes forget or neglect, but are reminded of each Holy Thursday evening when feet are washed. It's only in John's Gospel, and it's significant in John's Gospel, that the evangelist John does *not* have Jesus saying the words "This is my body, this is my blood." Those words are *never* spoken by the Son of God in the Gospel of John. What is recounted is that Jesus, before he sits down at table with his disciples for what will be the final meal of his earthly life, takes off his outer garment and puts a towel around his waist. He then goes before each disciple to wash feet.

Jesus takes the form of a slave. Recall that Peter objected to this and does not want to have Jesus wash his feet. Jesus' response is "If I don't wash you, then you can have no part with me." Jesus then says "If I then, your Lord and master, have washed your feet, you must wash the feet of others. I have given you a model to follow so that as I have done, you also must do."

The leader (the priest) must be a servant leader. The most difficult way to be a leader is to be a leader without any power. We find it difficult to grasp how you can lead when you are hanging on a cross, totally powerless. Yet as Jesus said "When I am lifted up on a cross, I will draw all people to myself."

That is true power, that is true love. The priest has to be a leader in service, a leader in love. That is what a priest is called to do. My hope and my prayer, for all those who exercise leadership in the Church, is that those who accept the role God has called them to strives to the example of Jesus and transform the world into the Reign of God.

The past few weeks have been a real mixed bag for me. I've been told that people have been asking about me as I hadn't been around the parish. People were wondering if I was okay or not...nice to know that I was missed. The short answer is "yes and no." On April 7th I was in the office in the morning finishing up a few things before I left on vacation for twelve days. My husband and I were heading to Istanbul for a few days then on to Rome and points north in Italy to visit my husband's family. Istanbul turned out to be a great city of discovery for us, one we thoroughly enjoyed. Also, part of the plan was to make a pilgrimage through the Holy Door of Mercy at St. Peter's and to take part in a general papal audience in St. Peter's Square. We had a wonderful trip even though it was taken at a much slower pace than our previous travels as two years of chemotherapy had certainly slowed me down. I managed to squeeze the trip in between two chemotherapy sessions.

Upon return, I had an appointment with my oncologist before my scheduled chemotherapy. As usual, they

drew lots of blood to monitor how my body is holding up to the treatment. Unfortunately, the numbers were not good as the blood work showed decreases in kidney and liver functions sufficient enough to stop all chemo for at least a week and to put me on a ten day medical leave to help my body recover from the cumulative effects of chemotherapy. After a week, another set of blood work showed that although the numbers were improving, they were not yet good enough to re-start chemotherapy. We will try again on Wednesday, May 4th. So, I ask for your continued prayers as I travel this journey (I prefer journeys to far off lands…).

That's where I've been! I missed being here at the parish, but certainly recognized the need to rest. Just following doctor's orders!! Thanks for all your thoughts and prayers! I'm back at work ready to serve this community! God bless! M.

A LOOK BACK AT THE BEGINNING

On May 14th, 10:00am at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, I will be ordained a priest! You are all invited and it would be wonderful to celebrate with you. The day after (May 15th) is Pentecost and I will offer my first mass at St. Jane Frances at 9:00am.

Starting July 1st, I will begin my new assignment at St. Frances Cabrini in Allen Park as an Associate Pastor. The pastor will be Fr. Tim Birney who is the current Vocations Director but will become Pastor on July 1st. It is a large and active parish with an elementary, middle and high school. It is going to be a great assignment!

With the priesthood right around the corner, I am led to think about the beginning of my vocation and the ways God led me to this moment. I would like to look back at my journey with you to give God praise and offer encouragement to anyone considering a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

When I began to seriously discern the priesthood I was in College at Oakland University studying for a Bachelors Degree in Marketing. As I thought about my future there was a serious lack of fulfillment in my heart. I was just drifting; going through the motions with no purpose other than to keep moving forward towards some theoretical and abstract sense of happiness. For example, "you will be happy when you get a good job, make some money, have a big house and a lot of cool stuff." There was a desire to have a family but it didn't fulfill my search for purpose. So I began to consider other options. I thought about service jobs at first: policeman, fireman, EMS, etc. However, all of those also left me searching.

As I came to consider the Church, I was unclear of the options. At this point I didn't know I wanted to be a priest, I very much believed I was going to marry and start a family. However, I knew what I was doing wasn't working, I needed a change. So, I went to speak to Fr. Jerry and he gave me some wonderful advice that suited the good work God was trying to accomplish in me. He gave me the many different options in the Church: priest, deacon, pastoral associate, music minister, youth minister, teacher, etc. However, the best advice he gave me was to finish my degree since I was over halfway done and while doing that to start praying, asking God about a vocation. I continued my classwork which consisted of a lot of night classes, so during the day I started going to daily mass and praying a bit each day. As time went on I added a holy hour and the rosary. Soon the desire to work in the Church was increased and the possibility of a vocation to the priesthood was a real possibility...

By the time I finished my Bachelors Degree at Oakland University I was pretty certain I was going to enter the Seminary to continue my discernment. I called the Vocations Director to set up a meeting. As the date neared for me to visit the seminary, I was plagued by a lot of fear, worry and anxiety. Looking back on that time, it is very clear that the Evil One was working hard to keep me away. However, I wasn't familiar with Discernment of Spirits (method for distinguishing what is from God and what is not) and thought it was a sign from God I wasn't meant to be a priest. As a result, I cancelled my meeting at the seminary and began down a different path. I began working towards an MBA at Walsh College, while working as a Manager at a newly opened Sports/Martini Bar. At first I thought I found the perfect situation: working in a great job, making a lot of money, having fun and continuing my education. Yet, within 6 months I was a mess. Because of my work schedule I stopped going to Mass altogether, wasn't praying, living an immoral lifestyle and very unhappy with my studies. Enter Jesus!

Thank God we have a merciful, just and personal God who loves us as His own children. The Lord intervened in my life and helped to set me on the right path. I started going back to Mass, praying and cut out the sinful patterns I was living. This taught me a valuable lesson. We only will find true happiness when we seek the will of God. If we pursue a path that is contrary to His or based solely on what we feel like doing, then we will be left searching and unfulfilled. Not everyone is called to a vocation to the priesthood. Some are called to be married or live the religious life, but we all have a vocation. Maybe because I am Italian and am testa dura, (hard headed) I came to learn this lesson slowly. Once I had this conversion of heart it was a straight path towards seminary. I called the Vocations Director again and set up another meeting at the seminary. It was a three day weekend called a Discernment Weekend. I stayed at the seminary, met with the priests and seminarians, had the chance to follow their schedule and got a crash course on the process. After the weekend I knew the path God had set for me. I wasn't set on being a priest yet, that would come later, but I knew the seminary was the best place to discern my vocation. I entered in 2010 and now six years later I am only a month away from Ordination!!!

To conclude I want to highlight the key pieces in my journey for anyone searching. First, give God the time. If you are generous with Him, He will be infinitely more generous. Second, pray. Make an effort to develop a relationship with Jesus by prayer, remember He is alive and wants us to know Him. Knowing Jesus and allowing Him to know us, will naturally lead one to discovering their vocation. Once the relationship is substantial, we can ask Him specifically about a vocation. Finally, be not afraid. Discerning any vocation will involve doubts and fears. However, dismiss fears based in feelings or thoughts about unworthiness. They are nothing other than lies and temptations from the Evil One. Like the Apostles, Jesus doesn't choose us because of what we have done, but because of what He wants to accomplish through us. Nobody can merit God's call; our task is to respond to it.




