This weekend, Fr. John L. Longbucco will be here from Cross Catholic. He will be speaking at all this weekend's Masses on behalf of Cross Catholic Outreach.

Fr. John and I have been friends for 40 years, and his being here this weekend will give us an opportunity to catch up and share a meal or two. Fr. John was ordained a priest

in 1990 in the Diocese of Marquette. As one of seven children, Fr. John has an appreciation for the working class family and especially for those families that struggle to feed their children. He began his service in the Archdiocese of Detroit and eventually transferred to the Diocese of Marquette, where he most recently served as pastor at Holy Family.

Throughout Fr. John's career, his heart for the poor has grown. During his time as pastor of St. Francis, St. Kateri, Holy Family, and during his deployment serving in Iraq as a U.S. Army Chaplain, he has seen all levels of family struggle. Seeing the worse kind of poverty in a war-torn country has moved Fr. John to want to bring the plight of the "least of those" to the Church body as an outreach priest for Cross Catholic. Please welcome Fr. John as he shares with us the ministry that Cross Catholic provides to those in need. Brochures will be provided if you wish to support this worthy Catholic ministry.

We often think of the Church as the Archdiocese of Detroit, or even as St. Jane Frances de Chantal, and we would be correct. However, we are only a small part of the Universal Church. The Church reaches far beyond the corner of 17 Mile and Ryan Road. Hearing the experiences of priests and sisters who minister in their missions allows us to see a picture of the global Church through their eyes. Let us keep in prayer those who choose to minister in mission territories throughout the world. As Pope Francis has said so often, missions are at the heart of the Church.

One of the things I enjoy is greeting people in the Gathering Space before and after Mass. It is a time for me to meet people and to say a quick hello. Some people see that time as an opportunity to make an appointment with me. However, I would ask that if you need to make an appointment to see me that you please call the Parish Office. An important point to note is that I schedule my own appointments, and I will get back to you. I am always available to meet with people. I would ask that you leave your message on my voicemail. 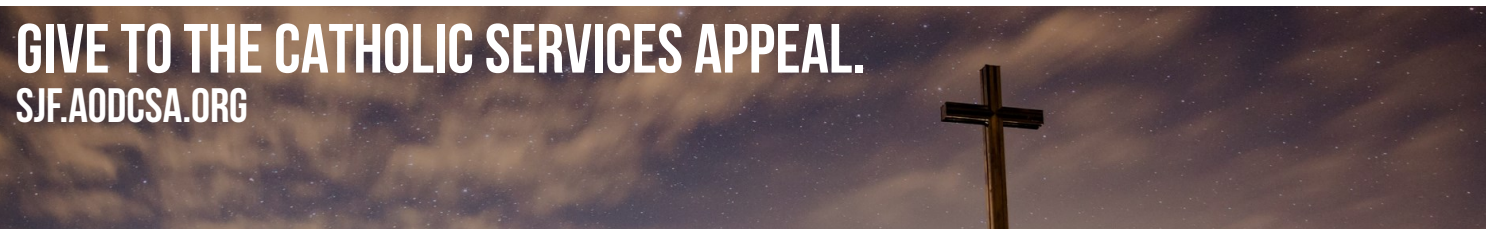

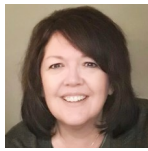

From Amos to the twelve apostles, God calls people of faith to serve others.

Amos, a shepherd and horticulturist, was called to prophesize to Israel. Saint Paul was

called to bring Christ's message to Gentiles all around the world. The Twelve were sent by Jesus in pairs to heal the sick and drive out demons. Today's readings call us to consider how we are called by God to give witness to the Gospel.

Today's Gospel ends far differently from last week's. Mark tells us today that "The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them" (Mk 6:13). Just last week, in Nazareth, Jesus "was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them" (Mk 6:5). Mark emphasizes that faith enables the power of Jesus to be effective—"Daughter, your faith has saved you" (Mk 5:34)—and Nazareth held mostly skeptics. But it is important to note that six pairs of disciples journeying along six different routes were able to encounter many more people than one group of 13 could.

