

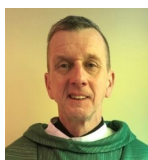

Although it has been a different type of summer in the midst of the pandemic, it has flown by nonetheless. I hope all of you had a chance to get some rest and relaxation.

Last week, I received a copy of Matthew Kelly's latest book, *I Heard God Laugh: A Practical Guide to Life's Essential Daily Habit*. The central focus of the book is the importance of prayer in our life and our daily activities. It emphasizes that our life is

centered on prayer and that our relationship with God is strengthened through prayer. In the later part of the book, Matthew Kelly presents what he calls the prayer process. This process invites people to a deeper understanding of how their prayer life impacts their relationship both with God and people we come in contact with in our daily life. I hope you find this prayer process helpful and enlightening.

The Prayer Process

- 1. Gratitude:** Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for.
- 2. Awareness:** Revisit the times in the past 24 hours when you were—or were not—the best version of yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.
- 3. Significant Moments:** Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).
- 4. Peace:** Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed.
- 5. Freedom:** Speak with God about how He is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the best version of yourself.
- 6. Others:** Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.
- 7. Finish:** Pray the Our Father.

The Archdiocese of Detroit recently announced that *"Archbishop Vigneron has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for all the faithful in the Archdiocese of Detroit, as well as for all travelers during their time within the territory of the Archdiocese of Detroit, until Monday, November 23, 2020."* In doing so, they stressed that *"all baptized Catholics are reminded of the grave necessity they have to keep holy the Lord's Day."*

“But who do you say that I am?” (Mt 16:15). That’s a question posed by Jesus. Specifically, he’s asking the disciples surrounding him—but in more ways than one, he’s

asking that question to us every day that we live!

The first reading describes how quickly “power” and “influence” can be taken from anyone and given to someone else. In the Gospel, Jesus is allowing His disciples to learn through their own experience and to live their lives based on what they learn. He asks them who “the Son of Man” is. Not “a” son of man, or the son of man (capitalized nouns denote importance!). The article “the” versus “a” denotes a very particular individual, not any random one (out of many).

Jesus allows His disciples to reach the conclusion that He *is* the Son of Man that the scriptures have foretold. They have reached this understanding based on the things that Jesus did, how He spoke, and how He taught. But then what did Jesus tell the disciples? *“...he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.”* (Mt 16:20).

The nature in which I personally learn is not just by reading about something. Neither is it simply by being told about something. My nature calls me to experience things to be able to understand them better—and to walk with others as they experience things.

Years ago, I went camping with my sister, brother-in-law, niece, and two nephews (the kids are triplets). Being about six or seven years old, the kids were fearful of using the restroom on their own and getting lost. So after the umpteenth trip to lavatory, I took the kids on a hike.

We went into the woods just far enough to lose sight of the road. With us, we took a map of the campground and a compass. We made a couple of trips back and forth, and I showed the kiddos basic land navigation techniques, lining up the map to landmarks (the roads), how maps are oriented (the cardinal directions), how to look for familiar things, and, most importantly, how to put all this together to find the right path to our destination.

Many times, we feel like we are lost—like things have been taken away, or that we may not have the knowledge necessary to complete a task. The fact of the matter is that God gives us the things we need (which are not always the things that we want).

We have been tasked with one simple thing: to tell the world about Jesus. He died for us on the cross, and we can now, through God’s mercy, join God’s heavenly glory when our time on Earth comes to an end. Simple, right? Not always—but all we have to do is put one foot in front of another, read our map (the Bible), line it up to the landmarks in our lives, and get back to the journey. I look forward to seeing everyone on my journey and sharing our experiences in the future!

During last week's Masses, you may have heard some songs that were "oldies but goodies." Certainly, there is a lot of contemporary music out there, and new music is being composed every day—but

that doesn't mean you can't blow off the dust off of some songs that do indeed fit in very well with the weekend's readings and Fr. Tony's homily.

In case you're wondering, the songs I sang on Saturday were *O Lord Hear My Prayer* (Taize) and *Healer of Our Every Ill* (Gather); that bouncy closing song I played was *Pass Me Not O Gentle Savior* (Lead Me Guide Me). On Sunday, I went retro and sang *Hear O Lord the Sound of My Call*, *Come Down Lord*, *There is A Balm in Gilead*, and *Blessed Assurance*. You may remember some of those from the 70s, when music selections in the Church were more relaxed and contemporary. In fact, to play some pieces, I read from an old, black, metal-bound book I have from St. Rita Church.

