“Mercy in Action Day of Service” October 1, 2016



Our group of parishes (Our Lady of Czestchowa, Our Lady of Grace, Ss. Cyril & Methodius Slovak, St. Ephrem, and St. Jane Frances) are focusing on the Works of Mercy from Birth to Death. The activities will include: gathering donations for babies, children, servicemen/women, delivering cookies to the Sterling Heights Police & Fire Departments, gathering supplies for our coffeehouse for the disabled, doing a clothing drive for all ages (at St. Ephrem), having a social hour at Oakmont with Polish dancers, and doing a fall clean up for seniors and at two city owned cemeteries. Needless to say there are many ways you can help and **show mercy!**

In preparation, there are many activities you can be involved in:

- Respect Life—October 1st will kick off our annual month long baby crib collection in the gathering space. You can drop off diapers, formula, blankets, baby clothing, baby food, bottles, body wash...anything a baby would need!
- “Troops Need Love Too”—During September we will be displaying tags for non-perishable food, hygiene, recreational items and postage. On October 1st we will be packing the boxes. Our goal is to pack 250 boxes for our servicemen and women through the donations from several parishes in our Vicariate.
- Candy/Coffeehouse Drive—During September, we will be displaying tags to help support our coffeehouse for the disabled. They are in need of plates, cups, napkins, Costco, Gordon’s & Dollar Tree gift cards for food and decorations. Candy bags will also be collected for the Seminarians to pass out to children in Detroit for Halloween.
- Fall Clean Ups—We will need volunteers to help rake, weed and cut back the greenery at qualified senior homes and two city cemeteries.
- Hospitality—We will need help with registration and breakfast on the morning of October 1st for all volunteers.
- Prayers—Above all we will need your prayers for:
 - A sunny day on October 1st!
 - Enough “disciples” to work all these activities
 - Enough “disciples” to donate all the items for our brothers/sisters in Christ

By participating in the October 1st “Mercy in Action Day of Service”, you will be showing, in a visible way, that **you are a disciple of Christ** through your time, donations and your prayers. 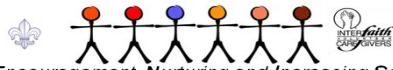

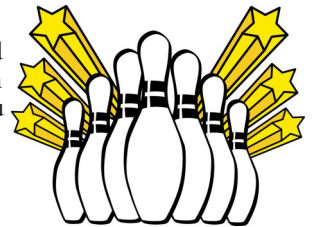
As summer winds down, and we look forward to the upcoming school year, be sure to leave a little time to have some fun at St. Jane Frances!

From Mass to Mission: Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life

Liturgy Day Retreat for Liturgical Ministers And Interested Parishioners

Saturday, October 8, 2016, 9:00am - 1:00pm

How does participating in the Mass help to strengthen our discipleship? How does it prepare us to go out into the world bringing ourselves and others into relationship with Jesus?

In *From Mass to Mission: Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life* we read that ever since the Lord's Death and Resurrection, His followers have gathered on the Lord's Day "in small groups or large, in spaces that are soaring and grand or modest and humble, to share this holy meal together. For Catholics, this is the celebration of the Mass. We leave home. We gather with friends and strangers. We enact a predictable ritual, and we change in unpredictable ways. We place all the events of the past week inside that Mass to offer them for the glory of God. We prepare for the duties of the coming week and seek their sanctification. We discard from our lives what keeps us from Christ, and we retain what makes us good disciples."

For many people, going to Sunday Mass is simply something they "do" as good Catholics. Keeping the Lord's Day holy is something they were taught as children, and attending Mass is simply matter of fact. But even if you're very committed to participating, it's easy to get out of touch with the wonder and gift of it all, and the ways in which we are changed unpredictably. Come to a new or renewed understanding of how the Mass can empower you in your discipleship!!

This retreat day is part of the continuing education of our liturgical ministers. We ask all liturgical ministers (servers in 8th grade and up, lectors, EMHC's, sacristans, MoH/Ushers, music ministers, altar-linen caregivers) to plan on attending this retreat and invite our fellow parishioners to join us. 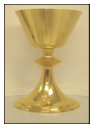

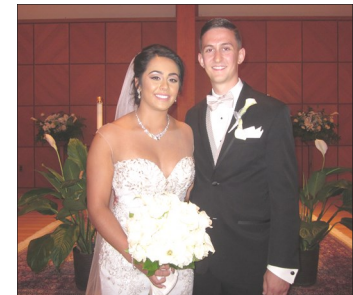
