Throughout her history, the Church has had many traditions that she values—those traditions that celebrate the richness and uniqueness of her history and presence in society. In the Archdiocese of Detroit, there is one tradition that we as priests celebrate yearly. Every June, the priests of the Archdiocese of Detroit, together with

Archbishop Vigneron, celebrate their milestone anniversary of priestly ordination. It is customary to celebrate with those priests who have been ordained for 25, 30, 40, 50, and 60+ years.

Because of the pandemic, we were unable to celebrate jubilees last year. This year, we will celebrate jubilees with those priests who would have celebrated in 2020, as well as those who celebrate in 2021. This year, 62 priests will celebrate their milestone anniversary of ordination and service to the Church of Detroit. Leon Page.

Page and thank him for his service to the Church of Detroit, and in particular to the people of St. Jane Frances de Chantal, whom he served for many years as our parish’s founding pastor.

As a brother priest, I too extend to Fr. Leon Page my prayers and thanks for making St. Jane Frances de Chantal the parish that it is today. He and many founding members laid the foundation for the mission activities that we take part in today, not only within the city of Sterling Heights, but also in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

There is a Latin saying that is shared among priests who celebrate their anniversary and other milestone events throughout their life and ministry. The saying is “Ad multos annos,” which means “Goodwill and longevity of life and service.”

May we continue to pray that God may make known to us the mission He is calling us to. Each of us is called to a particular vocation—a vocation that is unique to the gifts and talents that we are endowed with from our God.

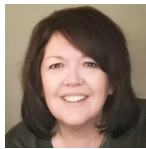

On the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we give special honor to Jesus, who is truly present in the most Blessed Sacrament of the altar.

As Catholics, we worship the presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, both during Mass and outside of Mass. We are encouraged to spend time in prayer before the Lord in the Eucharist. Many parishes offer regular exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance. We may also choose to visit the Church at other times to adore the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle.

Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink? Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole plan for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins with our Baptism, when by the power of the Holy Spirit, we are joined to Christ, thus becoming adopted children of the Father. This joining is strengthened and increased in Confirmation, as too it is nourished and deepened through our participation in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity.



In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. By being united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we are drawn up into the eternal relationship of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As Jesus is the eternal Son of God by nature, so we become children of God by adoption through the sacrament of Baptism.

Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation (Chrismation), we are made temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, and by his dwelling we are made holy by the gift of sanctifying grace. The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we will share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The fathers of the Church called this participation in the divine life "divinization" (theosis). In this, we see that God does not merely send us good things from on high; instead, we are brought up into the inner life of God, the communion among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving"), we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.

When the bread and wine become the Body of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine? In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique—a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church’s traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist, the “substance” of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the “substance” of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the “accidents,” or appearances of bread and wine, remain.

“Substance” and “accident” are here used as philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith. Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of “accidents” or physical attributes—that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of “substance” or deepest reality). This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called “transubstantiation.” According to Catholic faith, we can speak of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. Catechism, no. 1376).

## HEALTH MINISTRY

**Hay fever**, also called allergic rhinitis, causes cold-like signs and symptoms, such as a runny nose, itchy eyes, congestion, sneezing, and sinus pressure. But unlike a cold, hay fever isn’t caused by a virus. Hay fever is caused by an allergic response to outdoor or indoor allergens, such as pollen, dust mites, or tiny flecks of skin and saliva shed by cats, dogs, and other animals with fur or feathers (pet dander).

Hay fever signs and symptoms can include: a runny nose and nasal congestion; watery, itchy, red eyes; sneezing; cough; itchy nose, roof of mouth, or throat; swollen, blue-colored skin under the eyes (allergic shiners); postnasal drip; and fatigue. See your doctor if you can’t find relief from your hay fever symptoms, if allergy medications don’t provide relief, or if you have another condition that can worsen hay fever symptoms.
