The first image we get of God in the Old Testament, immediately after creation, is that of a God looking down on the earth and saying "It is good; indeed, it is very good!" This is paralleled at the beginning of Mark's Gospel (where there is no account of the birth of Jesus). Mark's Gospel begins with the baptism of Jesus with God, who is looking down from Heaven, on His Son, says "this is My beloved Son, in whom I am well

He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!"

Luke 7:14

pleased!"

The essential attitude of Jesus can be understood in this light. Jesus knew the Father intimately and, as a result, could hear God saying: "You are blessed. I am pleased with you. The earth is blessed. I am well pleased with it."

Because Jesus knew, recognized and could comprehend what the Father was saying, Jesus could look at the world, and everyone in it, and see them as blessed. "Blessed are you the poor in spirit, for yours is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you who mourn, for you will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be sons and daughters of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when others insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

Many implications flow from this, both in regards to how we view God and how we see life.

First of all, regarding how we view God: Do we ever view God as relaxed, content and pleased with us and pleased, in fact, with the world? Do we ever believe God takes delight in us and in the world?

There are undoubtedly many who suffer from an unhealthy and debilitating fear of God. Their view of God is of a deity who is intense, wired, displeased and fixated on our faults and shortcomings. God may no longer threaten with hell fire, but God isn't relaxed and pleased either.

We are still a long ways from really believing in a God who smiles, is relaxed and sees the world as blessed. Consequently the notion of God who, when seeing us and the world, is more likely to be that of a Creator who expresses disappointment and frustration.

It is no accident then that, on the part of many, this is also how the world is viewed; the mode of viewing the world is one of depreciation, rather than appreciation. Before seeing goodness, wrong is seen; before there is blessing, there is cursing; before there is appreciation, there is criticism. Does that mean that we should be oblivious to evil and cruelty? No, these have a place but first, before criticism and judgment, there must be appreciation of the goodness present in the world. Why?

Because God works that way. Long before there is judgment on this planet, or on us, God said "The world is good. All that I, the Lord God, have made is good." God is smiling and relaxed. The challenge for each of us is not to be consumed by anger and cynicism, but to see the world as God has fashioned it.



THE NEW EVANGELIZATION IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF DETROIT

Unleash the Gospel - The New Evangelization is unfolding and breathing new life into the Church in Detroit. *Unleash the Gospel* is a major push to change the DNA of the Church in Detroit to one of a Body of Christ on mission. What we are attempting is nothing less than a radical overhaul of the Church in Detroit, a complete reversal of our focus from inward, or maintenance-focused, to outward, or mission-focused. We seek to bring about this change first in our hearts, through an **encounter** with Christ. Then in our homes as we **grow** in our faith. And finally in our culture as we become a **witness** to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

There is a need to elevate the presence and importance of Christ in individuals, families, parishes, schools, and Catholic institutions to receive the good news, to live it, and to share it with our friends, our families, in our workplaces and beyond. The natural state of the Church is one of growth. We are living in a time of unnatural deterioration of the Church. The decline in sacramental participation and vocations as well as the closing of parishes are unnatural aberrations rooted in an erosion of evangelization. We need to undo some of what we've become as a people of Christ – passive in prioritizing and living our faith, sad about the perceived decline of the importance of Jesus and Church institutions, and accustomed to a malaise rooted in believing there is little that can be done. Just as we are seeing revitalization in our city, we seek to bring about rebirth of the Church in Detroit. #ResurgetDetroit



What is a Synod? A Synod is both an event and a process that sees people – clergy, religious, and laity – gather to discuss important matters of the faith. Synods are transformative events that lead to renewal in the Church's life. After a Synod takes place, the church emerges different, changed.

What is the purpose of Synod 16? In expressing his confidence that, "in response to our prayers through the synod in 2016, God will make being missionaries part of the DNA of our archdiocese." Archbishop Vigneron summarized the two-fold purpose of Synod 16. The first is "missionaries." The focus of this Synod is *evangelization*. The second is, "DNA." The Archbishop hopes to transform the very culture of our Archdiocese—how we work, how we pray, how we

minister, everything—so that in everything we do, we are more effective witnesses. Evangelization is bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to those around us. Jesus himself commanded us to evangelize. The church exists to give witness to the Gospel. All around us are people who have never heard that God loves them and desires abundant life for them. They need to hear this good news. There are also people who received sacraments or grew up in faithful homes who have now stopped coming to church or stopped participating in their faith. Evangelization is for them, too.

Have there been other Synods in the Archdiocese of Detroit? There have been ten synods since the Archdiocese of Detroit was established in 1833. The last synod in 1969, spurred much change in the Archdiocese. One of the most-familiar results of this synod was the bolstering of lay participation in the life of the Church through parish councils, parish finance councils, and vicariate councils. It's hard to imagine parish life without those elements of lay involvement. We pray that Synod 16 will, in a similar way, influence how we live the faith in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Synod 16 will take place November 18-20, 2016 at the Westin Book Cadillac Hotel in Detroit. What we are attempting is nothing less than a radical overhaul of the Church in Detroit, a complete reversal of our focus from an inward, or maintenance-focused church, to outward, or mission-focused church.

Who participates in Synod 16? Hundreds of clergy and laity will be participating in Synod 16. All of the faithful—whether they are participating directly in Synod 16 or not — are encouraged to pray for Synod 16. Each pastor was asked to prayerfully nominate three lay people from his parish who he thought could be flexible, creative, and discerning to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. The Archdiocesan Pastoral Council prayerfully considered the nominations and elected the members. Clergy and religious have been elected by their peers and invited by the Archbishop. In November 2016, clergy, religious, and laity will gather to pray and discuss how we can help everyone in our Archdiocese encounter Jesus, grow as disciples, and witness to the glory of a life lived in God's love.

Sessions. At these sessions, the faithful will have facilitator-led conversations. A scribe will capture the content of the discussion, which will be brought to the synod for further discussion. The dialogue sessions will be taking place between March and June. The faithful may attend a session at their parish or at another parish. Here at St. Jane Frances we held our dialogue session on May 1st. Check the AoD website for other dialogue sessions being held at other parishes.
