THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Trinity. This feast is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. As we are all aware, these last few weeks have seen changes to the way we do things. Social distancing has become a phrase and an action that is part of our everyday life. But, prior to March 17th, the phrase “social distancing” was foreign to us.

This experience has reminded me how our lives can change in an instant. Life is meant to be enjoyed and shared with others. Each day, as we rise from sleep, God blesses us with life and calls us to make the most of what the day has to offer. A simple prayer that I say each day helps me to focus on the day at hand: *“Lord, help me to stay out of your way. Use me as you see fit.”*

One of the books that I read last summer, written by Matthew Kelly, was *The Biggest Lie In The History Of Christianity*. Don’t let the title fool you. It is a wonderful book about the power of God’s work in our lives and how He wishes to transform us into the person He has created us to be.

In one of the chapters, Matthew Kelly states that we are comfortable with our mediocrity. Our lives have become mediocre. I, as well as many of my brother priests, often hear the same phrase over and over again: *“Father, it’s always been done this way. We can’t change it.”*

This is a great definition of mediocrity. Change is healthy; change is exciting. Every minute of every day, we are in a constant state of flux. Things change, and God wishes to change us because He has a plan for each one of us.

For example, have you ever taken an old favorite recipe and added a new ingredient to it? The added ingredient changes the overall taste of the recipe. Anyone who cooks has done this from time to time. The outcome is always the same: the new ingredient transforms the old recipe into something new and exciting.

The challenge that Matthew Kelly raises in his book is that, in order for God to transform us, we have to be open to God’s work in our life. Or, to put it another way, we have to be open and realize that God has a plan for us.

Once we open ourselves to God, we need to focus our attention on being transformed. Matthew Kelly suggests the following prayer:

“Lord, here I am. I trust that you have an incredible plan for me. Transform me. Transform my life. Everything is on the table. Take what you want to take and give what you want to give. I make myself 100 percent available to you today. Transform me into the person you created me to be, so I can live the life you envisioned for me at the beginning of time.

“I hold nothing back. I am 100 percent available. Lead me, challenge me, encourage me, and open my eyes to all your possibilities. Show me what it is you want me to do and I will do it. Amen.”

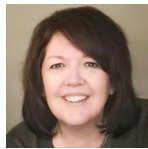

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. It is always observed on the Sunday after the Solemnity of Pentecost. This celebration dates back to the seventh century. The following is a helpful

explanation of the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity from catholiccurrent.org:
The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

The mystery of the Triune God is one that is often difficult to express to others when sharing our faith. Many theologians speak of the Trinity as a relationship of love. Pope Frances in his Angelus of May 26, 2013 spoke of the Holy Trinity as the relationship of love that is shared with us. I like his description, and hope you find it helpful as well:

“Let us recognize that God is not something vague. Our God is not a God ‘spray’; he is tangible; he is not abstract but has a name: ‘God is love.’ His is not a sentimental, emotional kind of love, but the love of the Father who is the origin of all life, the love of the Son who dies on the cross and is raised, the love of the Spirit who renews human beings and the world. [...] The Most Holy Trinity is not the product of human reasoning but the face with which God actually revealed himself [...] walking with humanity [...] with his people in the history of Israel, and Jesus who has always walked with us and promised us the Holy Spirit who is fire, who teaches us everything we do not know, and guides us from within, gives us good ideas and good inspirations.”

When we recite the Creed each week, we proclaim our belief in the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As you pray this week, take some time to reflect on what you believe and how you live out those beliefs.

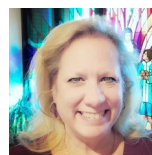

Throughout May, Catholics worldwide have recognized the fifth anniversary of Pope Francis's second encyclical, *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home*. The

Pope's document adds to the Church's rich body of teaching on caring for God's creation, urging efforts to protect the environment and all living creatures. The Michigan Catholic Conference (MCC) has joined these efforts by developing and distributing materials for Catholic institutions, including:

MCC's latest FOCUS publication, *Care for Our Common Home: Reflecting on Laudato Si'*

A webpage with resources and ideas for absorbing the encyclical's themes on both an individual and an institutional level.

Both these resources are available at micatholic.org/LaudatoSi. The webpage also highlights local examples of how the Catholic faithful in Michigan have lived out this teaching. In a recent release, MCC expressed gratitude for the voice of the Holy Father in international dialogue concerning the environment:

"Pope Francis's message about individuals having a shared responsibility for one another and for God's creation is particularly relevant during this time of global pandemic. It is the hope of this organization that our materials will help to support the message of the Holy Father and encourage Catholics to dive more deeply into his teachings."

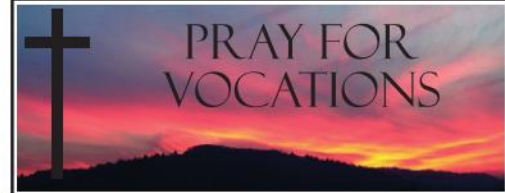


