With school well underway, we also begin faith formation here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. I would like to welcome our new Director of Faith Formation, Michael Novak, and the catechists who will teach the children of our parish in this coming year.

Our catechists are a great group of people who meet every week with the children and impart the faith of the Catholic Church upon them. They share with the children their own stories and journeys of faith. However, the catechists also rely on parents to share their faith with their children. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* reminds us that parents are the first teachers of the faith. Children learn by what their parents model for them.

As I mentioned in my homily two weeks ago, we learn by the examples people set for us. May we model our faith for our children and for all those we come in contact with. As we begin the faith formation year, let us share the stories of our own faith journeys—and in the process, let us build up the Body of Christ.

The theme of this year’s Catechetical Sunday, “Say the Word and My Soul Shall Be Healed,” reminds us that we are all called to give witness to our faith in Jesus Christ. We begin this faith formation year by calling on God to bless the children of our parish, their families, our catechists, and our faith community with a spirit of wonderment and awe about their faith. May we be open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit in our lives and the lives of the community of St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

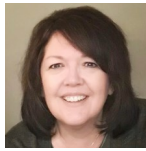

For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances

confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking.

National Migration Week for 2021 takes place from September 20th—26th and will climax with the Vatican's celebration of the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR), which always falls on the last Sunday of September. The primary theme for this year's WDMR is "Toward an ever wider 'WE.'"

In his letter announcing this year's theme, Pope Francis emphasizes that "this focus calls on us to ensure that 'after all this, we will think no longer in terms of "them" and "those," but only "us" (*Fratelli tutti*, no. 35). And this universal us must become a reality first of all within the Church which is called to cultivate communion in diversity."

September sure is flying by quickly! Fall programs at St. Jane Frances de Chantal have begun with some semblance of normalcy as we continue on our journey of

what the pandemic has brought. With that, here are a few notes on what's coming up musically at our parish:

Choir practice will begin on Wednesday, September 22, 2021 from 7:00pm—8:30pm. I am not sure how many choir members we'll get back, but we'll work with what we have. I also invite any of you to consider joining us, even if you don't think you can sing that well. You don't even have to be able to read music, (but it helps). It is surprising how often I hear someone say, "I'd love to join but am not that good of a singer." Truly, the Lord doesn't mind—and neither do I—that you may not make Broadway, the Opera stage, or even community musical theater. What's important is that you wish to use your voice to honor God and to participate in our Church programs; in addition, you'll find us to be a very friendly group who will welcome you with open arms. We normally sing at 9:00am mass and on some Church feast days.

If you play an instrument, think you might be able to handle a rhythm instrument, or can sing, we'd love to have you. This is a good group for parish youth since we will do some more contemporary songs as well as traditional ones. Our next gathering is on Saturday, October 2, 2021 at 2:30pm in the Church where we will rehearse, and then celebrate the 4:00pm Mass.

Our Angels and Inspiration Concert Series is also resuming! Yes, you heard correctly. It will be two years since we've had a concert here, and we'll kick it off with another fabulous appearance by The Judelairens when they bring their uplifting Holiday and Christmas program to our parish on Thursday, December 16, 2021 at 7:00pm. You truly do *not* want to miss this. Conditions and protocols permitting, we'll have an afterglow reception in the social hall following the concert. Angels and Inspiration began 22 years ago at St. Basil's in Eastpointe as a way to bring the Church and surrounding communities together. I'm proud to say we've celebrated 25 concerts over the years, and we'll continue to do so as long as we are able. A free will offering is all we ask, so please mark your calendar.

Have a wonderful week and enjoy those fall colors that will begin appearing soon. God provides us with an outdoor canvas of natural and beautiful artistry, and it is up to us to take it all in.

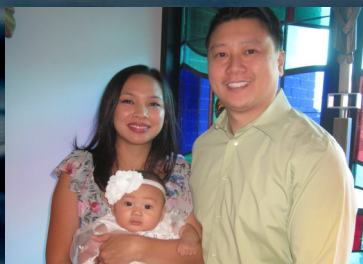
