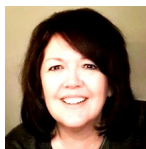

Happy Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord!

In our reading today from Isaiah, the prophet writes of the coming of light amid darkness. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in part by the arrival of the magi. The magi may not have been aware of Isaiah's words as scholars identify them as astronomers or astrologers, and likely to have been Gentiles. Those who knew the prophecies and awaited their fulfillment would have had a strong reaction. "...consider what it would have meant for those bearing witness to the birth of Jesus. Beyond a miraculous event, the arrival of the messiah as a helpless newborn to a teenage mother in a foreign land: the events surrounding this birth are the fulfillment of prophecy. As the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh arrive, those who are keen to the Scripture study of the day would have raised their eyes: We were told about this!" (from 2024 Sourcebook for Sundays, Seasons, and Weekdays).

The traditional day to celebrate Epiphany is January 6th. This year we celebrate on January 6th at the 4:00pm Mass and on January 7th at our Sunday Masses. Falling twelve days after Christmas, this was regarded as enough time for the magi to travel to Bethlehem from foreign lands to pay homage to the newborn King. With their arrival, Jesus is now made known to the outside world. Just as the star in the East symbolized the light of Christ shining for the whole world to see, we are called to show Christ in our lives so others can realize the Good News wherever we go.

We might ask ourselves today: To whom do I pay homage? Are they worthy of my respect?

What Goes Up, Must Come Down – "Undecorating" the Worship Space

The Christmas Season ends with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, Monday, January 8th. We will be taking down our decorations during the week following the feast. If you have an hour or two to help "undecorate", please call the office and let us know that you are available.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION WITH RECITATION OF DIVINE PRAISES

Come spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament! Please join us in the chapel on **Tuesday, January 9th** anytime from **1:00pm until 6:30pm** for Eucharistic Adoration, ending with recitation of the Divine Praises at 6:30pm.

EPIPHANY BLESSING

“Chalking the door” is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God’s blessing of our lives and homes. With time, the chalk will fade. As it does, we let the meaning of the written symbols sink into the depths of our hearts and be manifest in our words and actions.

A traditional way of writing this blessing is to use chalk to write above the home’s entrance: “20 + C + M + B + 24.” The letters C, M, and B have two meanings. First, they are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, or “May Christ bless this house.” The “+” signs represent the cross, and 2024 is the year.



To begin, first bless the chalk:

Leader: “Our help is in the name of the Lord.”

All reply: “The maker of heaven and earth.”

Leader: “The Lord shall watch over your going out and your coming in.”

All reply: “From this time forth for evermore. Let us pray.”

Together: “Loving God, bless this chalk which you have created, that it may be helpful to your people. Grant that through the invocation of your most Holy Name, we who use it in faith to write upon the door of our home the names of your holy ones Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar may receive health of body and protection of soul for all who dwell in or visit our home. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.”

To bless the home:

Using the blessed chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) with “20 + C + M + B + 24.” While doing so, say:

“The Three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God’s Son, who became human two thousand and twenty-four years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.”

Then offer the following prayer:

“Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love, and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch.

“May we grow in grace and in our knowledge and love of you. Guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.”

These organizations and our Giving Tree Team thank all of you for being the “light of Christ” to the “least among us” this Christmas and throughout the year!



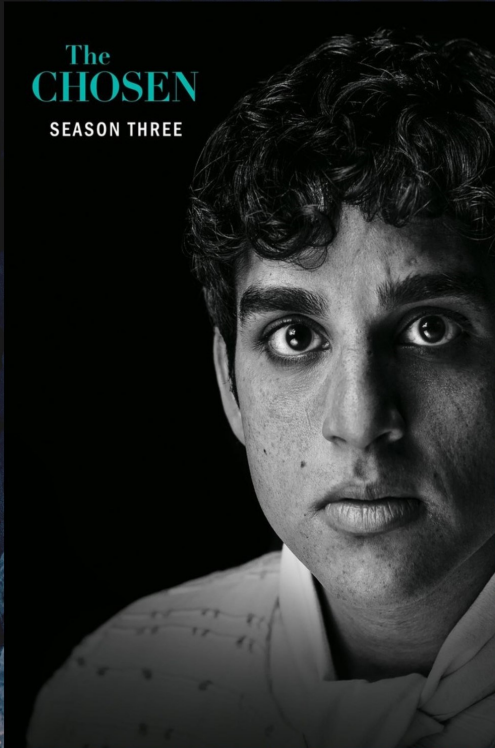
2024 Lenten Fish Frys
