"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

In today's first reading, we hear how God provided food to Elijah at his darkest moment—when he prayed for death. He had fled to the desert because the king's wife, Jezebel, had called for his execution. The kingdom had just suffered through drought and famine, and Elijah was starving and despairing.

Elijah got up at once to eat and drink the food the angel brought, but then he immediately lay down again under the tree. The angel had to return and order him to eat enough to finish his journey. He needed a second nudge in order to go from having his hunger satisfied to being nourished enough to sustain a lengthy journey. Nourished by the food God sent, Elijah completed his journey to the mountain of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus reveals himself as the bread of life come down from heaven, sent to sustain us on our journey to God. Our journey through life is winding and difficult. The mission we have been given is demanding. We too may need a second nudge to do more than just enable our journey, but to make it into a mission that will lead us to God.

When we partake of the Body of Christ at Mass, we receive the bread for the journey—a journey that is always leading us to closer relationship with Jesus. In his mercy and love, Jesus gave us his body and blood—nourishment for the spirit so we can overcome the trials of our journey to eternal life. What a gift we have in the Eucharist!

Spend some time thinking about the message today. How does receiving Jesus in the Eucharist strengthen me on my journey? When have I needed a second nudge to go on?

There is a name on the inside cover of each Gather hymnal that we use at Mass. That name is either the person/persons who donated the hymnal, or the person the hymnal was donated in memory of. We invite you to look at the inside cover of your hymnal and keep that person or family in your prayers during the week.

It is our hope that you will sign up to present the gifts in thanksgiving to God. It has been a long road to get where we are now, but if we just "keep on truckin'," as that old bumper sticker reads, we'll get there.

Some feedback: As columnists in the bulletin for our various ministries, we care that people read our articles and hope they do. Well, our parishioners do indeed. Thank you to so many of you who have written to me or come up after Mass to discuss my columns and how they have touched your hearts, provided good information, or reminded you of similar experiences with which you can relate. In response to the story about my dad's "two funerals," I've had parishioners tell me about their subsequent visits to Great Lakes National Cemetery in Holly, remarking how breathtakingly beautiful that sacred place truly is. Many did not know that spouses of veterans can be buried there, which is some very valuable knowledge in preparation for end-of-life planning. That has also spurred some to check their current arrangements to make sure everything is in place when the time comes. Losing a loved one is so very hard, and when things don't go right, or unexpected problems come up, it only adds to the stress.

Gone national: Did you know our beloved St. Francis, who watches over our Church entrance amidst the gorgeous landscaping, has gone national because of his fashion statements? As you may recall, I wrote about our Eden Club a few weeks ago and especially appreciated how St. Francis changes with the seasons and the times. Many parishioners share those feelings and treasure that simple feature about our parish. Some have mentioned it reminds them that saints started out as ordinary people like you and me: we wear sunglasses, ties, hats and scarves—and even masks—when necessary. People told me they'd snap pictures of St. Francis' weekly attire and send them to friends and relatives across the country. Each state had different COVID-19 mandates, so masks disappeared for people at various times. Of special interest was when our own St. Francis' mask would come off! By the way, whoever is doing this, we all prefer your identity remains a mystery—some things are better left undiscovered.

These shared human experiences are what bind us together as Catholics. It's great to know we are not alone in anything we do or think. We're all in this together and are grateful to God for providing this opportunity to gather and share our lives as a Christian community.

FEAST OF ST. JANE FRANCES de CHANTAL

August 12th is the feast day of our patron saint: St. Jane Frances de Chantal!

St. Jane Frances was a wife, mother, nun, and the founder of a religious community. She held prayer at the center of her life and believed it was through prayer that one can fully embrace God.

The way St. Jane Frances lived her life—guided by prayer and by radical love of neighbor—helps shape our parish identity today and guides us as a community of faith.

Join us this week on our Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook pages as we explore the life of St. Jane Frances de Chantal. Then, tune in to our YouTube channel this Thursday as we release a special episode of our new video series, The Way of Faith, focused on our patron saint!

St. Jane Frances de Chantal turned fully to God at a turbulent time in her life. At just 29 years old, she was widowed and had to care for her four children without her husband. Following this tragedy, she fell into a depression.

Although the darkness in her life was strong, all that changed when she heard St. Francis de Sales preach at Dijon, France in 1914. Just six months later, Francis de Sales became her spiritual director. His help, guidance, and strong friendship allowed St. Jane Frances de Chantal to lean fully into God's grace and grow in her faith at a crucial point in her life.

In June 1610, Francis de Sales and Jane de Chantal established the Visitation of Holy Mary—a religious congregation for women who were not strong enough physically to enter established religious orders. In a break from tradition, the Visitation of Holy Mary allowed its women to leave the convent and visit the sick and poor during the day. Francis de Sales' vision heavily influenced this new congregation—and St. Jane Frances de Chantal became its first superior.

St. Jane Frances was also drawn to the ideas of the Carmelites—the concept of giving up the normal forms of prayer and exploring abstract prayer through mysticism. Francis de Sales was at first cautious of this new method of prayer, but soon saw how extraordinarily God was working through Jane de Chantal—so much so that Francis de Sales adopted this method of prayer himself.

St. Jane Frances de Chantal had an extraordinary connection to God through prayer. Here, in our own faith community, prayer is essential: it's how we communicate with God.

At our parish, we have many opportunities for prayer:

The Rosary—a beautiful, meditative form of prayer that focuses on gentle repetition—is prayed at 6:00pm every Tuesday.

We have **Eucharistic Adoration** on the second Tuesday of every month from 1:00pm—6:30pm. Adoration lets you spend quiet, contemplative time in the presence of God in the Eucharist.

We gather for group prayer using the **Lectio Divina** method every Wednesday from 7:00pm—8:00pm. This prayer method involves reading Scripture, reflecting on its meaning, responding through prayer, resting in God, and responding in action.

Our **Intercessory Prayer Team** prays for the needs of our parish, our local needs, and the needs of the Universal Church. The Intercessory Prayer Team meets twice per month but continues to pray for requests beyond their meetings.

We offer **Divine Mercy Devotion** in the chapel on the last Saturday of every month following the 4:00pm Mass. This method of prayer proclaims the timeless message of God's merciful love through repetition.

If you're unfamiliar with one of these ways of praying, there is no better way to become familiar than by trying it out! Prayer is the avenue to a relationship with the living and true God, who wishes to be in relationship with us. Just like how communicating with family and friends is the way to deepen your relationship with them, so is prayer the way to deepen your relationship with God. St. Jane Frances de Chantal, on this feast day, we ask that you guide our parish by helping us to become a prayerful, loving faith community. Together we pray:

Almighty and merciful God,

we give thanks to you for St. Jane Frances de Chantal, who was inflamed with love for you, and who you blessed with fortitude throughout all the paths of life.

On this, her feast day, we ask you to grant our parish, through the intercession of St. Jane Frances, the strength and character to carry out our mission as a welcoming Catholic community dedicated to living and proclaiming your Gospel.

As a community of prayer as witnessed to by St. Jane Frances, we pray now for confidence and hope in your strength so that we may overcome all adversities with the help of your grace. We pray in the name of Christ, our Lord.


