Recently, I read an article by Dr. Jeff Mirus entitled *Proverbs, read spiritually*. In it, Dr. Mirus informs his readers that the Book of Proverbs is an instruction on the art of right living. He states that the Book of Proverbs “deals with the full range of life, from the spiritual heights to the pragmatism of daily life.”

The Book of Proverbs is about everything. The same can be said about the Book of Psalms, which addresses every human emotion, including life, death, forgiveness, sin, love, and hate. Every human emotion that we experience can be found in the Book of Psalms.

I would encourage you to pick up the Sacred Scriptures (the Bible), open it to either the Book of Proverbs or the Book of Psalms, and use them as a form of meditation. In the hustle and bustle of the world, we need to step out of our day-to-day lives and reflect in light of the situation that we find ourselves in.

Dr. Mirus suggests that Chapters 17 and 26 in the Book of Proverbs are of the greatest spiritual interest. With regard to the Book of Psalms, each psalm lends itself to a deeper reflection and allows the reader to center their attention on a power that is much greater than us—namely, God.

You have heard me say often that God has a plan for each one of us—and He does. It may not be the plan we envision for ourselves. In our lives, we need to see God’s hand and the many ways He blesses and enriches us with the people and experiences we deal with. I am reminded of a saying that I heard many years ago which helps me keep my life centered: “Do you want to make God laugh? Tell Him your plans for the day.”

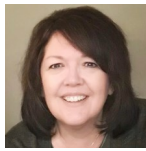

## HEALTH MINISTRY: HANDWASHING

Handwashing is a simple and effective way to help prevent diseases like colds, flu, and food poisoning. Washing your hands often, especially during cold and flu season, can reduce your risk of catching or spreading diseases.

When preparing or serving food, wash your hands beforehand to reduce the risk of catching or spreading bacteria that cause food poisoning. Be especially careful to wash before and after preparing poultry, raw eggs, meat, or seafood.

Handwashing is a must after going to the bathroom or changing diapers in order to reduce the risk of catching or spreading infectious diseases such as salmonella or hepatitis A.

For proper handwashing, wash your hands with hot running water and soap. Children should use warm running water. Rub your hands together for at least 20 seconds. Pay special attention to your wrists, the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your fingernails. Leave the water running while you dry your hands on a paper towel. Use the paper towel as a barrier between the faucet and your clean hands when you turn off the water.

If soap and water are not available for handwashing, use gel hand sanitizers or alcohol-based hand wipes. Most supermarkets and drugstores carry these products. Carry one or both with you when you travel and keep them in your car or purse. If you use gel sanitizer, rub your hands until the gel is dry.

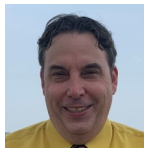

**EXPLAINING THE GOSPEL VERSE**

Have you ever gone to the dentist?

What happens at the dentist's office? You get your teeth cleaned and checked. Sometimes, they even take X-rays.

Why does the dentist take X-rays? To check for cavities. Sometimes, your teeth decay on the inside, but you can't see it on the outside. Even though the tooth may look fine, if you don't get it fixed, more problems can occur.

Sometimes, it's like that with God. We can look fine on the outside, but inside our heart is not pure. This can happen if we aren't nice to our family or to other children, if we are jealous, if we refuse to do chores, or even if we refuse to pray. God doesn't want anything to separate us from him. He wants us to stay close to him. He gives us parents, family, Church, and the Bible to help us. God doesn't want us to be far from him. He wants our hearts healthy.

**ACTIVITIES**

**Heart Hopscotch:** Read up on how to play hopscotch. When you make the squares using chalk on the sidewalk, draw a heart inside each square and a number inside each heart—one to ten. Ask the whole family to join in on the fun of playing the game.

**Heart Reminders:** Get some red pipe cleaners. Make them into the shape of a heart and leave them around randomly for others (parents, brothers, sisters, grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends, or neighbors). You can even write a note with a simple word or message (like the candy hearts on Valentine's Day) to brighten their day.

As human beings, we often get discouraged. We may go through times when it seems as if nothing goes our way. Dealing with COVID-19 and now the Delta variant has

certainly taught us that lesson. We wonder, “When will it end? Will we ever get back to normal?”

Don’t feel like you’re alone in this. As I visit other churches to play music and sing at funerals and weddings, those same questions abound, and the people there don’t have any better answers than we do here. The point is, we cannot give up. There is no quitting. If we keep hoping and praying and asking God for guidance, I’m confident that our lives will even out despite these very difficult times.

Those of you who know me understand that golf has always been a large part of my life. I’ve written many articles for publication about how golf actually mirrors life. That is still true. Here’s a great example from a tournament I played in last week, the Oakland Hills Ladies Invitational:

The Invitational is a partners event, and we competed together as a four-person team against the field. This is important in that the tournament is not about any one of us scoring well individually, but instead about us having to work together to achieve the best possible team score on each hole. Ironically, my host Kim and I met many years ago through golf, but our relationship truly blossomed when she asked me to sing at her dad’s funeral a while back. She also worked in the Church as an assistant principal at a Catholic school, so we had more than one thing in common.

The Oakland Hills South course was just renovated this year, and it is very difficult, especially for women. There are a number of greens that are elevated, and if you don’t hit your shot far enough, the ball will come rolling about 50 to 70 yards back down the hill. Kim and I were at the base of the 11<sup>th</sup> green, a notoriously steep incline. The flagstick was in the front. One recommended ploy is to putt the ball firmly in order to avoid a chip that will check up with the risk of falling back down. Kim flubbed her putt, and yes, it came back farther away than before. She did it again with the same result.

Frustrated, she started to pick up her ball and quit on that hole, when I stopped her and said, “Kim, don’t. Just give it one more try. You get a handicap stroke here, and maybe you can still help.” She took a mighty cut with her putter, whacked that ball, and it took off like a shot. The ball ran all the way to the back and side of the green, way past the hole—but then the extreme slope of the green took the ball and very, very slowly propelled it to the front and toward the hole. Our playing partners were giving us a play-by-play color commentary, since we couldn’t see from where we were: “Wow, that’s going to be good. No, great. Whoa... Oh my goodness, it’s in the hole!”

Kim made a 5 for a net 4, and we needed that score after all. The impossible became the possible. Now, we could probably never duplicate that shot again, but we didn’t have to. The point is, we didn’t quit. God never quits on us for any reason, and we must return the favor.

There’s a song I love to sing about times when we are in despair and may want to give up, and why we shouldn’t. Next week, I’ll include it here and provide a little background. Its title is *His Eye Is on the Sparrow*.

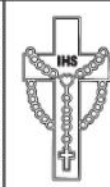
