The Catholic Church has for decades taken seriously the plight of these vulnerable refugees, and through advocacy, education efforts, and service provision, sought to provide increased protections for them.

This is a happy Father's Day story which starts out rather painfully, but illustrates that when you're doing the right thing, God's plan is one you could not possibly have orchestrated.

My dad Buck passed away at age 93 on July 26, 2009 after some years of dementia. He'd gone into the hospital for another procedure, but his body said "no more," and he died on a Sunday morning, the day before his operation. Flashback to 1984: after Mom's death and her burial in her family plot, one grave remained for my dad. With his heart bypass surgery pending, Dad insisted on a cemetery visit, just to make sure his grave was ready in case things didn't go well. We were assured everything was in order, but ideally, Dad wouldn't need that plot for years. He lived 29 more years. The grave? Not so much.

Fast-forward to July 28, 2009. The day before Dad's Mass of Resurrection, a phone call from the funeral home interrupted some photo collecting work I was doing at Dad's house. The cemetery had just notified them that "Mr. Parrott cannot be buried in the grave next to his wife." Why? No room. Apparently graves were measured differently, without vault allowances, back in the early to mid-1900s. Mom's family all opted for vaults, so Dad was "squeezed out." The cemetery offered several



pitifully poor (and costly) options, including separating mom and dad, buying new plots, and cremation, which Dad absolutely did not want. I was furious, especially since Dad and I had made that special trip years before.

Their suggestions were unacceptable, so I asked the funeral home if we could still have Mass, perform military honors, but then take Dad back to the funeral home until we had a solution for keeping Mom and Dad together. They said yes. I prayed, then let go to let God handle things. The next day, Fr. Tony celebrated a beautiful liturgy, I sang the music, and my family proclaimed the readings and brought up the gifts. Even my Navy SEAL nephew Ryan surprised us all by traveling halfway around the world to see his beloved Grandpa Buck. After the Honor Guard played *Taps* and presented me with the flag, we all watched as Dad was returned to the hearse. Then, we held a memorial luncheon. Only my brothers knew why we weren't following along to the grave site.

But then, something unbelievable happened. As soon as dad was safely inside the hearse, the funeral director and Army Sergeant approached, asking if I knew Dad could be buried at Great Lakes National Cemetery in Holly. I did, but what about Mom? Yes, she could be buried there too, right with him. My heart lifted as I knew Dad would want that—but there was more. The Army officer explained that filmmaker Keith Famie was making the movie *Detroit: Our Greatest Generation* about WWII veterans from Detroit. They needed a veteran's funeral to represent the tens of thousands of veterans who had died—and would I consent to Dad's inevitable second funeral being filmed? That was an easy decision. Dad's military service meant the world to him, and he'd be honored to be remembered in such a manner.

On September 1, 2009, Mom was disinterred and moved to Great Lakes. On September 2nd, Dad's procession drove down the solemn Avenue of Flags. In a beautiful lakeside pavilion setting, Fr. Tony officiated, I sang, and we held military honors ending with *Taps* and a 21-gun salute. Mom and Dad's graves lie on a sloping hill, facing the setting sun, just as he wanted. Happy Father's Day, Dad, and to all fathers who are now in heaven. I know you're watching over us all.

2021 CAR SHOW: THANK YOU!


On Friday, June 11th, we had over 200 cars here for our Cruise-In Car Show. It was a beautiful night filled with fellowship and camaraderie.
