The feasts are over, and we are fully into the long stretch of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is not the absence of a major season any more than our lives are ordinary on days that are not holidays. The extraordinary happens at any time, in any season.

For the Church, Ordinary Time forms the foundation of the liturgical year; it comprises almost two-thirds of the calendar. As we settle into the longest season of the year, let's remember the spirit of Easter and continue to move forward with joy and hope!

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

As you know, RCIA was different this year—but the Holy Spirit continued to work! On Pentecost Sunday, we baptized two adults and confirmed five (one of our six was ill and unable to be with us that day).

It was a wonderful year and a great celebration of the Sacraments! RCIA can be joined at any time, so now is the time to begin praying in earnest for the Holy Spirit to send us seekers.

I am asking that the prayers of our faith community be for God to send us seekers—people looking to form a relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. At any time, we can begin the process of preparing people for reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil in 2021.

Once we have seekers, we will need sponsors and those who are willing to share their faith with a small group. I ask you to please include prayers for a Spirit-filled group of people to come forward to form the RCIA team, but, most importantly, for our evangelization efforts to be increased so that we bring in those seeking initiation!

Happy Father's Day!

One of my favorite stories I heard from my father was when I was very young. I asked, "Where did I come from?" Of course, I was probably

seeking info on the birds and the bees, but my father gave a better story.

My mom and dad had wanted a child but couldn't have one, so they went to a place that had all these babies. My dad really wanted a son. However, as he went up to the row of babies, he saw me, and we smiled at each other.

"She's really cute," he said, "but I really want a son." And he continued down the row. However, he kept looking back at me. Eventually, he said, "We just have to have her!"

Of course, I know the story is not true. (My parents had waited quite some time to be able to adopt.) But my father reiterated: "You were chosen; you were not a mistake or unwanted. You were wanted, chosen, and loved!"

Isn't that how our Heavenly Father accepts us? He chose us and sent His son to bring us closer to Him.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved" (Ephesians 1:3-6).

As we celebrate this Father's Day, may we keep in our minds and prayers all the fathers who have chosen us: our fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, and priests.

FATHER'S DAY TIPS BECAUSE WE LOVE YOU

Dads, you've probably heard this over and over, but never stop trying to improve! Here are some gentle reminders about six (plus one) ways you can refocus on your health, courtesy of the CDC:

Get enough sleep. Aim for seven to nine hours per night.

Stop smoking. If you quit now, you'll lower your risk of cancer, COPD, and other smoking-related illnesses.

Exercise more. Try to fit in two and a half hours of aerobic activity and muscle-strengthening exercises each week.

Eat healthy. Your diet should include a variety of fruits and vegetables daily.

Reduce stress. You'll feel much more relaxed if you avoid drugs and alcohol, connect socially, and find support.

Get regular checkups. You need to know your blood pressure and cholesterol numbers, because if they're elevated, your risk for heart disease and stroke goes up. You also need to be screened for colorectal and prostate cancer; positive outcomes are more likely with early detection.

Build your relationship with the Lord daily. Try every day to pray and make devotions. Attend Church regularly and find fellowship with your immediate and faith families.

It's been a month since we resumed public Masses on May 19, 2020—and what big changes we have seen since then! When the pandemic started, we at St. Jane Frances de Chantal

began filming liturgies and uploading them to our YouTube channel. The response was wonderful—people really engaged with and appreciated the chance to see Fr. Tony and our Church while at home.

So, as we prepared to reopen, we knew we would need to continue to offer video Masses in some form or another. If you've attended Mass in person, you may have seen me sitting on the right—I manage the camera for our Mass livestreams. We currently livestream all three weekend Masses (4:00pm on Saturday, 9:00am on Sunday, and 11:30am on Sunday) and provide an edited-together, "recorded" version of the 4:00pm Mass on our YouTube channel.

Admittedly, there have been a few hiccups in transitioning to this live system. No livestream is perfect—especially since it's a relatively recent phenomenon—and anything from a bad Internet connection to a dead camera battery can interfere with or derail our streams. I want to thank all of our parishioners watching at home for sticking through the technical difficulties. As we work to offer services for you, you have been extraordinarily gracious. I would also like to thank all the parishioners at in-person Mass who have had to worship with a camera in front of the altar.

The pandemic, and more recently, the protests for racial justice, have shown us all that cooperation and solidarity is key during these difficult times. Having to wear a mask is an inconvenience. Having to social distance can be difficult. Racism and injustice in our society is a travesty. But through each of these things, we, as humans and as Catholics, have come together to cooperate and understand. In the same way that we exercise patience and understanding during a malfunctioning livestream, we put up with worldwide struggles, look out for each other, and make change.

We are dispensed from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass until September. But the situation around the pandemic is constantly shifting, and we may not all feel safe being together in Church come September. If that is your situation, I hope you take advantage of the resources we have available. We will continue to offer livestreamed and recorded Masses for as long as it is necessary. It is important for us to be able to gather as one Church, in Christ's presence, and share understanding with each other, whether that be online or in person.

Since I, being the broadcaster, cannot also be a viewer, I'd love to hear from you on how watching Mass from home has been. I can be reached anytime at Lieffrey@sjfparish.org. Please let me know how your digital faith experience is going—I pray that the spirit of God continues to strengthen you while we are apart.
