Marking the Fifteenth Anniversary Of September 11, 2001

The world is a different place than it was fifteen years ago. It is hard to believe that fifteen years have gone by since the tragic events of September 11, 2001. My oldest daughter was about to enter her senior year in high school and was preparing to write her college application essays. After she had written one of them she asked me to proofread it for her. I can't remember what the topic of the essay was but I remember that there was no mention of the horror we had recently witnessed. In challenging her on this her reply was, "I'm not going to let this define who we are!" It was too late, its effect on us all began immediately. Good, bad, ugly - it doesn't matter, it affected us all in some way.

Here we stand today, seemingly more divided than I can remember in my lifetime, while others are reminded of a time not too, too long ago when other evils in the world were rearing their ugly heads. So, on this anniversary, we focus on God's mercy. A mercy desperately needed to bring about a kinder, gentler, more benevolent world. "Our petition is for our service to God, which brings the benefit of God's mercy."* Pope Francis, in fact, refers to the day's Gospel in *Misericordiae Vultus (The Face of Mercy)*, Bull of Indiction of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy:

In the parables devoted to mercy, Jesus reveals the nature of God as that of a Father who never gives up until He has forgiven the wrong and overcome rejection with compassion and mercy. We know these parables well, three in particular: the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the father with two sons (cf. Luke 15:1-32). In these parables, God is always presented as full of joy, especially when He pardons. In them we find the core of the Gospel and of our faith, because mercy is presented as a force that overcomes everything, filling the heart with love and bringing consolation through pardon.

You will notice a different focus on mercy, peace, and justice in the celebration of the liturgies on this weekend. It will be a somber, but hopeful, reminder of our need for prayer asking God to strengthen us with the conviction of knowing that in the Paschal Mystery we are united with Christ to conquer hate and death. So we pray that God not only bless America, but God bless his earthly family, the world over.

From Mass to Mission: **Understanding the Mass** and Its Significance for Our Christian Life Liturgy Day Retreat for Liturgical Ministers And Interested Parishioners

How does participating in the Mass help to strengthen our discipleship? How does it prepare us to go out into the world bringing ourselves and others into relationship with Jesus?

In From Mass to Mission: Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life we read that ever since the Lord's Death and Resurrection, His followers have gathered on the Lord's Day "in small groups or large, in spaces that are soaring and grand or modest and humble, to share this holy meal together. For Catholics, this is the celebration of the Mass. We leave home. We gather with friends and strangers. We enact a predictable ritual, and we change in unpredictable ways. We place all the events of the past week inside that Mass to offer them for the glory of God. We prepare for the duties of the coming week and seek their sanctification. We discard from our lives what keeps us from Christ, and we retain what makes us good disciples."

For many people, going to Sunday Mass is simply something they "do" as good Catholics. Keeping the Lord's Day holy is something they were taught as children, and attending Mass is simply matter of fact. But even if you're very committed to participating, it's easy to get out of touch with the wonder and gift of it all, and the ways in which we are changed unpredictably. Come to a new or renewed understanding of how the Mass can empower you in your discipleship!!

This retreat day is part of the continuing education of our liturgical ministers. We ask all liturgical ministers (servers in 8th grade and up, lectors, EMHC's, sacristans, MoH/Ushers, music ministers, altar-linen caregivers) to plan on attending this retreat and invite our fellow parishioners to join us. 


Dear Parishioners,

It is nearing two and a half years since I was diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer and it has been six Health Update months since I've given you an update. Many of you have not recognized me lately as my hair has grown back in enough that I can stop wearing my wig. My hair is quite short and it has been a bit humorous to see people's reactions! I continue to receive treatment under the clinical trial protocol using an investigational

drug. I am very happy to let you know that the results from a CT Scan last week indicate that the drug continues to be effective in stabilizing and shrinking the tumors!! Of course, none of this would be possible without your prayers...please know that I am so grateful for your continued faith and support. I remain feeling well with only the occasional minor setbacks. My health team, my family and friends, and my colleagues on staff are amazing in helping me to manage through these times. I've even been able to do some traveling to visit my kids, my brothers and sisters, and overseas a bit. My white blood count and immune system have remained fairly stable so I am hoping that I won't have to take as much time away from the parish during cold and flu season this year. As always, I continue in humility to ask that you please keep the prayers coming! Again, I am so grateful.

The parish welcomed my wife, Michele, and (at the time) two children. Four-year old Stephanie, and three-year-old Matthew. Throughout this time you have been most gracious to all of us and helped us welcome and celebrate the birth of Danielle and Rachel, and even Michal from Poland.

When I sit back and think of all we have been through it is quite the whirlwind and would be most comfortable to ride out my career at one of the best places I have had to minister at. Fr. Jerry and the staff are exceptional and have been an absolute pleasure and delight to serve alongside of.

So, then why am I leaving this "perfect" situation? The answer is simple yet complex. Jesus says in John 10:27, "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. My Father has called me to another place to minister. I don't know why, and I don't know what awaits, but I do know that He is already there and putting everything in place for His mission to be fulfilled. Likewise, I have to get out the way because there is somebody who needs to be at St. Jane Frances de Chantal at this time to be able to share his/her gifts with all of you as I have had the privilege of doing.

If you are part of a ministry that I oversee, (Music, Faith Formation, Catechist, CLOW, etc.), you should have received an email from me detailing a transition plan. If you have not, please be sure to contact me as soon as possible.

Please pray for Fr. Jerry and the parish staff that the right person hear the call of the Holy Spirit and also follow God's call to follow Him. It won't happen overnight, but it will happen, and you will be blessed beyond measure. To be a Disciple of Christ, means to trust.

I will leave you with this...

If GOD could

close the mouth of the lions for Daniel, part the red seas for Moses, make the sun stand still for Joshua, open the prison for Peter, put a baby in the arms of Sarah, and raise Lazarus from the dead... THEN He can certainly take care of you! NOTHING you are facing today is too hard for Him to handle!

Again, I can't thank you enough for the love and support you have shown to allow me the opportunity to truly enjoying coming to "work" everyday.



If you knit, crochet, sew, quilt, etc., then you are invited to join us to work on your projects or our