As Jesus' disciples in the world today, we can encounter many, many times more people. We can also reach people in so many different ways. Most of those ways don't require that we leave everything behind—even our closets full of clothes! Jesus instructed the disciples to go without possessions, so that they were able to fully experience their dependence on God. We are all dependent on God for the grace to carry out our mission. By the grace given in our baptism, we became part of the body of Christ, called and empowered to carry on Jesus' mission, ministering to those in need. With the power of the Holy Spirit, we have all we need to be up to the task of ministering to others and spreading the Good News.

Today, reflect on a time when you were provided what you needed to bring God's blessings to others. Pray that you will always be aware of those blessings and bring the joy of your faith to all your interactions, wherever you journey. Peace!

## THE 2021 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: FUEL THE MISSION

As we face so many challenges in 2021, we are reminded of our call as missionary disciples to act out of the heart that God has formed in us. The CSA raises funds that make possible the work of the AOD, including supporting more than 100 ministries, programs, and services. This includes helping the hungry and homeless, supporting AOD parishes, priests, and seminarians, promoting the work of the Catholic schools, and so much more.

### What is the CSA?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish. ### What does the CSA fund?

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, grants to Catholic schools, and young adult programs.

**Our parish goal is \$91,324.00.** Once a parish reaches its individual annual goal, 100 percent of the overage is returned to the parish.

## KEEPING THE FAITH IN WHEN SCHOOL'S OUT

In the summer, there is a noticeable shift of energy in my household. My children, who have been going to school and playing sports during the spring months, are all home together under one roof. Our days are open with little more than a trip to the pool on the schedule. As the warm sunshine and long days beckon us out of the house, we are outside barefoot until we retreat to the house in exhaustion to rest and regroup until we're ready to go out again.

These months are fun, active, and exhausting, but they also present the beautiful opportunity to live out our faith together in the domestic church of our family. While during the school year our family schedule conforms to the demands of schools, activities, and jobs, during the summer months, our schedule is a blank slate. It's the perfect chance to live the liturgical year together, whether through our daily prayers and devotions or through the activities we use to fill our time.

Our rich Catholic tradition provides a variety of beautiful devotions and practices around which we can form and enrich our days. Here are a few that we've enjoyed over the years:

### Make a Marian Garden

Perhaps you've heard of the tradition of the Marian garden. It goes back to the seventh century, when monasteries, churches, and families would plant herbs and flowers symbolic of Our Lady within their gardens. These gardens were used to make tinctures and ointments by monks and laypeople, but also as places of respite and prayer over the course of the day. You might be surprised to know that most common flowers and herbs have special Marian names, based on their symbolism in Marian gardens.

Maybe you don't have a big yard, but only a little patio or sunny corner of your home. Why not make a Marian garden of potted plants where you can retreat to pray during the day? You can even start a family tradition of leaving a bouquet of fresh blooms, branches, or leaves that you gather at the feet of the Blessed Mother over the verdant summer months. You only need a statue of Our Lady, big or small, and a few potted plants to surround her with to get started. Place a candle, a comfortable cushion, or seat for sitting and a basket with rosaries to make it the ultimate retreat spot.

Here are a few common plants with their Marian names which you can incorporate into your garden:

- Marigold, or "Mary's Gold"
- Lily of the Valley, or "Our Lady's Tears"
- Canterbury Bells, or "Our Lady's Bells"
- Foxgloves, or "Our Lady's Gloves"
- Sage, or "Mary's Shawl"
- Violet, or "Our Lady's Modesty"
- Juniper, or "Our Lady's Shelter"

Or better yet, research the Marian name of your favorite flower or herb! Most have Marian names and associations—many are even associated with a specific mystery of the rosary.
