How many of us are perfect? I can say with the utmost of certainty: none! Each of us attempt, based on the life lessons that we have thus far learned, to accomplish some form of good, but

rarely, if ever, do we reach The Good. Our imperfect selves are still tempted by the ways of the world, and we often act upon our past experiences, sometimes even when we know that they are not aligned toward The Good. This is what limits us as human beings.

We experience anger and jealousy, laziness, an unquenchable hunger for things of the world, and oftentimes, an inflated sense of self. What we do with these experiences is up to us. *That* is where Church teaching helps to guide us from the road of sin to the road of redemption that was paved for us by the ultimate sacrifice of the man we call Jesus.

Living a quarantined existence for the past few months has been extremely difficult for many of us. I find my patience waning so very quickly, not with being stuck at home, but with my reintegration with others. I am constantly talking myself down from the potential outbursts at other peoples' blatant disregard for each others' wellbeing. I also never really liked being in large crowds to begin with, unless I was with a few of my friends, but now, having been alone or in a near-alone environment, being around groups of people causes a little bit of anxiety at times, especially when people will walk right up to me without a mask (even though I have one on or at the ready). This anxiety, if I choose to live in it, would lead me down the sinful road.

In our readings this week, we hear of the well-to-do lady providing food from her own stores and shelter for the prophet Elisha. Prophets were generally there to help lead a straying society back to God's commands, so they were not too popular. In our readings this weekend, Paul reminds us that when we were Baptized in Christ, we committed ourselves to live like Him; as such, we would share in the eternal Life that He promised. We promised to put our mortal lives aside and live more like Him as true Children of God. This poses both temporal (time-based, Earthly) challenges and offers spiritual rewards and hopes. We can follow and do the good, righteous thing, bringing others along with us to Heaven, or we can continue with Earthly desires, looking out for ourselves.

These are the ways (of which the Gospel reading speaks) that Jesus is divisive. To follow Christ is to be truly counter-cultural. We are called to look out for others and to stand for others, *all* others, regardless of faith, race, or political background. We need to lift up those who are oppressed and explain our failings so that they will be less likely to fall into the same trap that each of us falls into. When any of us experience something new, we should enter into that experience excited and hopeful, but listen carefully to the more experienced around us, not to squash that hope, but to be able to learn from their experience and grow in love of these things, as they are properly ordered to God and our life in Christ. These experiences need to become tools for us to use, not the things that separate us from each other. When we live, focusing all on the Greatest Commandment (Mt 22:36—40) the promises of Jesus are ours.

Some people listen to music all the time. In fact, a large number of students are plugged in with earbuds or headphones when they study, thinking it helps with concentration. I see golfers on the practice tee and the golf course doing this, too. Carts come equipped with ports in which to plug iPads, iPods, or whatever devices are the latest and greatest for music. So much for “Quiet Please” during golf!

Me? I’ve never found background music useful for concentration; actually, it’s a hindrance. I find I’ll pay attention to the song and reflect on the words, rather than tend to what I’m doing. As a musician, you’d think I’d listen to music nonstop. Not true. The exception is when driving my car with the radio on. I don’t even have radios at home—which is sort of unusual, considering I hosted my own hour-long golf show on WJR-AM-760 for five years! Perhaps it is because music is one of my professions; I play and perform so much—or did, pre-COVID-19. To me, silence truly is golden, a treasure to be valued given the cacophony of noise the world produces. You cannot go anywhere without hearing artificial sounds, canned music, traffic, construction, and other clatter.

But along comes COVID-19, and suddenly we’re forbidden from going out, driving, entering buildings, coming to Church, and more. The music stopped! We didn’t go anywhere, so we didn’t hear it, except for what our devices, television, and the Internet provided at home. I discovered that I missed my radio tunes—which merely consisted of whatever songs came up on my selected stations or during SCAN pushes, since I don’t have Sirius XM Radio or an iPod. Some tunes were like old friends, beloved songs that reminded me of someone, wonderful times, or an era I particularly enjoyed; the initial strains of a favorite song would bring a smile to my face. Did you ever notice how often you can identify a song merely by the first few seconds or notes? (You can also do that with songs you cannot stand—and get rid of them fast!)

In Church, we have our favorites. They can be old hymns, new hymns, contemporary songs, Gospel, Latin, or Hispanic—you name it. We’ve been deprived of our liturgical music for months, and even now, we are limited to a sung Psalm, Alleluia, Mass parts, and Communion song. We are even asked not to sing to prevent spittle particles from flying through the air, since singing propels them further. Imagine that: after all these years of encouragement to sing, who could have guessed at these repercussions?

That’s why Laurie suggested I record a “one-woman” concert of sorts to give you all an opportunity to hear some liturgical music outside of Church. I went through the June and July masses, picking out suggested songs I would have used for each weekend. The result? Lucas and I recorded over an hour’s worth of songs that will be available each week on YouTube. I invite you to submit your favorites, and I’ll try to record those in our next installments. Now, you’ll have a little bit of St. Jane Frances de Chantal music to enjoy at home, in the car, or wherever your travels take you. Be safe out there—and thank you, Laurie and Lucas!

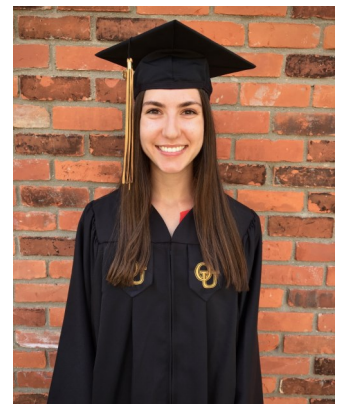

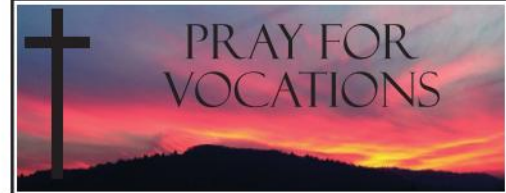