Some of you may have been on committees tasked with picking out various songs and compiling them to form your parish's own hymnal. Almost all churches adopted the above music (some, into personal black books—I'll show you if you come up and see me at the organ) in some form or fashion, but a few did not.

Now, it seems, many are discontinuing the use of more modern songs in favor of Latin and chant. Personally, I will pull out a few Latin pieces from time to time, like *Panis Angelicus* (Bread of Angels) and *Ave Maria*, or a chant or two like *Of the Father's Love Begotten* at Christmastime. A small amount of chant and Latin goes a long way. But for the most part, I like to stay more modern.

Some parishioners have asked for some advance notice about songs I'll be using during Mass—so they can look them up online or hear them in the Digital Music Series. And so, for the rest of August, you can take a gander at these:

At the 11:30am Mass this Sunday, I'll be lecturing for the first time in front of a congregation. If you watched our video Masses during the suspension of public Masses, you may have seen

me lector virtually—but this Sunday is the first time I'll be doing it in front of others!

I don't get stage fright, but lecturing is still something new for me. When I'm faced with something new, I like to learn as much as I can about it, become familiar and comfortable, and practice, practice, practice. Luckily, I'm socially isolating at home with my family, which means I have plenty of people around to practice lecturing for.

We encounter new things and experiences frequently, these days. In the end, we always adjust—I remember my first time going out with a mask on, trying very hard to maintain a six-foot distance from those around me. Now, five months on, that comes naturally. But as we continue to live in a changing world, we might struggle to understand and adapt.

There's a line in this Sunday's second reading that can help us in times of struggle: *"From him [the Lord] and through him and for him are all things"* (Rom 11:33-36). When we're faced with a new circumstance, situation, or direction, we can take a moment to remember that change, however difficult, is from, through, and for the Lord.

Let's say my first time lecturing was a change that challenged and frightened me. Let's say I wasn't isolating with my family, but rather by myself. How can I adapt? How can I get through it?

Pausing to remember the Lord's hand in all things is good on paper, but if I'm faced with anxiety and stress, I might not be in the headspace to do that just yet. Maybe a better first step would be to learn as much as I can about the new situation.

I see lectors ever weekend as they do the readings at Mass. If I want, I can visit our YouTube channel and watch back those Masses. I can analyze and understand what it means to proclaim the Scriptures at Mass, and in doing so, make myself more comfortable. I can learn about the situation I'll be in and where it'll happen.

I might not yet be comfortable reading in front of others, though—and if I'm isolated at home, how will I rehearse? Luckily, the pandemic has seen a popularity boom for video conferencing services. Whether it's with FaceTime, Zoom, or Google Meet, I can connect with someone who's willing to listen to me lector and give me constructive feedback.

Hopefully, at the end of this road, I'll have a clear enough mind to turn to the Lord and recognize His hand in all things. Although I may be alone at the ambo, the Lord is with me, guiding me in all that I do.

Change can be difficult. Many of the challenges we're facing right now are a bit more severe than having to lector for the first time. Our society is reorienting itself to navigate through a pandemic. But, no matter how big the struggle, we can always stop, take a breath, and prepare. At the end of it all, we must remember that *"From him and through him and for him are all things"* (Rom 11:33-36).

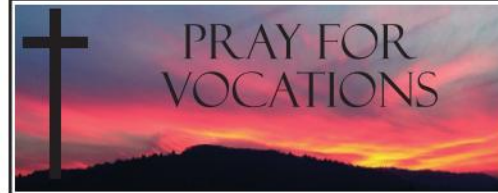



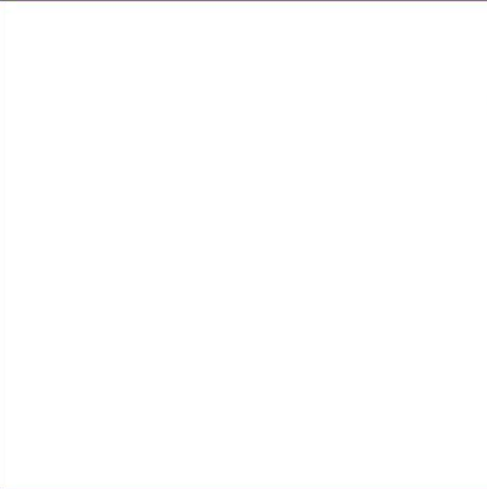
